

# **Cheer for middle class?**

After IT relief, GST rates may come down on household items

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elief for common people soon. From ghee and toothpaste to pulses and rice, besan to sewing machines, several items consumed by lower and middle class on a daily basis are likely to get cheaper. Cigarettes, carbonated drinks and highend cars are among items that may become more expensive if proposals to this effect are approved in the upcoming 56th meeting of the Goods and Service Tax (GST) Council, expected later this month.

After a series of income tax concessions earlier this year, the Government is considering eliminating the 12 per cent GST slab altogether or reclassifying many items currently taxed at 12 per cent into the lower five per cent bracket particularly aimed at easing the burden on essential goods used by average lower and middle class households. This move is expected to lower prices of many daily-use products that are part of every household's monthly expenses, especially for middle-class and low-income families struggling with rising costs.

According to sources, the proposed tax restructuring would target items widely used by middle-class and economically weaker sections such as toothpaste and tooth powder, umbrellas, sewing machines, pressure cookers and kitchen utensils, electric irons, geysers, small-capacity washing machines, bicycles, readymade garments priced over ₹1,000, footwear

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# India lifts ban on Pakistani YouTube channels, celebs

fter a series of bans on Pakistani YouTube Achannels and actors' and actresses' social media accounts in India, some of the restrictions have now been quietly lifted.

Celebrities and Youtubers, whose accounts have become accessible again, include Danish Taimoor, Ahad Raza Mir, Mawra Hocane, Yumna Zaidi, Aalia Shah are visible in India. Curbs were imposed in the wake of Operation Sindoor after Pahalgam terror attack.

Along with the Instagram accounts, the most popular YouTube channels of Pakistani daily dramas -Green TV Entertainment, ARY Digital HD, HUM TV and HAR PAL GEO are also back in India. YouTube channel Breaking Barrier with Aalia Shah also reappeared in India.

The return of these profiles has sparked discussions online, though Indian authorities have not released any statement confirming the removal of the restrictions. Mawra Hocane, actors Hania Aamir and Mahira Khan too were criticised for their support for the terror attack. However, the accounts of

Fawad Khan, Hania Aamir, Mahira Khan, Ali Zafar, Atif Aslam and Babar Azam, remain blocked in the region. While it remains unclear why only a few accounts have been restored, netizens believe that only Blist celebrity's accounts are

Birmingham: Skipper Shubman Gill scored a classy century while Yashasyi Jaiswal missed out on a deserving ton as India battled hard to reach 310 for 5 against England on the opening day of the second Test here on Wednesday. This was Gill's (114 batting, 216 balls) second successive hundred in the series after scoring 147 at Headingley. He is one of those rare Indian skippers to have scored back-to-back centuries in his first two Tests as captain. His century came off 199 deliveries. In all. Gill hit 12 fours. While Jaiswal once again gave India a solid start with an aggressive 87. laced with 13 boundaries, Gill showed a lot of composure and discretion in shot selection to score his seventh Test century.

Sheikh Hasina gets 6-month jail term

Dhaka: Bangladesh's deposed Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was on Wednesday sentenced to six months in prison in a contempt of court case by the International Crimes Tribunal, while it now tries her on a major charge of committing crimes against humanity in absentia. A threemember panel of the tribunal-1 (ICT). led by Justice Golam Mortuza Mozumder, simultaneously sentenced to two months a fugitive leader of the Bangladesh Chhatra League, Shakil Akanda Bulbul, in the same case. It marks the first time that 77-yearold Hasina has been sentenced in any case since she left office in August last year. "According to the verdict, the sentence will come into effect from the day of her arrest or surrender before the court," chief prosecutor Mohammad Taiul Islam told reporters after the verdict was handed down.

A State-appointed lawyer is defending Hasina, now staying in India, in the tribunal which earlier declared her a "fugitive" while her trial was opened on Monday initially over the murder of student protester Abu Saveed.

Additional Solicitor General (ASG) SV Raju said that AJL owns properties in Delhi, Lucknow, Bhopal, Indore, Panchkula, Patna and other places, and all these properties have been provided by the Central Government and various State Governments after 1947 for newspaper printing and publishing.

However, soon after taking over AJL, Young Indian (an entity controlled by the Gandhis) declared that it would not indulge in any newspaper publishing including the National Herald, Raju said. "To take over the entire company of ₹2,000 crore, they paid ₹50 lakh," the ASG high-

lighted. The submissions were made before Special Judge (PC Act) Vishal Gogne of Delhi's Rouse Avenue Court.

ED's case stems from the complaint filed by BJP leader Subramanian Swamy, currently on the trial stage. The Special Court is hearing arguments about whether it should take cognisance of the ED's prosecution complaint in the National Herald money laundering case. During the hearing, the ASG also said close

Located in Northwest Delhi's Shalimar Bagh area, this "Sheesh Mahal" is a 17th-century palace built by Emperor Shah Jahan, renowned for its intricate mirror work and Mughal-style architecture.

An integral part of the larger Mughal garden complex, the Sheesh Mahal has recently undergone restoration. 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# Trader's kin held for abetment to suicide

n the tragic triple suicide case of a city-based cloth merchant and his family. Chowk police on Wednesday arrested two accused — Mudita Rastogi, the elder sister of the deceased woman Suchita and her husband Vivek Siddharth — on charges of abetment to suicide. The arrests come a day after the brother of the deceased trader lodged a complaint alleging that sustained financial harassment by the accused drove his brother, sister-in-law, and teenaged niece to end their lives.

According to ACP Chowk Raj Kumar Singh, the deceased had borrowed around Rs 40 lakh from bank and from private moneylenders and handed it over to Mudita and Vivek who had promised to refund it after the sale of a family-owned plot in Nepalganj, Nepal.

The victims were told that the land was in Mudita's name. However, a recent trip to Nepal by the deceased couple revealed the land was not registered in Mudita's name, but in the names of her children. Feeling betrayed and financially trapped, Sobhit along with his wife and their daughter committed suicide.

On Sunday evening, the victim businessman had handed over his house keys to his elder brother while saying they planned to go for an outing.

