he Delhi Police have arrested a domestic help on Thursday for alleged. ly killing his employer and her son at their home in Delhi's Lajpat Nagar area after the woman allegedly scolded him, police said.

The accused, identified as 24-year-old Mukesh, is a native of Bihar's Hajipur and was nabbed by police from a train at Uttar Pradesh's Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyay Railway Station when he was on a run allegedly after committing the crime.

Mukesh, who is currently residing in nearby Amar colony, has reportedly confessed to the killings. He told investigators that a recent scolding by her employer, Ruchika triggered the violent act. As per police, the incident incident came to light when a PCR call was received at 9.43 pm on Wednesday from Kuldeep Sewani, a resident of

According to police, Mukesh was working with the family for the past 3-4 years. Though he was employed as a domestic help, he also assisted Kuldeep and Ruchika at their garment shop in the Lajpat Nagar market and worked as their driver.

"Kuldeep and Ruchika jointly ran the business and their son was a class 10 student," said DCP Tiwari.

Another police officer privy to the investigation said, "Prima facie the incident took place between 7.30 pm to 8.30 pm on Wednesday. The accused was scolded by the woman during the day, which appears to have triggered the act of revenge. It seems that he first slit the throat of the woman and then killed the boy." After the information about the double murder was received, multiple teams were formed and the photo of the accused was shared with police and railway police of other States, the officer said.

Social media accounts of several prominent Pakistani celebrities were once again blocked in India on Thursday as the Government cited 'technical error' for the restoration of social media accounts, just a day after the restrictions were lifted amid the backlash .

This comes after the All Indian Cine Workers Association (AICWA) on Wednesday issued a formal appeal to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, demanding a complete and permanent ban on the digital and media presence of all Pakistani nationals and entertainment-related entities in India. In a statement shared through its official X account, the association expressed concern over the reappearance of Pakistani actors and media channels on Indian platforms.

Sources said the temporary visibility was due to a technical error that caused the accounts to be inadvertently unblocked. Instagram and Twitter profiles of Pakistani celebrities such as Hania Aamir, Mahira Khan, Shahid Afridi, Mawra Hocane and Fawad Khan once again became inaccessible to Indian users by Thursday morning. YouTube channels such as Raftartv, ARY Digital HD, Har

Pal Geo are still visible here. The move follows a brief window on Wednesday when many Pakistani YouTube channels and Instagram accounts started reappearing.

Pakistan hockey team to play in India

Pakistan's hockey teams will not be stopped from competing in next month's Asia Cup and the junior World Cup in India. "We are not against any team competing in India in a multi-national competition. If we try to stop Pakistan it would be seen as a violation of the Olympic Charter. Likewise, we will also show up for any multi-national event that features Pakistan. But bilateral is different and there will be no relaxation on that front," the source said. The ministry's decision also clears the decks for Pakistani participation in the junio World Cup of shooting, scheduled here in September, and the World Para-Athletics Championships, also in the national Capital in September October. External Affairs Minister S Jaishanka said Operation Sindoor conveyed to the world with great clarity that India will act against terrorism. This assertion was in line with the UN Security Council calling for those responsible for the Pahalgam attacks to be brought to justice. A joint statement issued by Quad Foreign Ministers - Jaishankar, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, Foreign Minister of Australia Penny Wong, and Japanese Foreign Minister Takeshi Iwaya -unequivocally condemned all acts of terrorism and violent extremism in all their forms and manifestations, including crossborder terrorism. The Quad foreign ministers condemned in the "strongest terms" the April 22 terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, which left 26 people dead.The Security Council statement ndemned the Pahalgam attack.

The F-35 fighter jet made an emergency landing at Thiruvananthapuram International Airport. Despite multiple attempts to repair the aircraft on site, the fifth-generation stealth jet has remained grounded due to an unresolved engineering malfunction, sources said. They added efforts to restore flight readiness have so far been unsuccessful.

With no timeline for the aircraft's recovery, British officials are now working on alternative plans to retrieve the jet. Partial dismantling has emerged as the most viable option to enable its return by military transport.

The Uttarakhand Special Task Force (STF) and Maharashtra Crime Branch arrested an accused arms supplier from the Clement Town area in a joint raid conducted in Dehradun on Thursday. The arrested accused Kamran Ahmad had been supplying illegal weapons to international wildlife poaching gangs. He had previously served time in jail after being caught with 2,000 illegal cartridges in Delhi, the senior superintendent of police of STF Navneet

surfaced during the investigation of a case registered in Yavatmal, Maharashtra, where a large cache of illegal weapons and ammunition was recovered from members of a wildlife poachers' gang. The seized weapons included rifles, revolvers, crossbows, live cartridges and a bulletproof jacket, as per Bhullar. RUDRAPRAYAG: The Kedarnath Yatra was temporarily suspended on Thursday after the road in Munkatiya sliding zone near Sonprayag was blocked due to landslide debris. The administration said that the pilgrimage would resume once the stretch is cleared of the blockage. Besides, some passengers, who were stuck midway while returning from Gaurikund in the sliding zone area, were rescued by the SDRF team and they were brought safely to Sonprayag. The process of opening the road here is underway, the district administration officials said.

"This not only saved time but also brought unprecedented improvement in the quality and accuracy of the results," he added.

DSO urges people to cooperate for dengue awareness & survey activity

The newly appointed Dehradun District Surveillance Officer (DSO), Dr Pradeep Rana urged the public to cooperate with Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) workers and volunteers during their visits to homes for dengue awareness and survey activities. He said this while outlining his priorities after taking on the role of DSO. It is important to note that Dr CS Rawat recently retired from this position and Rana officially took over on July 1, with a commitment to diligently fulfill his responsibilities.

Rana said that upon assuming his new position, he had recently convened a meeting with ASHA workers and volunteers to discuss the current status of their efforts aimed at preventing dengue cases in the Dehradun district. He highlighted that considering the increasing number of dengue cases and the onset of the monsoon season, he instructed volunteers and ASHA workers to increase their hours dedicated to dengue awareness activities in the field For instance, if they are currently spending two to three hours in the field for dengue awareness and survey, this time should be increased to four to six hours. During the meeting, he was informed by the ASHAs and volunteers that 50 per cent of the population re-

behaviour. Additionally, he

informed that, considering

the monsoon season, he

will ensure that schools in the Dehradun district adhere to the previously issued dengue guidelines. These guidelines recommend that students wear full-sleeved clothing, avoid stagnant water, and conduct assemblies that include dengue prevention tips, among other measures. He said that

he has planned for the Health department team to visit schools in the coming days to ensure compliance with these guidelines.

He emphasised that by taking on this responsibility, he intended to manage the dengue cases and prevent any increase, particularly with the arrival of the monsoon season. The DSO further urged

the public to adhere to preventive measures for which include dengue, wearing long-sleeved clothing, using repellent, utilising mosquito nets and eliminating stagnant water in their surroundings.

The Bharatiya Janata Party L has not announced candidates for 39 out of 358 seats in the upcoming Ut-tarakhand Panchayat elections, calling it a part of its political strategy. The party released a list of its sup-ported candidates for 319 district Panchayat seats on Wednesday, leaving several areas without an official nominee. This decision caused confusion among

local residents, especially in areas where multiple BJP workers were reportedly competing for party súpport.

The party has avoided naming supported candidates in several key districts. In Chamoli, no names were announced for six seats, while in Pauri, four seats remain without candidates. Other districts with unannounced seats include Pithoragarh, Bageshwar, Dehradun (Rural), Tehri, Rishikesh, Uttarkashi. Champawat, Ranikhet, Udham Singh speculations, the BJP's State media in-charge Manveer Chauhan said that the decision to withhold candidate announcements on these 39 seats was deliberate and forms part of the party's wider political plan. He ex-pressed confidence that BJP workers will win across the State regardless of official endorsements. According to him, the party will welcome

any winning candidate who has worked in BJP's interest, even without formal support. It appears like by taking this approach, BJP hopes to avoid internal conflict and maintain unity ahead of upcoming state elections. The move is seen as an attempt to balance competing interests within the

Grounded F-35 to be airlifted

The F-35, a multi-role combat aircraft used by the Royal Navy, had been part of a fleet transiting the region when it was forced to land due to a technical issue.

The F-35B, a short take-off and vertical landing (STOVL) variant of the Lockheed Martinbuilt fifth-generation aircraft, had diverted to the Kerala airport after being unable to return to HMS Prince of Wales, the Royal Navy's flagship aircraft carrier currently deployed in the Indo-Pacific.

According to a statement issued by the British High Commission last week, the emergency diversion was prompted by "adverse weather conditions," which prevented

the aircraft from safely landing ments were conducted, but back on the carrier. The pilot subsequent attempts to remedy safely landed the aircraft at the issue fell short. The Royal Thiruvananthapuram on June 15. Since landing, however, the aircraft has developed what UK authorities have termed "an engineering issue" that has rendered it unable to fly.

"A UK F-35 aircraft was unable to return to HMS Prince of Wales due to adverse weather conditions. Prioritising safethe aircraft diverted to Thiruvananthapuram International Airport in India, where it landed safely. The aircraft has subsequently developed an engineering issue whilst on the ground which precluded its return to the

A Royal Navy AW101 Merlin helicopter landed at the airport the following day to extract the pilot, who was transported back to HMS Prince of Wales. The jet, meanwhile, has remained under continuous guard. Indian Air Force sources confirmed logistical support was extended at the request of the Royal Navy. The F-35 programme is the largest and costliest weapons development initiative in military aviation history. Globally, the F-35 fleet has flown over 800,000 hours across multiple services and combat theatres.

It referenced terror attacks including 26/11, Pulwama, Uri, and Pahalgam as part of its appeal, reiterating its long-standing position that Pakistan is responsible for continued cross-border terrorism. The organisation called for a nationwide digital blackout of Pakistani social media accounts and media channels, a ban on all future collaborations involving Pakistani

citizens across Indian media, OTT platforms, advertising and a permanent cultural disconnect with Pakistan, as a tribute to India's armed forces and martyrs. Right after the Pahalgam incident, the Federation of Western India Cine Employees (FWICE) announced a "blanket boycott" of Pakistani artists in light of the attack. Fawad Khan-starrer Abir Gulaal, a Bollywood film, was the first casualty of the boycott. In May this year, the

Government had blocked several Pakistani YouTube channels and social media accounts for spreading anti-India propaganda and provocative content. They include Instagram

accounts of actors Saba Qamar, Ahad Raza Mir, Yumna Zaidi, and Danish Taimoor and YouTube channels of cricketers Shahid Afridi and Shoaib Akhtar. YouTube channels Dawn News Pakistan, Samaa TV, Irshad Bhatti, Ary News, Bol News, Geo News, Samaa Sports, GNN HD official, among others were banned by the Government after the April 22 Pahalgam attack in Jammu and Kashmir which killed 26 tourists. It was also directed to all OTT platforms, media streaming services and digital intermediaries to discontinue web series, films, songs, podcasts and other media content originating from Pakistan.

Jharkhand's infrastructure to get major overhaul: Gadkari

nion Minister Nitin Gadkari on Thursday said the Centre is committed to augment Jharkhand's infrastructure and would implement projects worth ₹2 lakh crore in the State.

The Union Road Transport and Highways Minister asserted that Jharkhand, which is rich in mineral resources, would see unprecedented growth in the highways sector.

"I am committed to bolster Jharkhand's infrastructure. I assure the people of implementing ₹2 lakh crore-worth national highway projects in the state," he said, while addressing a public meeting here.

"We have completed ₹40,000-crore national highway projects in the State. At present, we are implementing highway projects worth ₹70,000 crore, while projects worth ₹75,000 crore are in the pipeline," Gadkari added. He said the ₹36,000-crore Varanasi-Ranchi-Kolkata greenfield corridor will be completed by March 2028, while the ₹12,800-crore Ranchi-Varanasi economic corridor will be built by January 2028.

Besides, the Delhi-Kolkata ₹31,700crore six-lane corridor will be completed by June 2026, he said, adding the Ranchi-Patna four-lane economic corridor, being built at a cost of ₹8,900 crore, will be completed by December 2029.

Also, the ₹16,500-crore Raipur-Dhanbad four-lane economic corridor will be completed by January 2028, he added.

Gadkari said till elections, there should be politics but after the polls, there should be "development politics", hinting at populist measures by Jharkhand's JMM-led Government. "We will ensure better connectivity between Jharkhand and other States, including Bihar," the minister said. Comparing the water crisis in parts of Jharkhand with Maharashtra, Gadkari said there is a small mantra to change the scenario. "We have changed the situation.

Udalguri (Assam) ssam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma A on Thursday took a dig at opposition Congress, accusing it of lacking the courage to speak out against the slaughter of cows by Muslims during *qurbani* and the alleged throwing of beef near religious places.

Speaking on the sidelines of a meeting, Sarma said the BJP is the only party that can request the Muslim community to perform qurbani with animals other than cows.

"I can challenge the Congress that they don't have the courage to speak on qurbani. BJP can openly say that Islam does not recognise qurbani of cows. Qurbani can be of any animal. BJP has the courage to request the public not to carry out qurbani of cows next time, but to do it with goats," Sarma said.

"Can Congress do it? They will have to take birth seven times to say this line. So, who is the well-wisher of cows?" the CM asked. He further questioned whether the Congress ever protested the selling of beef openly in shops and throwing of meat in front of Namghar.

On Thursday, parts of meat suspected to be beef were also found in Hajo in Kamrup district. "Opposition parties don't raise their voice where they should. Thousands of cows are killed for qurbani in Assam. Should we raise our voices for living cows or the dead ones?" Sarma questioned. Sarma also slammed the

Congress and other opposition parties for repeatedly raising allegations of corruption regarding the Gorukhuti Multipurpose Agriculture Project in Sipajhar, Darrang district. "The aim of Congress is to shut down the Gorukhuti project and bring back the evicted encroachers to the same land. Now, people in Gorukhuti have taken a vow not to allow anyone in the area. People have given answers to the Congress,"

Sarma said. The Gorukhuti project was set up after a massive eviction drive was carried out in 2021 to clear 77,420 bighas from alleged encroachers, belonging mostly to Bengali-speaking Muslims, in which two persons, including a 12-year old boy, were killed in police firing.