The next morning, his minor daughter made a distress call to a relative. When help arrived, all three family members were found unconscious. Doctors at the trauma centre declared them dead.

#### LMC to check licenses of pets PIONEER NEWS SERVICE Lucknow

he Animal Welfare Department of Lucknow Municipal Corporation (LMC) will soon launch a drive to check the licenses of pets. The decision has been taken in view of the increasing complaints aout unlicensed pet dogs and the noticeable decline in the number of registered licenses compared to the previous year.

According to the LMC, only 1,450 dog licenses have been issued so far, while the estimated number of pet dog owners in the city exceeds 10,000. This significant gap between the actual and registered pet dogs has raised concern within the department.

As per the existing rules, any individual found keeping a dog without a valid license will be charged a late fee of ₹50 per day, calculated from the beginning of the financial year, with a maximum penalty of ₹5,000. If a pet dog is found without a license during the checking drive, a fine of up to ₹5,000 will be imposed, and legal action may also be initiated. Dog owners are advised to immediately obtain or renew their licenses by logging on to the official LMC website.

# **UP STF busts inter-state** oxytocin racket; 3 held

he Uttar Pradesh Special Task Force (STF) on Wednesday arrested three suspected members of an inter-state gang allegedly involved in the illegal trafficking and supply of oxytocin injections to be misused in milch animals and vegetables. Acting on a tip-off, the STF

seized nearly 5,87,880 ml of oxytocin — valued at approximately ₹1.20 crore — during a raid at a house on Mohan Road near Buddheshwar crossing in Lucknow's Kakori police station area. The arrested men have been identified as Anmol Pal, Awadhesh Pal, both

Police also recovered ₹12,000 in cash, 800 empty vials, rubber and aluminum caps, plastic funnels, pipes, packets of salt, and a transport vehicle. Three mobile phones were also seized, the STF said.

According to the STF, the gang was procuring high-density oxytocin disguised as mineral water parcels from Bihar.

"Once received, they repackaged it into smaller ampoules and illegally distributed it in Lucknow and adjoining districts. The oxytocin was allegedly used to artificially stimulate milk production in cattle and accelerate the growth of fruits and vegetables, posing serious Lucknow residents, and health hazards to both animals

Monitoring stations across India have breached the warning level, but none have reached the danger or extreme flood thresholds, the Central Water Commission (CWC) said on Wednesday.

This alert is part of the commission's daily flood bulletin released by the Central Flood Control Room The bulletin indicates there

are currently no sites in the "severe" or "extreme" flood situation categories, meaning that no location has reached or surpassed its danger mark or highest historical flood level.

However, 12 sites in Assam, Bihar, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, and Uttar Pradesh were flagged for "above-normal" flood situations, where water levels have crossed the warning threshold but remain below danger levels. In Assam, the Kushiyara

River in Karimganj and the Brahmaputra at Neamatighat in



Jorhat are among those nearing concern levels.

Bihar remains under observation, with elevated water levels in the Kosi at Baltara, Bagmati at Benibad and Gandak at

Dumariaghat. Uttar Pradesh is closely monitoring four sites, including the Ganga at Fatehgarh and Kachhla Bridge, Ghagra at Elginbridge, and Gandak at Khadda, which

# NCB dismantles transnational drug trafficking syndicate

Union Jal Shakti Minister C R Patil on Wednesday launched C-FLOOD, a web-based flood forecasting system, designed to sound an alarm at the village level up to two days in advance.

The system has been developed by the Central Water Commission (CWC), the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC) and the National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC).

It has been made operational under the National Supercomputing Mission (NSM), jointly steered by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and the Department of Science and Technology (DST). "This is a transformative step in India's flood management journey," Patil said.

The minister also directed the CWC and allied institutions to prepare a national plan for inundation studies and expand coverage to all major river basins.

At present, the system provides real-time flood maps and water level forecasts for the Mahanadi, Godavari, and Tapi river basins using a 2-D hydrodynamic model.

Forecast simulations for the Mahanadi basin are conducted on high-performance computing systems at C-DAC Pune, while outputs for the Godavari and Tapi basins are integrated from models developed by NRSC under the National Hydrology Project. Patil stressed the impor-

tance of integrating the forecasts with the National Disaster Management Emergency Response Portal and improving accuracy through satellite validation and on-ground

#### To explore this, two complementary studies were undertaken using different research approaches - one based on past data and another involving real-time investigation.

The first study conducted by ICMR's National Institute of Epidemiology (NIE) was titled "Factors associated with unexplained sudden deaths among adults aged 18-45 years in India — a multi-centric matched case control study." This study was carried out

from May to August 2023 across 47 tertiary care hospitals in 19 states and Union territories, the statement said.

It looked at individuals who appeared to be healthy but died suddenly between October 2021 and March 2023.

The findings have conclusively showed that COVID-19 vaccination does not increase the risk of unexplained sudden deaths in young adults.

The probe set a stellar example of multiagency coordination, resulting in 8 arrests and seizures of 5 consignments while triggering crackdowns in the US and Australia against the ring that operates across 4 continents and 10+ nations," Shah said.

He said the agencies are constantly monitoring the sophisticated modes like crypto payments and anonymous drop shippers used by these

gangs. "PM Shri Narendra Modi Ji-led govt is determined to saw off every drug cartel and protect our youth, no matter where they operate from," he said.

# A crucial opportunity amid unrelenting crisis

If the ceasefire comes into effect in Gaza, as announced by Trump, it would give people a chance to recuperate

t has been almost a year and a half since the Israel-Hamas conflict started. In the name of obliterating Hamas, Israel rained miseries on the people of Gaza, with the world watching haplessly as the bombs flattened Gaza, sparing no one - not even hospitals, children, and women. The indiscriminate shelling has resulted in untold miseries for the people; even food and medical supplies are not reaching Gaza. But now it looks like there may be some respite in sight. US President Donald Trump has announced that Israel has agreed to a 60-day ceasefire in Gaza, but subject to "necessary conditions." The proposal, however, is still awaiting a formal response from Hamas, the Palestinian militant group that governs the Gaza Strip. Trump shared the announcement via a post on Truth Social, stating that the ceasefire proposal would be delivered by Qatar and Egypt, two key mediators that have consistently played crucial roles in negotiations between the two sides. This announcement comes just days before Trump is set to meet Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu at the White House. Trump has urged Hamas to seize the opportunity.