The CM also said, "After the Narengi-Kuruwa Bridge is ready, the valuation of Gorukhuti land will soar and indigenous people will benefit as land rights are with them. If there was no eviction, the benefit of land prices would not be available to our own people."

Later this year, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is likely to lay the foundation of a Rs 7500-crore Guwahati ring road project, including a bridge over Brahmaputra connecting Narengi and Kuruwa.

Replying to a calling attention motion in the legislative council, he also raised concerns over synthetic drugs and said that even terminal cancer patients are being used as drug carriers.

The number of cases has increased because of the Government's anti-drug crackdown, he said. It was found that ports in Gujarat and the Jawaharlal Nehru Port Trust (JNPT), the country's largest container port located in Maharashtra's Raigad district, were used to bring in drugs concealed in cargo consignments, he said.

"Scanners that can detect concealed drugs have been installed in Gujarat and Maharashtra. Randomised checking of shipments from certain countries, where there is a possibility of drug supply, is being done," he said. Five days ago, two

Indonesian nationals were arrested with 21 kg of hydroponic *ganja* valued at ₹21.55 crore in Mumbai, he said.

Faith, politics and reincarnation

The search for the next Dalai Lama is mired in a deepening dispute between the Tibetan spiritual leader and the Chinese Govt

new chapter in the Tibetan struggle for autonomy and religious freedom is about to be added, as both the Chinese Government and A the 14th Dalai Lama have locked homs over the search for the next Dalai Lama, the religious and temporal head of Tibet. The 14th Dalai Lama, Tenzin Gyatso, has made his stand clear that the institution of the Dalai Lama would continue after him, and his successor would be chosen by a Zurich-based foundation established by him in accordance with Tibetan traditions. Thus, the Tibetan leadership intends to maintain full autonomy over the sacred process.

This announcement has stirred a hornets' nest, as the Chinese Government wants the process to be done by 'a golden urn' - a Qing dynasty relic that Beijing insists must be used in the selection of the next Dalai Lama. Present Dalai Lama, Tenzin Gyatso was named as the 14th Dalai Lama in 1940, at the age of four, following traditional Tibetan religious practices that involve visions, signs and sacred consultations not urns or lottery draws. China annexed Tibet in 1951. Thereafter, in 1959, following a failed uprising against Chinese rule, the Dalai Lama fled Tibet and settled in India, establishing a Government-in-exile in Dharamshala. Since then, he has remained the face of the Tibetan cause, advocating for non-violence, religious freedom, and cultural preservation. Now, on July 6, he would turn 90. Thus, the question of succession has become urgent, not just for Tibetans but for the wider Buddhist community. The Dalai Lama has long held that the reincarnation process is a matter of religious tradition.

As early as 2011, he declared that any successor would be chosen solely by his spiritual office, the Gaden Phodrang Trust, based in Zurich, dismissing any role for Beijing or its 'Golden Urn' process. Yet, China's position remains firm. In recent remarks foreign ministry spokesperson Mao Ning reiterated that any reincarnation must be validated through the urn and approved by the Chinese Government. Beijing sees this not just as tradition but as a mechanism of control over Tibetan religion and identity a core part of its broader assimilation strategy. This isn't the first time the reincarnation issue has erupted into international controversy. In 1995, the current Dalai Lama identified a six-year-old, Gedhun Choekyi Nyima, as the 11th Panchen Lama - the second-most important figure in Tibetan Buddhism. But days later, the child disappeared and has not been seen since. In his place, China installed another boy of its choosing, a decision rejected by the Tibetan community.

The current Dalai Lama's wish to delegate the search to a Zurich-based foundation must be respected by the Chinese Government, as they call themselves 'people's republic,' so people's sentiments must be honoured . More so, the Dalai Lama is not a threat to China in any way - at best, an embarrassment. China is almost certain to anoint its own Dalai Lama, drawing on the urn to lend an aura of historical legitimacy. Thus, a situation is sure to come when it would be resisted and protested by Tibetans. The quest for the next Dalai Lama has become a collision point between faith and the State - between a centuries-old spiritual lineage and a 21stcentury authoritarian regime. It remains to be seen how the situation would develop and be resolved, as the 15th Dalai Lama would inherit not just the title of Dalai Lama, but the burden of history and an uphill task to fight for the justice of his people.





Uniform Civil Code and Gender Justice

The Telangana High Court has corrected gender-based inequality rooted in religious personal laws — an inequality that contradicts Article 15 of the Indian Constitution, which forbids discrimination on the basis of religion, sex or caste

n recent weeks, the Telangana High Court has significantly corrected a major inequality, which happens to be prohibited by the Constitution's Article 15, i.e., discrimination on the grounds of sex, religion, caste, etc.

The State shall not discriminate against any citizen on the grounds only of religion, caste, sex, place of birth, so states our Constitution. For those who were born much later, it bears iteration that since 1950, when the national document was adopted, discrimination between every Muslim man and every Muslim woman, ironically sanctioned by the statute, has been in practice.

This has continued for decades and is still in force. Defending the Hindu Code Bill during the parliamentary debate on the matter in 1955, when it was passed to become a law in the form of the Hindu Marriage Act - while completely ignoring a similar demand to reform the Muslim Personal Law and bring in a Uniform Civil Code – Jawaharlal Nehru, the country's first Prime Minister, had said:

"Well, I should like a Civil Code which applies to everybody, but wisdom hinders. If the member or anybody else brings forward a Civil Code Bill, it will have my extreme sympathy. But I confess I do not think that at the present moment time is ripe in India for me to try to push it through. I want to prepare the ground for it.'

Backlash over implementation of Hindi

In Maharashtra, the Devendra Fadnavis-led Mahayuti Government issued a General Resolution (GR) on April 16 making Hindi a compulsory third language for students in Classes 1 to 5 studying in English and Marathi - medium schools. This seemed to be an overzealous move to oblige the Centre. The Government withdrew the GR quickly to avert a potential backlash.

Recently, Union Home Minister Amit Shah asserted, "In our lifetime, we will see a society in which those speaking English will feel ashamed."

Earlier, at a session of the Parliamentary Official Language Committee, he mentioned that people of different states should communicate with each other in Hindi and not in English. It should, therefore, be construed that the GR was a by-product of a carefully strategised campaign. The openly expressed strong desire to remove English from classrooms has stirred up a hornets' nest in non-Hindispeaking regions.

As P Chidambaram put it, "No state in India is implementing the three-language formula. Particularly in Hindispeaking states, it is effectively a one-language formula. Very few Government schools have English teachers. And there is no question of a Tamil, Telugu and Malayalam teacher." The Central Government must reassess whether such strategies foster the claims of national integration.

The water gun protest in Europe

Cities around the world strive to boost local tourism, attract more tourists, and thereby strengthen their economies. However, in Barcelona, where the tourism sector is already booming, locals have launched a unique protest to slow it down and push tourists away from popular spots. Many residents participated in this protest spontaneously.

They are troubled by the unchecked growth of tourism, the unruly behaviour of tourists, the increasing cost of living, and the growing unrest caused by mass tourism. Some locals have even left their homes due to the chaos and moved to quieter places. Frustrated, they raised their voices with the slogan: "Enough is enough - stop this tourism and tourists." During the protest, a group of tourists was relaxing outside a hotel with tea and refreshments when a protester, a woman, suddenly sprayed water at them using a plastic water gun. That small act sparked a larger movement. The "water gun" soon became powerful symbol of anti-tourism protests across Europe. In countries like the Netherlands, Croatia, Austria, Italy, Greece, France, Portugal, and others, citizens began protesting tourism using water guns. Without harming tourists, they sprayed water in their direction and raised slogans. This unique form of protest - the water gun movement — has now caught global attention.

Safety audit of industry is a must

The devastating industrial blast at the pharmaceutical unit near Hyderabad is probably the worst ever industrial blast to have rocked India's pharma manufacturing industry in the last several decades in terms of fatalities. The death toll from a powerful explosion at the chemical factory has risen to 36, which is a grim reminder that there is an urgent need for stringent safety protocols and a robust enforcement mechanism in blace. This accident should serve as a wake-up call for India as a nation, as it has embarked on the path towards becoming a developed nation - which will include massive industrial projects.

The incident provides an opportunity not only for pharma industrial plants, but also other industries, to reflect and act upon what needs to be done to avoid the recurrence of such painful incidents.

The Government should take lessons from the blast and take punitive measures to stop such incidents in future, with annual safety audits at these plants.

Though no amount of money can compensate for the loss of life, the Telangana Government's announcement of an ex gratia payment of ₹1 crore for victims is praiseworthy. Efforts should be made to ensure this compensation amount reaches the victims' families at the earliest.

THE GOVERNMENT MUST REMOVE THE LACUNAE IN GST

At last, the ruling dispensation could understand the lacunae in the GST and prepared itself to address them to some extent, at least. Cheering the middle class by effecting some tinkerings in the GST is out of an inevitability. Right from its launch, the Government has been seen as highly confused over the number of slabs, the quantum of tax, and the items to be taxed. There are criticisms and suggestions regarding the number of slabs. The suggestion to have only three slabs has been in the air for a long time.

Among the four slabs, it is the slab with items used by the middle class that fetches 70-75 per cent of the revenue. The slab with the minimum items - on the 28 per cent tax rate - fetches only 15 per cent revenue. The Government's confusion or wantonness is displayed by removing the Wealth Tax on one hand and imposing tax on essentials like even salt, rice, notebooks, and pencils on the other. Even falling sick and seeking healthcare are taxed. Exempting condoms but taxing

medicines speaks of glaring confusion. The demands to exempt medicines, medical devices, and life insurance premiums fall on deaf ears. The policy of pampering the rich and producing billionaires could perhaps help take the Indian economy to fourth place in the world and achieve desirable growth in the GDP. But India's place at the bottom line in most global reports points to the inevitability of all such achievements collapsing like a house of cards. A thorough revamping of the entire tax system - to relieve the middle class and the poor from constantly tightening their belts due to the increasing imposition of taxes, tariffs, and fares, while inflation remains untamed and upward wage revisions are squeezed amid declining real wages - is badly needed. A small relief in personal tax extended

in the last Budget could not yield the desired results, signalling the need for more tangible changes AG RAJMOHAN JANANTAPUR

Jamaat-e-Islami: Apologies, Amnesia and the Shadow of 1971

In the wake of the 2024 July Uprising that unseated Sheikh Hasina's 15-year rule, Jamaat-e-Islami Bangladesh is attempting a political resurrection, branding itself as a progressive and tolerant Islamic party. But the past is not easily shed

ollowing the 2024 July Uprising that toppled Sheikh Hasina's 15-year rule, Jamaat-e-Islami Bangladesh has embarked on a jour-ney of political resurgence by rebranding itself as a progressive and tolerant Islamic party. However, this political comeback has not been smooth so far.

The ghost of the past continues to linger on the Jamaat, especially for its controversial role in the 1971 Liberation War. Recently, Shafiqur Rahman, the Ameer (chief) of Jamaat-e-Islami Bangladesh, offered a public apology for all past wrongs since 1947, including the Liberation War. This is not the Jamaat chief's first apology, although certainly one in direct reference to the Liberation War.

Let's briefly revisit Jamaat-e-Islami's role in the 1971 War. Decades of West Pakistan's colonial gaze towards East Pakistan birthed the sentiments of liberation among ethnic Bengalis in the East. Going against this common wave, Jamaat-e-Islami (founded in 1941) sided with West Pakistan in opposing East Pakistan's demand for complete independence. The reason is that the Jamaat's pan-Islamist ideological vision is based on the unity of the Muslim Ummah, whereby East Pakistan's secessionist aspiration, rooted in (secular) Bengali nationalism, was perceived as a threat to that very vision.

However, leaders and members of Jamaat did not just pledge their allegiance to West Pakistan after the launch of Operation Searchlight, but also became active collaborators of the Pakistan Army, aiding in the latter's military operations against Bengalis in East Pakistan. Jamaat's then chief Ghulam Azam, a Bengali himself, was one of the organising members of the East Pakistan Central Peace Committee (Shanti Committee), which became a vital agent (of the Pakistan Army) in compiling a list of liberation fighters and their supporters. Jamaat also played a significant role in the creation of paramilitary anti-liberation forces (Razakar, Al-Badr and Al-Shams) and unleashed relentless violence against its people — the Bengalis.

Together, they had been complicit in the genocide of about three million ethnic Bengalis (includes liberation fighters, Bengali intellectuals, professionals, supporters of liberation fighters), besides the systemic mass rape of about 200-400,000 Bengali women and girls, and pogrom of Hindus.

In post-1971 Bangladesh, Jamaat has had a tumultuous political journey — from its initial ban from 1971-75, subsequent emergence as the third largest political party in the 1990s, to its senior leaders being tried for their involvement in 1971 war crimes under the International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) Act. When its prominent leaders Ghulam Azam and ATM Azharul Islam were arrested and sentenced to the death penalty for 1971 war crimes, Jamaat-e-Islami called it foul play as 'politically motivated

Like Pakistan, the Jamaat refrained from issuing a public apology for its role in 1971. Rather, it denied its institutional involvement in the 1971 War and



downplayed allegations of war crimes and human rights violations, despite the documented evidence. Jamaat's political career came to a halt following a High Court's decision to declare its registration at the Election Commission illegal for its party charter not conforming to the constitutional principles,

barring the largest Islamic party from contesting polls since. It was also the year when Dhaka witnessed the Shahbag protest, a peaceful demonstration by civil society, demanding the death penalty for Jamaat leader Abdul Qader Molla (sentenced to life imprisonment for 1971 war crimes by the ICT) and ANKITA a complete ban on Jamaat. In SANYAL 2020, many former Jamaat activists broke away from the party and established a new

political party — Amar Bangladesh — for Jamaat's persistent refusal to apologise for its role in the Liberation War.