For the people of Gaza, the ceasefire could mean a much needed respite. Since hostilities reignited, the region has seen widespread destruction and a humanitarian catastrophe unfolding on a daily basis. Over 50,000 people are estimated to have lost their lives in Gaza since the beginning of this latest war, with thousands more injured, displaced, or missing. Entire neighbourhoods have been reduced to rubble, schools and hospitals have been completed destroyed, and aid has barely trickled in since the ceasefire breakdown in March. If the ceasefire holds, it would mark the first sustained pause in violence since the breakdown. It could pave the way for renewed humanitarian assistance, medical evacuations, and the restoration of basic infrastructure. More importantly, it might offer a brief but crucial chance for exhausted civilians to recover, mourn, and rebuild what little remains of their lives. While Israel's agreement to the ceasefire is a significant step, history suggests that such truces have been violated by both sides and resumed hostilities. The previous ceasefire that began on January 19 unraveled within weeks, with both sides accusing each other of violations. In March, Israel resumed its strikes, alleging Hamas breached the terms of the truce - a claim Hamas denied.

This time, the Trump administration appears to be applying heavier diplomatic pressure to bring all parties to the table. Yet, scepticism remains high. Hamas has not issued a formal response and is likely weighing its options in the context of mounting civilian casualties and international scrutiny. Meanwhile, hardline factions within Israel's political establishment may also resist a prolonged ceasefire if it is perceived as a concession or weakness. Beyond politics and geopolitics, this ceasefire - if implemented - could serve as a turning point for Gaza's devastated population. The region cannot withstand much more. The violence must stop, even temporarily, for the sake of innocent civilians.



# A grand celebration, a sobering reckoning

On July 4, 2026, the United States turns 250. Amid fireworks and fanfare, the day invites reflection on a nation shaped by bold ideals, hard-won progress, and enduring contradictions

n July 4, 2025, the United States turns 250-a semiquincentennial that marks a remarkable journey from a colonial rebellion to a global superpower. As Americans gather with fireworks, parades, and nostalgic anthems to mark the adoption of the Declaration of Independence in 1776, the occasion invites not just celebration but introspection.

For this birthday is more than spectacle: it is a moment of reckoning-with ideals pursued, promises broken, and the uncertain road ahead. At its birth, America dared to proclaim that "all men are created equal," launching a revolutionary political experiment in representative democracy.

From those founding words, it grew into the world's oldest continuous democratic republic. The passage of the Bill of Rights in 1791 enshrined key freedoms: of speech, religion, and assembly.

The Civil War tested and reshaped the Union, while Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address echoed across generations with its solemn promise that "Government of the people, by the people, for the people shall not perish from the earth."

Through the 20th century, the US ascended the global stage by fusing its liberal values with geopolitical ambition. At Bretton Woods in 1944, American leadership birthed the IMF and World Bank to stabilise postwar finance. A year later, it spearheaded the United Nations, laying the foundation for a new multilateral order.

With New York as the new diplomatic hub, America leaned into liberal internationalism, promoting democracy in a world emerging from fascist devastation. Yet American history has always been a study in contradiction. The nation that spoke of liberty denied it to millions. The 13th, 14th, and 15th Amendments abolished slavery and laid the groundwork for civil rights, but true justice remained elusive. Leaders like Martin Luther King Jr and Malcolm X emerged to challenge the nation's conscience-King with his soaring moral vision of integration, Malcolm with his demand for dignity and self-determination.

Their competing voices helped frame the American experiment not just in political terms but moral ones, pushing the country toward an ever-expanding definition of freedom. The American presidency, from Washington to Roosevelt, Kennedy to Reagan, has served as both compass and mirror. Washington's refusal to become king set a lasting precedent.

FDR's New Deal remade the social contract. Eisenhower warned of the growing might of the military-industrial complex. Kennedy's idealism and Nixon's cynicism



pulled the country in opposite directions. In more recent decades, Barack Obama's rise symbolised progress, while Donald Trump's presidency marked a pivot toward nationalism and populism. His slogan - "Make America Great Again"- tapped into nostalgia, economic grievance, and cultural unease. Trump's unapologetic "America First" doctrine marked a break from postwar multilateralism, fueling debates about the nation's role in an increasingly multipolar world.

The Trump era also underscored the growing influence of non-elected power centres in American life. Powerful lobbying groups like the Zionist American organisations, the National Rifle Association (NRA), and pharmaceutical and defence lobbies have shaped policy well beyond the ballot box. The NRA, in particular, has stymied gun control reforms even

amid rising gun violence. Meanwhile, influential think tanks such as the RAND Corporation, Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, and Brookings Institution play an outsized role in shaping foreign policy narratives, often serving as the intellectual fuel behind defence spending, geopolitical posturing, and trade frameworks. These institutions, while contributing to policy discourse, are often funded by

vested interests, blurring the line between objective research and ideological agenda. American innovation remains unparalleled.

The Apollo moon landing, the internet revolution, and the tech giants of Silicon Valley — Facebook, Apple, Amazon, Netflix, and Google — have reshaped the global economy. America's universities continue to draw the brightest minds, and its cultural output-from Hollywood to hip-hop-extends its soft power across borders. Yet this innovation has come with ethical dilemmas: surveillance capitalism, misinformation, job displacement by AI, and widening economic inequality.

America's military might, once justified as a safeguard of global stability, is increasingly scrutinised. From Vietnam to Iraq and Áfghanistan, its interventions have left deep scars and unresolved legacies. The post-9/11 world order saw the rise of the Bush Doctrine and a militarised foreign policy under the banner of counter-terrorism and regime change. The burden of being the world's "indispensable nation" has often been accompanied by charges of overreach and imperial arrogance.