IN POST-1971 BANGLADESH, JAMAAT HAS HAD A TUMULTUOUS POLITICAL JOURNEY - FROM ITS INITIAL BAN FROM 1971-75, SUBSEQUENT EMERGENCE AS THE THIRD LARGEST POLITICAL PARTY IN THE 1990S, TO ITS SENIOR LEADERS BEING TRIED FOR THEIR INVOLVEMENT IN1971 WAR CRIMES UNDER THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMES TRIBUNAL (ICT) ACT

Jamaat's political resurgence came about after Sheikh Hasina's deposition when Dr Yunus-led interim Government lifted the ban imposed on Jamaat-e-Islami by the Awami League Government on the allegation of instigating violence in July 2024. The party has been rebranding itself as a tolerant, moderate, progressive party which believes in the independence and sovereignty of Bangladesh and aims to transform Bangladesh into an Islamic welfare state, a calculative step to moving away from its earlier hardliner ideological stand and to keep in line with the spirit of the 2024 Uprising.

Since Sheikh Hasina's deposition, Bangladesh witnessed a complete political ostracisation of the Awami League (now banned) along with attempts at erasing Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's legacy. The political discourse, too, shifted to the Liberation War, many vying for its redefinition.

Many in Bangladesh call the student-led 2024 July Uprising as 'second liberation', one that aspires to fulfil the aspirations of 1971, still unfinished. Jamaat, too, joined the bandwagon and claimed that the country's 'true independence' was achieved in 2024, not in 1971. The party has also been at the fore-



front to call the July Uprising as a 'genocide' committed by the Awami League, although the Chief Prosecutor of the ICT had recently cleared the air and called it as mass killing.

Whenever its role in 1971 was brought up, Jamaat showed its usual restraint. Last November, the Jamaat chief stated that he is ready to apologise only 'if 1971 mistakes are proven beyond doubt". Moreover, he defended the party's stand in 1971, justifying it as a 'political stance' instead of a crim-inal act and reiterated its doubt on the legitimacy of war crime trials against Jamaat leaders. This February, the Jamaat chief called former party chief Ghulam Azad a 'victim of oppression' who suffered and died under the tyranny of the 'fascist' Awami League.

The party also organised a mass sit-in demonstration to demand the release of ATM Azharul Islam, Jamaat's assistant secretary general, sentenced by the ICT to the death penalty in 2014 for his crimes against humanity in the 1971 War. The party chief maintained that Azharul has been locked in prison for over 13 years "due to false and fabricated cases by the then fascist Government." When ATM Azharul Islam was acquitted following a Supreme Court verdict in May, then came Jamaat chief's first apology to anyone who "might have been harmed due to the party or any of its activists anywhere in the country", while also maintaining that ICT war crime trials against Jamaat leaders were a 'deliberate purge' aimed at party leadership.

The whitewashing of recorded war criminals reflects that Jamaat-e-Islami's apology is one without repentance, the rebranding a mere electoral move. The largest Islamic party has been making efforts to make an alliance with other Islamic parties, following its public fallout with its previous political ally Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP). However, Islamic parties have shown hesitancy not just because of ideological differences but also because of the former's historical baggage concerning the 1971 War.

Jamaat was kept aside when five Islamist parties in April decided to field a single candidate in the next national election. The same parties have now reached an electoral compromise, still excluding Jamaat.

Without a doubt, the Jamaat chief's recent apology, now with direct reference to the Liberation War, exudes the party's vulnerability in the electoral field. Perhaps it is to win the confidence of Islamist parties for an electoral alliance of Islamic Unity and to win over public trust, now that the Election Commission has reinstated Jamaat's registration.

No apology, however, would help Bangladesh's oldest Islamic party to achieve its much-awaited political comeback if its actions continue to echo the same historical amnesia about the party's controversial role in 1971.

Ministry of Cooperation: Steering India's grassroots economy with reform and reach

Beyond the edge: The aesthetic urban death traps

hen the Ministry of Cooperation was created in July 2021, it marked more than just administrative restructuring. It was a clear signal that India's vast cooperative sector, with over 8 lakh societies spanning agriculture, dairy, fisheries, housing, and credit, would finally have a national-level representation and platform for growth and reform. Four years later, it is evident that the Ministry has functioned as both a set of signposts, offering long-term direction, and a collection of weathervanes, responsive to immediate needs and evolving realities. The cooperative sector has long been a key yet silent backbone of the country's rural economy.

From dairy collectives to credit societies enabling small-scale entrepreneurship, cooperatives have expanded livelihoods, enhanced market access, and supported economic inclusion across the country. Yet, for decades, policy approaches to the sector remained fragmented, often confined to state boundaries and disconnected from national priorities. The creation of the Ministry changed that dynamic, bringing with it both structural intent and operational agility. In its first four years, the Ministry has moved beyond intent to delivery. A series of 60 major initiatives has defined this period, reinforcing its role as both a guiding force and an adaptive institution.

One of the most significant signposts is the ₹2,516 crore programme to computerise over 63,000 Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS). These grassroots credit institutions are vital to rural livelihoods, and their digital transformation is enhancing transparency, operational efficiency, and service delivery. With implementation progressing steadily across states, it is a clear marker of systemic reform, backed by on-ground responsiveness. Another milestone is the rollout of model bylaws for PACS in 2023, enabling these institutions to diversify beyond credit operations.

Under the new framework, PACS can operate petrol pumps, manage grain storage, distribute affordable medicines through Jan Aushadhi outlets, and provide a range of essential rural services. Trials in Gujarat's Panchmahal and Banaskantha districts have already demonstrated how policy intent can quickly evolve into practical, community-level solutions, an ideal interplay of signposts and weathervanes

Legal reform has been another area of focused action. The Multi-State Cooperative Societies (Amendment) Act, 2023, introduced transparent election processes, independent governance mechanisms, the Cooperative Ombudsman system, and structured pathways for rehabilitating sick cooperatives. These measures addressed long-standing governance concerns, ensuring that cooperatives function with both autonomy and accountability.

The Ministry has also taken steps to strength-



en scale, market access, and sectoral competitiveness. The creation of national umbrella cooperatives such as Bhartiya Beej Sahakari Samiti Ltd. for the distribution of quality seeds, National Cooperative Organics Ltd. for organic produce,



and National Cooperative Exports Ltd. reflects efforts

to consolidate producer groups, enhance market linkages, and boost India's rural export potential. Tax incentives, including reduced surcharges of 7 per cent from the earlier 12 per cent on cooperative incomes in the ₹1 to ₹10 crore bracket, further demonstrate the Ministry's responsiveness to the sec-

tor's financial needs.

Equally significant is the investment in human capital and institutional capacity. The establishment of "Tribhuvan" Sahkari University (TSU), India's first university dedicated exclusively to cooperative education, training, and research, marks a structural signpost for the sector's future. Declared an Institution of National Importance, TSU is designed to nurture professional leadership, embed modern governance practices, and promote cooperative research and development to attain standards of global excellence.

These initiatives demonstrate that the Ministry has not been a static entity. It has provided durable signposts in the form of structural reforms, legal clarity, technology integration, and institution building, while retaining the flexibility of a weathervane, adjusting course in response to grass roots realities and emerging challenges.

Looking ahead, the role of cooperatives in value

addition, agri-marketing, rural enterprise, and inclusive economic growth is only set to expand along with initiatives like White Revolution 2.0. The coming years will demand not only strong institutions but also empowered leadership, mod-

ernised systems, and continued responsiveness to the needs of millions of cooperative members.

As the Ministry of Cooperation enters its fifth year, it carries the promise of consolidating these early gains and translating them into widespread impact. The foundation is visible, the computerisation of PACS, legal reforms, umbrella cooperative for-

mations, tax incentives, and the establishment of Tribhuvan Sahkari University stand as clear signposts of structural direction. Simultaneously, the Ministry's ability to function as a weathervane attuned to shifting rural dynamics, economic demands, and member aspirations has been its defining strength.

s India's urban landscape reaches new heights — literally — its cities are filling up A with apartment towers that define modern skylines from Pune to Noida. Yet this rapid vertical growth has come with a heartbreaking cost, especially for the youngest and most vulnerable residents. Balconies, once viewed as spaces of openness, calm, and leisure, are now emerging as hidden zones of danger-spaces where small oversights and structural compromises can quickly turn fatal.

At the heart of this crisis lies a mistaken belief: that objects placed on balconies are safe so long as they are heavy or sit snugly on a ledge. Most people assume gravity is the only force at play. But the built environment is subject to a far more complex reality. Wind gusts, seismic vibrations, thermal expansion, and even minor shifts in load can introduce lateral movements. When these movements meet poorly welded joints, rusted railings, or aging parapets, disaster becomes inevitable.

The preventable tragedies

In April 2025, a child in Pune was fatally struck by a falling flowerpot. The death was not a random

accident. It was the result of an unsecured object placed on a high parapet and an absence of regulatory oversight. Gravity may have delivered the final blow, but human neglect enabled it. In the wake of the tragedy, municipal authorities in Noida, Gurugram, and Ghaziabad issued emergency advisories banning heavy items from balconies and mandating inspections. But in many other cities, these directives failed to gain traction. The inconsistency of enforcement across state lines continues to put countless lives at risk. A month later, in Ghaziabad, a five-year-old boy and his uncle were crushed when an old balcony gave way.

Aesthetics and Hidden Hazards

The average balcony appears serene and securehanging plants, iron railings, artistic grilles. Yet behind this aesthetic charm lie hidden risks. Iron corrodes, welds weaken, and structures deteriorate - especially in buildings constructed rapidly or with compromised material quality. Most of these flaws remain invisible until it's too late.

Children are especially at risk. Research from AIIMS and PubMed Central highlights that falls from balconies rank among the most fatal types of trauma for children aged 1 to 5. Over 60 per cent of trauma injuries in this group are linked to falls from height. Children lean on railings, climb ledges, or treat parapets as play zones. A loose railing, an unsecured planter, or a rickety shelf can become a fatal hazard in seconds. Reactive measures - enacted only after tragedies - cannot replace proactive, nationwide safety standards. While cities like Lucknow and Noida have implemented fines and

enforcement for unsafe balcony practices, such policies need to be institutionalised across all urban centers. Building codes today remain heavily focused on structural foundations and load-bearing calculations. There is little to no regulatory clarity on posthandover modifications like planter installations, railing reinforcements, or the integrity of welding work. The issue is more than technical — it's cultural. People trust that their balconies are safe. They believe that what was built will last, regardless of weathering or wear. This mindset urgently needs to evolve.

A Culture of Structural Safety

To prevent further tragedies, India needs a shift in both policy and perception. Periodic, mandatory inspections should focus on balconies, railings, and parapet stability — much like elevator checks in high-rise buildings. These inspections should be routine, not dependent on complaints or media attention. Revised building codes must define clear specifications for railing height, railing spacing, and weight limits. Builders should be made liable for the quality of welds and materials, not only during con-

struction but after handover through periodic audits. These rules must apply to both new constructions and older buildings through phased compliance.

There also needs to be a strict prohibition on placing heavy, unsecured objects on narrow balcony ledges. Items like planters, AC units, and satellite dishes should either be permanently anchored to stable frames or relocated indoors. Decorative or storage use of parapets should be banned altogether in high-rise buildings. Real change requires public awareness.

Resident Welfare Associations (RWAs)

must lead internal campaigns on balcony safety. Workshops, posters, and parenting guides about childproofing high-rise homes can foster community vigilance. Developers should provide post-handover structural audits and be required to disclose maintenance protocols transparently. Municipal bodies must empower citizens to anonymously report unsafe balconies, cracked railings, or overloaded ledges. A centralised database tracking structural collapses and balcony-related injuries can help identify patterns, inform urban policy, and prevent future tragedies. Every time a child falls, or a balcony collapses, it is a brutal reminder of a system that failed to act. These deaths are not just accidents - they are the result of ignored warnings, absent policies, and dangerous assumptions. As India's cities continue to rise higher, the responsibility to make every floor, every railing, and every ledge secure grows exponentially.

House GOP clears key hurdle on Trump's big bill

all night, House Republicans voted before dawn on Thursday to advance President Donald Trump's tax and spending cuts package after GOP leaders worked almost around the clock trying to persuade sceptical holdouts as they race to send the bill to his desk by the Fourth of July deadline.

A roll call that started late Wednesday finally closed almost six hours later, a highly unusual stall on a procedural step. Trump, who had hosted law-

makers at the White House earlier, lashed out at the delay. Once the gavel struck, 219-213, the bill advanced to a last round of debates toward a final vote, which is expected

later Thursday morning.

"Our way is to plow through and get it done," House Speaker Mike Johnson said, emerging in the middle of the night from a series of closed-door meetings. "We will meet our July 4th deadline."

The idea of quickly convening to for a vote on the more than 800-page bill after it passed the day before in the Senate was a risky gambit, one designed to meet Trump's demand for a holiday finish. Republicans have struggled mightily with the bill nearly every step of the way, often succeeding by the narrowest of margins - just one vote. Their

slim 220-212 majority leaves little room for defections. Several Republicans are balking at being asked to rubberstamp the Senate version less than 24 hours after passage. A of moderate number

Haiti gangs nearly control capital amid violence: UN

aiti's gangs have gained "near-total control" of the capital and authorities are unable to stop escalating violence across the impoverished Caribbean nation, senior UN officials warned Wednesday.

An estimated 90 per cent of the capital Port-au-Prince is now under control of criminal groups who are expanding attacks not only into surrounding areas but beyond into previously peaceful areas, Ghada Fathy Waly, executive director of the UN Office on Drugs and Crime, told the UN Security Council.

"Southern Haiti, which until recently was insulated from the violence, has seen a sharp increase in gang-related incidents," she said.

"And in the east, criminal groups are exploiting land routes, including key crossings like Belladere and Malpasse. where attacks against police and customs officials have been reported."

Waly said the state's authority to govern is rapidly shrinking as gang control expands with cascading effects. Criminal groups are stepping into the

declassified CIA memo released Wednesday Challenges the work intelligence agencies did to conclude that Russia interfered in the 2016 presidential election because it wanted Republican Donald Trump to win. The memo was written on the orders of CIA Director John Ratcliffe, a Trump loyalist who spoke out against the Russia investigation as a member of Congress.

It finds fault with a 2017 intelligence assessment that concluded the Russian government, at the direction of President Vladimir Putin, waged a covert influence campaign to help Trump win.