Within its borders, the republic is deeply polarised. Debates over immigration, racial ustice, climate change, and gun control remain bitterly divisive. The Capitol riot of anuary 6, 2021, revealed a dangerous fragility in democratic institutions. Partisan media ecosystems, rising distrust in electoral systems, and the proliferation of conspiracy theories have cast long shadows over civic life. Despite this, American patriotism

endures-often in complex, contradictory forms. For some, patriotism means saluting the flag; for others, it means kneeling before it in protest. To love America, for many, is to challenge it. From debates over Confederate monuments to conversations around reparations and historical memory, the struggle over who gets to define the American story continues. The 250th anniversary has spurred national projects like the Garden of American Heroes and public exhibitions on democracy and dissent, signalling an ongoing contest over the meaning of freedom and the figures who represent it. On the world stage, the United States now faces rising powers like China and India, as well as a resurgent Russia.

The European Union offers an alternative model of regional governance. The challenges ahead-climate crises, AI regulation, pandemics, and mass migration-require cooperation, not confrontation. As power becomes more diffuse, America's leadership must adapt-with humility, innovation, and a renewed moral compass. Henry Kissinger once observed, "It may be dangerous to be America's enemy, but to be America's friend is fatal"— a blunt reminder that the line between idealism and self-interest has always defined the United States. At 250, the nation remains a paradox: powerful yet insecure, visionary yet flawed, a republic born in revolution still struggling to live up to its revolutionary promise.

#### Breakdown of law and order in Tamil Nadu

In a notable development, five police personnel in Tamil Nadu have been incarcerated following the custodial death of a young security guard, Ajith Kumar, who was allegedlv involved in the theft of ten sovereigns of jewellery in Sivaganga district. This incident underscores a broader concern regarding law and order in the state. During the current term of the DMK Government, the reported tally of custodial deaths, now standing at 24, has drawn considerable scrutiny. #### **MAMDANI SHAKES UP NYC POLITICS, DRAWS TRUMP'S IRE**

In a dramatic turn in New York City politics, 33-year-old Democratic Socialist Zohran Mamdani has emerged as a powerful challenger in the upcoming mayoral election - so much so that President Donald Trump has threatened to cut off federal funds if Mamdani, "doesn't behave himself," is elected. Mamdani, born in Kampala to Indian-origin parents, moved to New York at age seven. His mother is renowned filmmaker Mira Nair, and his father. Mahmood Mamdani, is a Columbia University Professor.

A self-proclaimed follower of Martin Luther King Jr, Mamdani has championed a progressive platform focused on wealth redistribution seeking to raise taxes on New York's wealthiest and ease the burden on overtaxed outer borough homeowners. His proposals have drawn sharp criticism from Republicans, who label him a pro-Palestinian Muslim

sympathiser. His remarks calling for a "global intifada"- a term he insists meant "struggle," not "uprising" - have provoked widespread condemnation Mamdani has also stirred controversy for calling Indian PM Narendra Modi a war criminal and opposing the Ram Temple construction at Ayodhya.

Despite polarising opinions Mamdani's ability to connect with New York's large Muslim population and immigrant communities has boosted his per cent of the vote in the first round, he is set to run as the Democratic nominee in the November 4 general election.

His rise comes at a time when the Democratic Party is undergoing a soulsearching phase post-Kamala Harris's defeat. Whether Mamdani's fiery rhetoric and grassroots appeal can translate into electoral victory remains to be seen but his candidacy signals a potential shift in the city's political landscape. #### Major Stampede Incidents in India Over the Last Two Decades

- January 2005: A stampede at the Mandher Devi Temple in Satara, Maharashtra, resulted in over 300 deaths due to a fire and overcrowding during a religious fair.
- August 2008: At the Naina Devi Temple in Himachal Pradesh, a stampede led to 145 fatalities, with many victims being women and children.
- September 2008: A devastating stampede dur-ing Navratri at the Chamunda Devi Temple in Jodhpur, Rajasthan, claimed more than 220 lives.
- January 2011: An incident occurred on a narrow forest path during the Sabarimala pilgrimage in Kerala, resulting in the deaths of over 104 devotees after a vehicle overturned.
- 2013: A stampede at the Kumbh Mela in Allahabad (now Prayagraj), Uttar Pradesh, at the railway station caused at least 36 deaths.
- October 2013: Around 115 people lost their lives in a stampede near the Ratangarh Temple in Madhya Pradesh, reportedly sparked by rumours of a collapsing bridge.
- July 2015: A tragic stampede during the Godavari Maha Pushkaram festival in Andhra Pradesh led to at least 27 fatalities.
- September 2017: Twenty-three people died and 36 were injured in a stampede on the narrow bridge connecting the Elphinstone Road station of the Western Railway to Parel station of the Central Railway in Mumbai.
- January 2022: Á surge in the crowd at the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine in Jammu and Kashmir resulted in the deaths of at least 12 pilgrims near the Bhawan complex.
- July 2024: A stampede during a religious gath-ering in Hathras, Uttar Pradesh, left more than 120 individuals dead, predominantly women, following a spiritual discourse.
- January 8, 2025: At the Tirupati Temple in Andhra Pradesh, a stampede resulted in the deaths of 6 people and left several others injured.
- February 2025: A stampede during the Mahakumbh in Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh, led to the deaths of over 30 pilgrims and injured many more, highlighting ongoing crowd management issues.
- June 2025: A tragic incident in Bengaluru occurred when a stampede at the Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA) stadium resulted in several fatalities.

The devastating stampede in Bangalore, which resulted in the tragic loss of eleven lives and stunned the nation, remains vivid in our minds. Now, another sorrowful event has transpired during the honoured Rath Yatra in Puri. This stampede has taken the lives of three pilgrims and left many others wounded, turning a moment of spiritual devotion into one of confusion and grief. Despite having thousands of security per-sonnel and employing advanced surveillance technology, such as drones, CCTV cameras, and AI, this tragedy could not be averted. This occurrence, like many others before it, raises urgent questions: Why do these incidents continue despite past lessons? What more can be done to protect the millions who participate in these events with hope and faith?