It does not address that multiple investigations since then, including from the Republican-led Senate Senate Intelligence Committee in 2020, reached the same conclusion about Russia's influence and motives.

The eight-page document is part of an ongoing effort by Trump and close allies who now lead key government agencies to revisit the history of a long-concluded Russia investigation, which resulted in criminal indictments and shadowed most of his first term but also produced unresolved grievances and contributed to

Sean "Diddy" Combs dropped to his knees and prayed in the courtroom after he was acquitted of sex trafficking and racketeering charges that could have put one of hip-hop's celebrated figures behind bars for life. The rapper was convicted of lesser prostitution-related offenses and denied bail as he awaits sentencing.

His lawyer Marc Agnifilo called the verdict on Wednesday a "great victory" and said the jury "got the situation right - or certainly right enough" as he stood outside Manhattan federal court at a stand of microphones. "Today is a victory of all victories." The mixed verdict capped a sordid legal odyssey that shattered Combs' affable "Puff Daddy" image and derailed his career as a Grammy-winning artist and music executive, fashion entrepreneur, brand ambassador and reality TV star.

"I'll see you when I get out," Combs told family members including his mother and children just before leaving the courtroom to return to jail. "We're going to get through this?

Three European mountaineers paraglide in PoK peak

taineers accomplished a daring feat by paragliding off and skiing down the formidable Nanga Parbat peak in Gilgit-Baltistan of Pakistanoccupied Kashmir, a media report said on Thursday.

German mountaineer David Göttler paraglided off the Nanga Parbat, while the French duo of Tiphaine Duperier and Boris Langenstein etched themselves into the history books by skiing down the peak, Dawn News reported.

The CEO of Adventure Tours Pakistan, Naiknaam Karim, said the three foreign climbers began their summit attempt on Nanga Parbat,



which is at 8,126 metres in first. height, via the Schell route.

The trio climbed from the approximately 3,600-metrehigh base camp via the difficult Rupal Face between June 21 and 24.

Göttler, 47, had planned to descend from the top by paraglider. However, upon reaching the summit, strong winds forced him to launch his paraglider from 7,700 metres instead.

Göttler flew back to the base camp on June 24 while the other two climbers skied back on June 27.

Michael Beek, a German tour operator, mountain guide, and paragliding instructor, congratulated Göttler in a Facebook post, writing that Göttler had made a historic

"Summiting Nanga Parbat in alpine style with Tiphaine Boris Duperier and Langenstein was incredible, but to be able to fly down from 7,700m all the way back to base camp on the same day has brought my joy to the next level," he said.

It is being considered as the first ski descent from the Rupal Face and the summit of Nanga Parbat, the report said.

Gilgit-Baltistan is considered a mountaineers' paradise as five out of its total 14 peaks rise above 8,000 meters. K2, Nanga Parbat, Gasherbrum I, Broad Peak, and Gasherbrum II are five of its highest peaks. K2 is the world's second-highest mountain after Mount Everest.

94 Palestinians killed in Gaza

irstrikes and shootings killed 94 A Palestinians in Gaza overnight, including 45 who were attempting to get much-needed humanitarian aid, hospitals and the Health Ministry said on Thursday. Israel's military did not immediately comment on the strikes.

Five people were killed while outside sites associated with the Gaza Humanitarian Foundation, the newly-created, secretive American organisation backed by Israel to feed the Gaza Strip's population, while 40 others were killed waiting for aid in other locations across the Gaza Strip.

Dozens of people were killed in airstrikes that pounded the Strip Wednesday night and Thursday morning, including 15 people killed in strikes that hit tents in the sprawling Muwasi zone, where many displaced Palestinians are sheltering.

A separate strike on a school in Gaza City sheltering displaced people also killed 15 people. Gaza's Health Ministry said the number of Palestinians killed in Gaza has passed 57,000, including 223 missing people who have been declared dead, since the war began on October 7, 2023.

The ministry doesn't differentiate between civilians and combatants in its death count but says that more than half of the dead are women and children.

The deaths come as Israel and Hamas inch closer to a possible ceasefire that would end the 21-month war.

India, Ghana look to boost ties in defence, food security

ndia and Ghana have elevated their ties to the level of comprehensive partnership, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Ghanaian President John Dramani Mahama resolving to expand the bilateral ties in a range of areas, including defence, food security and pharmaceuticals.

In his media statement shortly after the talks with Mahama on Wednesday, Prime Minister Modi said both sides have set a target of doubling the two-way trade in the next five years and that India is not just a partner but a co-traveller in Ghana's development journey.

The delegation-level meeting between the two leaders took place hours after Modi arrived in this capital city of the West African country on the first leg of his five-nation tour.

In a special gesture, the Prime Minister was received at the airport by President Mahama and was accorded a ceremonial welcome. It is the first prime ministerial visit from India to Ghana in three

In their talks, the two leaders resolved to accelerate cooperation in key areas such as defence cooperation, food security and pharmaceuticals,

especially vaccines. Following the Modi-Mahama talks, the two sides inked four pacts that will provide for cooperation in several areas, including culture and traditional medicine.

"Today, the president and I have decided to elevate our bilateral partnership to a comprehensive partnership," Modi said, adding, "India is not just a partner but a co-traveller in Ghana's journey of nationbuilding."

"In agriculture, it will be our pleasure to lend support towards President Mahama's 'Feed Ghana' programme," Modi said. "We've discussed coopera-

tion in vaccine production," he noted. Mahama said Ghana is keen

to sign formal agreements with India on defence cooperation, vaccine production and supply of agricultural machinery. "Both countries will work to

India-Ghana cooperation will be enhanced in areas such as training of armed forces, maritime security, defence supply and cyber security, he added.

The prime minister also highlighted the upswing in trade relations between the two countries

"Indian companies have invested nearly two billion dollars in about 900 projects. Today, we have set a target to double our mutual trade in the next five years," he said.

"In the field of FinTech, India is ready to share its experience of UPI digital payments

with Ghana," he noted. The prime minister also said that Indian companies will cooperate in the exploration and mining of critical minerals.

At a media briefing, Secretary (Economic Relations) in the External Affairs Ministry Dammu Ravi said President Mahama pitched for cooperation in the areas of agriculture, food security, pharmaceuti-

cals, vaccines and defence. "President Mahama is very clearly interested in creating Ghana a hub for vaccines, and some development has already taken place in collaboration said. with the Global Vaccine Alliance and in that context," Ravi said.

The senior diplomat said Ghana is also interested in boosting defence cooperation with India.

"Here again there are concerns for Ghana in terms of security, terrorism from the northern region, the Sahel region and the piracy in the seas are of concern," he said.

In his remarks, the prime minister said both sides expressed serious concerns

over the conflicts in West Asia and Europe and called for finding solutions to the problems through dialogue and diplomacy. This is not the era of war;

ookstores remain one of the few Bretail spaces where people consis-tently buy more than they consume. In an age of digital minimalism and Marie Kondo-led purging, it's curious, comforting, even - that readers continue to acquire books they may not read for months, or perhaps ever.

The phenomenon is so common in Japan it has its own word: *tsundoku* — the practice of buying books and letting them pile up unread. But if this habit were just about accumulation, it would not carry such emotional weight. Unread books are not failed intentions. They are quiet declarations of hope. Every unread book on a shelf is a placeholder for a future version of the self, someone who finally has time, who returns from the noise of daily life to sit still and read.

A book on political theory bought during an election season, a novel purchased during heartbreak, a travel memoir unopened during lockdown, each is connected not just to an intellectual desire but to an emotional moment. Publishing data reflects this tendency. According to NPD BookScan, a data provider for publishing industry, the US book market saw recordbreaking sales in 2021, even as surveys showed that overall reading time declined slightly. For many readers, shelves of unopened books form a quiet autobiography, markers of who we were, what we yearned for and what we believed in.

We may forget the details of a particular season, but we recall the paperback impulsively bought in a foreign city, the novel acquired during a time of loss, or the collection of essays chosen in a moment of quiet searching. These volumes, still untouched, speak not of neglect but of a staying desire to engage more deeply with ourselves and the world. Occasionally, we return to one of them, not by plan but by instinct, only to discover its contents align perfectly with our present state of mind. The resonance feels less like coincidence than quiet orchestration.

These unread books carry a quiet conviction — that there will be time, that attention can be recovered, and that the version of ourselves able to fully receive them is still within reach. Buying books is a quiet way of affirming we haven't given up on ourselves, even when daily life gets the better of us. And sometimes, unexpectedly, we open one and find it is exactly what we needed.

Gill's strategy traits of world class player, says Trott

ndia captain Shubman Gill's clearly thought-out strategy and body language on the opening day of the second Test against England are traits of a worldclass player with a bright future, says former cricketer Jonathan Trott. Gill stood tall with a second consecutive ton in the five-Test series, reaching 114 not out (216 balls, 12 fours) at stumps to take India to a sturdy 310/5 on the opening day of the second Test in Birmingham.

The former England batter and incumbent Afghanistan coach heaped praise on the Indian skipper, who held the

innings together on a tricky opening day wherein England threatened to cause more damage than they did.

"What also stood out was his body language and the way he scored his runs. His control against the English bowlers sent a message to the dressing room that he was taking charge (and) leading from the front," Trott said in 'JioHotstar'.

"His intent was clear: "I'll be there, I'll be not out, and I'll resume tomorrow. I'll make sure we get into a winning position'. (It was) very impressive from such a young man —

a world-class player with a bright future." "Having the confidence to execute a plan that's not necessarily textbook, but gives you an edge over the

U19 ODI: Vaibhav Suryavanshi helps India beat England

eenage sensation Vaibhav Suryavanshi continued his rich vein of form by

smashing a record nine sixes as India defeated England by four wickets in the rain-truncated third U19 Youth ODI to take a 2-1 lead in the five-match series here. The 14-year-old Suryavanshi, who had come close to striking half-centuries in the previous two games before getting dismissed in his 40s, finally made his innings count as he clobbered the home team bowling on way to 86 off just 31 deliveries as India chased England's 268/6 in 34.3 overs on Wednesday.

Suryavanshi's knock was studded with six boundaries and nine maximums.

In fact, nine sixes by Suryavanshi is the highest number of maximums hit by an Indian batter in an Ú-19 ODI eclipsing the previous record of eight sixes by Mandeep Singh. India suffered a slump in the middle overs with the team reduced to

199 for 6 in the 24th over. But bowling allrounder Kanishk Chouhan (3/30), who had taken three England wickets earlier, hit an unbeaten 43 (42 balls) and shared an unbroken 75-run stand with RS Ambrish (31 not out) to guide the team

to victory. Suryavanshi ravaged every single bowler that bowled to him and made his intentions clear when he smacked right-arm pacer Sebastian Morgan for two consecutive sixes in the third over.

Morgan came in for some harsh punishment again in his subsequent over when he was hit for two more sixes and a boundary by the 14vear-old batting sensation, who has been on a roll since showing his precocious talent in the IPL for Rajasthan Royals.

England left-arm pacer James Minto bore the brunt of Suryavanshi's fury in the sixth over, going for 23 runs, which included three sixes and a boundary.

The Spanish Civil Guard confirmed to The Associated Press that the 28-year-old Jota and his 25-year-old brother, André Silva, were found dead near the northwestern city of Zamora. Police were investigating the causes of the accident that happened past midnight local time. They said there were no other vehicles involved. The bodies were undergoing forensic analysis. Fire fighters were called in as

the fire spread into the nearby vegetation, authorities said.

It wasn't clear who was driving the car. Police were looking into the hypothesis that the accident happened because of a blown tire while they tried to overtake another vehicle.

The accident occurred while they were driving eastward along an isolated stretch of highway about an hour west of



Zamora. Video images of the aftermath published by Spanish media showed braking tire marks veering off the road toward torn-apart guardrails. The burnt-up car was seen several meters ahead, with some of the local vegetation around it destroyed by the fire.

Jota and Silva, both Portuguese players, were the only ones in the car, police said. Jota's death comes weeks after he married Rute Cardoso

akistan's hockey teams Dwill not be stopped from P will not be stopped and competing in next month's Asia Cup and the subsequent junior World Cup in India as any move to block the arch-foes from multi-lateral competitions in the country would be a violation of the Olympic Charter, a sports ministry source said on Thursday. While the Asia Cup is scheduled to be held in Rajgir, Bihar from August 27 to September 7, the junior World Cup will be organised in Chennai and Madurai from November 28 to December 10.

The ministry's decision also clears the decks for Pakistani participation in the junior World Cup of shooting, scheduled here in September, and the World Para-Athletics Championships, also in the national Capital in September-October. The Charter is akin to the constitution of the Olympic movement and stresses on sport as a tool for promoting international peace and cooperation. As a result, any attempt to block a rival country from a multi-national event adversely impacts the host country's prospects of getting future hosting rights. When asked whether this means India will be allowed to play against Pakistan in the Asia Cup of cricket in September, the source said, "The BCCI is yet to reach out to the ministry on this. We will address this query when they approach us." Speculation is rife that India and Pakistan



"We are not against any team competing in India in a multinational competition. If we try to stop Pakistan it would be seen as a violation of the Olympic Charter. Likewise, we will also show up for any multi-national event that features Pakistan. But bilateral is different and

will play each other in a round robin match during the continental tournament, which is set to be held in the UAE or Sri Lanka even though the original host is India. India and Pakistan have been avoiding bilateral sporting engagements after the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks but even multi-lateral face-offs were in doubt after the Pahalgam terror attack in which 26 tourists were gunned down in April.

In May, India retaliated with

Operation Sindoor, targeting terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan, leading to a tense military showdown that deescalated on Pakistan's request for a ceasefire.

"International sports demands that we cannot back out from competing in multinational competitions. Take for instance, Russia and Ukraine, they are at war but they show up at multi-national events and compete as well," the source said.

El Tri advanced to play the United States in the final Sunday night in Houston for the eighth meeting in the title game between the two countries with Mexico owning a 5-2 edge. Mexico has won nine Gold Cups, the US Seven and Canada one. Mexico broke through early in the second half on a play started by Alexis Vega with a pass to Mora near the top of the box.