India has a troubling history with stampedes, particularly during religious celebrations, in temples, and at pilgrimage sites. Since 1996, there have been over 4,000 reports of such incidents, resulting in numerous fatalities. The Kumbh Mela, known globally as one of the largest gatherings, has faced multiple disasters despite thorough plan-ning. The recent tragedy in Puri underscores the urgent need to reassess our strategies for managing large crowds, moving beyond mere barricades and police presence to adopt intelligence-driven, holistic approaches that can predict and prevent such catastrophes.

A key challenge in managing crowds stems from the unpredictability of human behaviour. A stampede can often be set off by a minor incidentsuch as a loud sound, a rumour, or a blockagethat incites fear. People may flee in different directions, escape routes become blocked, and within moments, lives can be lost.

In Puri, initial reports indicate that poor sector organisation and a failure to disperse the crowd on time contributed to the deadly incident. While authorities may have enhanced crowd management tactics over time, understanding the psychology and dynamics of moving crowds is a vital area that requires focus.

What is especially concerning is the possibility of deliberate disruptions. Evidence from social media and local news indicates that organised groups or troublemakers may attempt to provoke unrest during major gatherings. This highlights the need for improved intelligence networks-not just nationally but also within local communities. It is essential to engage reliable informants, community leaders, and local law enforcement to collect real-time intelligence about any potential threats or attempts to create disorder.

The time has come to shift from reactive tactics to a proactive, intelligence-driven approach to crowd management. Effective preparation should go beyond simply predicting crowd num-

readiness, and security intelligence. Frameworks like the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction establish a global standard for these approaches, underscoring the significance of grasping risks, investing in preventive actions, and enhancing early warning and response systems.

# Monsoon 2025: How much is too much for **Indian agriculture and economy?**

# Higher education: Growth, challenges and road ahead



#### he southwest monsoon, a lifeline for Indian agriculture, has ushered in a promising 2025 season with forecasts of above-normal rainfall at 106 per cent $\pm$ 4 per cent of the long period average (LPA), as per the India Meteorological Department (IMD). This bountiful monsoon, critical for the Kharif cropping season from June to September, supports the livelihoods of 42.3 per cent of India's population and contributes 18.2 per cent to the nation's GDP. With agriculture serving as the backbone of rural economies, the anticipated robust rainfall is poised to enhance crop yields, stabilise food prices, and stimulate economic growth. However, challenges such as uneven rainfall distribution and the risk of excessive precipitation loom large. The monsoon is the lifeblood of Indian agriculture, particularly for Kharif crops such as rice, maize, cotton, sugarcane, pulses, and oilseeds, which rely heavily on seasonal rains. Approximately 50 per cent of India's arable land depends on monsoon irrigation, making timely and adequate rainfall critical for sowing and crop growth. The 2025 fore-cast of above-normal rainfall, particularly in June at 108 per cent of LPA, promises an early onset

that supports timely Kharif sowing. This is a marked improvement over last year's extended monsoon, which led to flooding and crop damage in several regions. Beyond irrigation, the monsoon replenishes groundwater reserves, essential for both Kharif and Rabi seasons. Adequate groundwater levels reduce reliance on expensive irrigation systems, lowering costs for farmers. The IMD's prediction of normal to abovenormal rainfall across most regions, except parts of peninsular and northeast India, augurs well for groundwater recharge and sustained agricultural productivity. A robust monsoon directly impacts India's economy through increased agricultural output, which stabilises food prices and curbs inflation. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) reported in April 2025 that headline CPI inflation moderated to a six-year low of 3.2 per cent, driven by declining food inflation for six consecutive months. The expected bumper Kharif harvest, supported by record wheat production and higher yields of key pulses in the Rabi season, should further ease inflationary pressures.

This stability aligns with the RBI's goal of maintaining inflation near its target, providing room for monetary policy flexibility, as evidenced by the recent 50-basis-point repo rate cut to 5.50 per cent on June 6, 2025. Higher agricultural productivity also boosts rural incomes, driving demand for goods and services. ICRA projects agriculture, forestry, and fishing GVA growth at 3.5-4.0 per cent for FY2026, following a 4.6 per cent expansion in FY2025. This growth fuels rural consumption, benefiting sectors like cement, tractors, twowheelers, edible oils, and sugar. For instance, the cement sector, with 35-37 per cent of demand tied



to rural housing, is expected to see 6-7 per cent volume growth in FY2026, driven by monsooninduced rural prosperity. Similarly, the tractor industry anticipates 4-7 per cent volume growth, reflecting improved farm cash flows. India's position as the world's largest rice exporter is set to

strengthen with surplus production, enabling increased exports of rice, sugar, and onions while reducing edible oil imports. It is obvious that above-average rains for the second consecutive year will support India's export ambitions, enhance foreign exchange earnings and bolster the trade balance. The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) has reinforced agricultural

optimism by announcing significant Minimum Support Price (MSP) hikes for Kharif crops in the 2025-26 marketing season. The Government has ensured remunerative prices to the growers for their produce. The highest absolute increase in MSP over the previous year has been recommended for nigerseed (₹820 per quintal), followed by Ragi (₹596 per quintal), Cotton (₹589 per quintal) and Sesamum (₹579 per quintal). These hikes, exceeding April 2025 mandi prices, incentivise farmers to expand sowing, particularly for oilseeds and pulses, which saw MSP growth of 6-9 per cent.

However, the effectiveness of MSP hikes depends on rainfall distribution. Uneven or excessive rainfall could disrupt sowing, negating the benefits of higher prices. The Government's proactive measures, including investments in irrigation and crop insurance, aim to mitigate these risks, ensuring farmers can leverage the monsoon's potential.

Despite the optimistic forecast, monsoon variabil-

ity poses significant challenges. Excessive rainfall, while beneficial for water supply, can lead to waterlogging, soil erosion, and crop damage, particularly during the ripening stage. Last year's extended monsoon caused flooding that damaged crops in several regions, underscoring the risks of concentrated heavy rains. The IMD's forecast indicates potential below-normal rainfall in parts of northwest and northeast India, which could affect regional crop yields and exacerbate disparities in agricultural productivity. Uneven spatial and temporal rainfall distribution remains a critical concern. An even distribution is paramount to maximising crop yields and supporting rural demand. Episodes of heavy rainfall could disrupt sowing schedules, damage young crops, or lead to post-harvest losses. Climate change further complicates monsoon predictability. While neutral El Niño-Southern Oscillation (ENSO) conditions are expected to persist in 2025, long-term climate trends could introduce volatility, affecting agricultural planning. Investments in climate-resilient crops, improved weather forecasting, and robust irrigation infrastructure are essential to address these challenges. Expanding crop insurance schemes and improving access to credit will empower farmers to mitigate risks and invest in high-yield crops.

The RBI's accommodative monetary policy, coupled with Government support through MSP hikes and infrastructure investments, creates a conducive environment for agricultural growth. By addressing challenges like uneven rainfall and climate volatility. India can harness the monsoon's full potential to drive rural prosperity and economic growth. As India navigates these opportunities and challenges, the monsoon's magic can transform the agricultural landscape, fostering economic resilience and prosperity.

digital platforms has brought education to remote and underserved areas, while simultaneously catering to urban learners who value flexibility and autonomy. Hybrid models are especially attractive to the current generation of learners, who seek personalised and modular learning journeys rather than rigid, one-size-fitsall programme.

International enrolment is also contributing to the sector's vibrancy. Students from Africa, Southeast Asia, and parts of the Middle East are increasingly looking to India for higher education due to its relative affordability, quality assur-

ance, and English-language instruction. With clearly defined academic roadmaps and regulated institutional frameworks, India is emerging as a credible global education hub.

However, the rapid transformation has brought with it new challenges. Chief among them is the need for constant curriculum renewal to keep pace with industry disruptions, especially those led by technology. As the pace of change accelerates, the traditional model of revising curricula every few years has become inadequate. Institutions that offer autonomous programs are now introducing mechanisms such as biannual curriculum reviews in collaboration with industry experts.

This allows for agile course updates and incorporation of real-world applications. In the realm of business education in particular, job readiness has become a central concern. The success of any academic program is increasingly being measured by how well it prepares students for the workforce. This includes not just academic knowledge, but also a portfolio of practical skills, exposure to current tools, and adaptability to new technologies. Institutions are

from industry leaders, offering hands-on training, and introducing placement preparation from the first semester.

The implementation of NEP 2020 marks a significant departure from previous policies by encouraging multidisciplinary learning, vocational integration, and skill-based education. While the policy is wellframed in its vision, its execution remains uneven across states. Variations in adoption timelines and curricular frameworks have led to fragmented outcomes. For instance, students within the same institution may follow entirely different academic models depending on state-level directives. This lack of cohesion hinders scalability and national benchmarking. Policy clarity is especially critical in defining institutional roles. The NEP envisages categorising institutions into research universities, teaching universities, and autonomous colleges. Such classification allows for targeted development and funding, but ambiguity in criteria and overlapping mandates have caused operational uncertainties. A unified and phased approach to implementation, led by both central and state Governments, is essential to

streamline the transition.

Another area of concern is teacher training. As student expectations evolve, the role of educators is shifting from knowledge dispensers to facilitators and mentors. This transition requires a new set of competencies-ranging from digital literacy and interdisciplinary thinking to the ability to guide students through personalised learning paths. The forthcoming national teacher education framework, set to launch in 2026, may address some of these gaps, but continuous professional development and

pedagogical innovation must remain a priority. The changing perception of degrees and certifications also warrants attention. In today's job market, demonstrable skills often outweigh formal qualifications. Employers are increasingly emphasising problemsolving ability, communication skills, and digital proficiency over academic transcripts. This shift is especially evident in sectors like media, design, IT, and entrepreneurship. As a result, institutions must realign their assessment systems and course outcomes to reflect competence, not just compliance.

Going forward, the future of higher education in India lies in meaningful collaboration. Academic institutions must build deeper partnerships with industries to ensure relevance, internships, mentorships, and placements. Specialisation, adaptability, and a commitment to lifelong learning will be key differentiators. Institutions that invest in these areas will be best positioned to prepare students for a rapidly changing world.

# Air India pilots carry simulator test after Ahmedabad crash

group of senior Air India (AI) pilots recreated on simulators some adverse conditions, such as flying with higher weight and temperature and with gear down and retracted flaps at 50 feet, with the results showing the Boeing 787-8 aircraft continued flying, sources said on Wednesday.

The simulator test was carried out independently by the Air India Boeing 787 aircraft fleet trainers during a training session at the airline's Mumbai facility within days of the crash of an Air India Dreamliner in Ahmedabad.

When contacted, Air India said pilots conducted the tests on their own and the airline had no role in it.

Among various theories doing the rounds initially regarding the possible causes of the Air India aircraft crash on June 12 that killed over 260 people, was that the pilot flew the aircraft with retracted flaps and gear down.

at 50 feet altitude. In the simulator, the aircraft continued flying." Flaps are movable panels, located along the trailing edge of the wings of the aircraft, which get extended during takeoff and landing to increase the wing's surface area to provide more 'lift' that

keeps the plane flying. This additional aerodynamic force is crucial during low-speed flight, like takeoff or landing. Flaps are adjusted manually by either pilot, depending on the situation. In cruise flight, they remain retracted. The crash, one of the worst

air disasters in India in decades, involved a Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner operating as Air India flight AI 171. The aircraft was en route to London's Gatwick Airport when it crashed into a medical hostel complex in

Ahmedabad's Meghani Nagar area shortly after takeoff. Of the 242 people onboard, 241 were killed, with only one

survivor. The total death toll stood at 260, including casualties on the ground. India's nodal aircraft accident probe agency, AAIB, launched a probe after the tragedy and constituted a multidisciplinary team on June 13. The team includes representatives from the US National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB), an air traffic control

officer and an aviation medicine specialist. Last week, the Government said data is being extracted from black boxes, and analysis of the cockpit voice recorder and flight data recorder is underway to reconstruct the sequence of events that led to the fatal crash.

## Delhi CM orders smart classrooms, immediate repairs for city schools

elhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Wednesday directed the immediate operationalisation of 2,000 smart classrooms, the installation of modern science laboratories in all Government schools, urgent repairs of dilapidated school buildings, and prompt recruitment to fill vacant teaching posts for schools across the city. She also ordered improvements to the entry gates of Thyagaraj and Chhatrasal stadiums, underlining her Government's commitment to creating a comprehensive and modern educational environment for students in the capital.

These directives were issued during a highlevel review meeting chaired by the Chief Minister at the Delhi Secretariat, where she met senior officials of the Education Department to assess ongoing infrastructure projects, review staffing gaps and chart strategies to ensure quality education across all Delhi Government schools. "Our Government is working with full commitment on both resource and policy levels to ensure every child in Delhi, irrespective of their background, receives equal opportunity and world-class education," said CM Gupta following the meeting.

To strengthen science education, she instructed that every school be equipped with state-ofthe-art laboratories to promote hands-on, experiment-based learning. "This will enhance students' understanding and help develop a scien-tific temperament," she said. Emphasising the need for robust infrastructure, the Chief Minister directed officials to prepare a detailed list of



school buildings in poor condition and under take repair and renovation work on a priority basis. The stadium gate upgrades were also ordered with the comfort of student-athletes in mind. A major focus of the review was on addressing the shortage of teachers. The Chief Minister asked the Education Department to ensure that all vacant teaching posts - from primary to senior secondary levels - are filled without delay. "There must be no compromise in recruiting qualified, trained teachers," she said.

Additionally, the CM pushed for rapid progress on the smart classroom initiative. In the first phase, 2,000 smart classrooms are to be completed and fully equipped with internet connectivity, interactive digital panels or projectors, and audio-visual tools to modernise the learning experience. Reiterating her Government's priority, the Chief Minister concluded, "Every initiative related to the future of Delhi's children is a top priority for our Government. Education should not be confined to classrooms alone it should reflect in the entire atmosphere."

Continued from >> P1 As a result, places like Shalimar Bagh and its historical structures like Sheesh Mahal fell into disrepair and were nearly ruined. However, thanks to the personal interest taken by the LG and the joint efforts of the DDA, the restoration carried out has truly restored the grandeur and magnificence of the park," he said.

Like other monuments, Sheesh Mahal too had been in a dilapidated state. An important heritage structure protected as a National Monument, it had also shown signs of neglect over time. Taking note of the Sheesh Mahal's dire conditions. Delhi Lt Governor VK Saxena, had directed the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) and the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) to undertake the project to restore its lost glory. The task set by the LG was to expedite the conservation work on the monument and heritage structures along with improvement of its overall landscape on an urgent basis.

While the ASI restored Sheesh Mahal's heritage ele-

ments, a Mughal-style Char fully restored using traditional Bagh landscape design was developed by the DDA to complement the monument. The DDA has also restored three heritage cottages and a

baradri, which had dilapidated to the point of structural risk. Through meticulous conservation efforts, these historic buildings have now been returned to their former glory.

After restoration, two of the cottages have been adaptively re-used for community-focused purposes. The Readers Café Corner, a book café aimed at fostering literary engagement and Café Shalimar, a cafeteria for park visitors, now occupy these restored spaces, reviving their relevance and making

social interaction. A smaller third cottage has also been restored and repurposed to a contemporary usage for official purposes while still preserving its unique architectural legacy. Additionally, the historic baradari, possibly constructed alongside the Sheesh Mahal and once buried under silt and debris, has been care-

materials and techniques such as lime concrete, lime surkhi, lakhauri bricks and natural binders such as gud, belgiri and urad to ensure authenticity and strength.

Shalimar Bagh, built in 1653, has seen many phases of history, from the Mughal period to British rule. It has witnessed many historical events and changing rulers over time. Today, within the District Park of Shalimar Bagh, the majestic Sheesh Mahal - ASI protected monument and a few heritage structures from the 1930s remain.

The DDA is also actively working to protect and restore heritage structures across Delhi through dedicated conservation efforts. Projects like the restoration of Mehrauli Archaeological Park, St James Church, Hazrat Nizamuddin Basti, and heritage structures at Sanjav Van demonstrate this commitment. These restored sites provide new avenues for the public to engage with the city's history while also serving as spaces for recreation.

With the latest case, the total number of polio cases in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa has risen to eight. Four cases were confirmed in Sindh and one each in Punjab and Gilgit-Baltistan earlier this year.

Keir Starmer marks one-year milestone as **UK PM amid turmoil, Chancellor in tears**

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer on Wednesday addressed an extraordinary House of Prime Minister's Questions Commons session with his Chancellor, Rachel Reeves, seen fighting tears behind him as he defended his government's efforts to manage the country's mounting social welfare benefits bill.

Starmer, who is marking one year as UK PM this week since his Labour government forgotten that his welfare bill was elected in the July 4 general election last year, had narrowly averted a rebellion within his own ranks after offering a last-minute concession to

# Wisconsin SC strikes down 176-year-old abortion ban

he Wisconsin Supreme Court's liberal majority struck down the state's 176vear-old abortion ban on Wednesday. ruling 4-3 that it was superseded by newer state laws regulating the procedure, including statutes that criminalise abortions only after a fetus can survive outside the womb.

The ban state lawmakers adopted in 1849 made it a felony when anyone other than the mother "intentionally destroys the life of an unborn child."

It was in effect until 1973, when the US Supreme Court's landmark Roe v. Wade decision legalising abortion nationwide nullified it. Legislators never officially repealed the ban, however, and conservatives argued that the US Supreme Court's 2022 decision to overturn Roe reactivated it.

Wisconsin Attorney General Josh Kaul, a Democrat, filed a lawsuit that year arguing that the ban was trumped by abortion restrictions legislators enacted during the nearly half-century that Roe was in effect.

Kaul specifically cited a 1985 law that essentially permits abortions until viabilitv. Some babies can survive with medical help after 21 weeks of gestation.

Sheboygan County District Attorney Joel Urmanski, a Republican, defended the 1849 ban in court, arguing that it could coexist with the newer abortion restrictions, just as different penalties for the same crime coexist.

Dane County Circuit Judge Diane Schlipper ruled in 2023 that the 1849 ban outlaws feticide — which she defined as the killing of a fetus without the mother's consent — but not consensual abortions. Abortions have been available in the state since that ruling but the state Supreme Court

decision gives providers and patients more certainty that abortions will remain legal in Wisconsin.

Urmanski had asked the state Supreme Court to overturn Schlipper's ruling without waiting for a decision from a lower appellate court. It was expected as soon as the justices took the case that they would overturn the ban. Liberals hold a 4-3 majority on the court and one of them, Janet Protasiewicz, openly stated on the campaign trail that she supports abortion rights.

The justices concluded that "the legislature impliedly repealed" the ban "by enacting comprehensive legislation about virtually every aspect of abortion including where, when, and how healthcare providers may lawfully perform abortions," Justice Rebecca Dallet wrote for the majority. 'That comprehensive legislation so thoroughly covers the entire subject of abortion that it was clearly meant as a substitute for the 19th century near-total ban on abortion.

In a dissent, Justice Annette Ziegler called the ruling "a jaw-dropping exercise of judicial will." She said the liberal justices based the decision on their personal preference to allow abortions.

Urmanski's attorney, Andrew Phillips, didn't immediately respond to an email Wednesday morning seeking comment. Kaul's spokesperson, Riley Vetterkind, also didn't immediately return an email.

Democratic-backed Susan Crawford defeated conservative Brad Schimel for an open seat on the court in April, ensuring liberals will maintain their 4-3 edge until at least 2028. Crawford has not been sworn in vet and was not part of Wednesday's ruling. She'll play pivotal role, though, in a separate Planned Parenthood of Wisconsin lawsuit challenging the 1849 ban's constitutionality. The high court decided last year to take that case. It's still pending.

# India, UK to sign social security pact

ndia may soon have a social security pact with the UK as an in-built component of the free trade agreement (FTA) which has been finalised between the two countries, a source said on Wednesday. The source said that from now onwards, the social security agreement (SSA) will be an inbuilt component of all free trade agreements to be negotiated in future.

"UK is believed to have agreed on the social security component under the FTA negotiations, which would be ratified in the near future," the source said. The SSA, a reciprocal arrangement between two or more countries, ensures that an employee while on a foreign

assignment does not have to contribute to the social security coverage fund in that country but get the full benefit of employment period for pension calculation, while the employers are saved from making double social security contributions on behalf of their workers. The Indian employees posted abroad or on foreign assignment are required to obtain a certificate of coverage (CoC) from retirement fund body EPFO, which helps them avoid paying social security contribution in countries where they are posted.

The Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) has been authorised to issue the Certificate of Coverage to employees posted in nations that have signed an agreement with India.

# Cabs can charge double during peak hours, says Government

he road transport ministry has allowed cab aggregators such as Uber, Ola and Rapido to charge up to two times the base fare during peak hours, as against 1.5 times earlier, while for non-peak hours the fare has to be a minimum of 50 per cent of the base fare. The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways in its 'Motor Vehicles Aggregator Guidelines 2025' said "the aggregator shall be permitted to charge a minimum of 50 per cent lower than the base fare and a maximum dynamic pricing of two times the base fare specified under sub-clause (17.1)."

Moreover, the base fare chargeable shall be for a minimum of three kilometers to compensate for "dead mileage" -- including the distance travelled without a passenger and the distance travelled and fuel utilized for picking up the passenger(s).

As per the guidelines, the fare notified by the state government for the respective category or class of motor vehicles, shall be the base fare chargeable to passengers availing services from the aggregator. States have been advised to cancellation is made without a reason identified as valid by the aggregator.

A similar penalty will be as per the guidelines. imposed on the passenger when such cancellation is

made without a valid reason. As per the guidelines, the fare notified by the state government for the respective category of motor vehicles, shall be the base fare chargeable to passengers availing aggregator services

The guidelines said the Central government shall develop and designate a portal to enable for single-window clearance of application for licence as aggregator. "The licence fee payable by the aggregator shall be ₹5 lakhs and the licence shall be valid for a period of five years from and along-with the official the date of its issue," it said. mandated to ensure that drivers have health and term insurance of at least ₹5 lakh and ₹10 lakh respectively.

**⊣**he rupee depreciated 9 paise to close at 85.68 (provisional) against US dollar on Wednesday, on weak domestic equity markets and a rise in crude oil prices.

Forex traders said a slight recovery in the US dollar too weighed on the rupee as market players await the conclusion of India-US trade deal, which is at its final stage.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the domestic unit opened at 85.59 against the greenback and touched an intra-day high of 85.57 and a low of 85.75 against the greenback during the day.

At the end of Wednesday's trading session, the local unit was at 85.68 (provisional), down 9 paise over its previous closing price. On Tuesday, the rupee appreciated 17 paise to close at 85.59 against the US dollar. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, rose 0.14 per cent to 96.95. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, went up by 0.92 per cent to \$67.73 per barrel in futures trade.

# **Trump's tariffs to cost US** employers \$82.3 billion: Analysis

n analysis finds that a A critical group of US employers would face a direct cost of \$82.3 billion from President Donald Trump's current tariff plans, a sum that could be potentially managed through price hikes, layoffs, hiring freezes or lower profit margins.

The analysis by the JPMorganChase Institute is among the first to measure the direct costs created by the import taxes on businesses with \$10 million to \$1 billion in annual revenue, a category that includes roughly a third of private-sector US workers. These companies are more dependent than other businesses on imports from China, India and Thailand - and the retail and wholesale sectors would be especially vulnerable to the import taxes being levied by the Republican president.

The findings show clear trade-offs from Trump's import taxes, contradicting his claims that foreign manufacturers would absorb the costs of the tariffs instead of US companies that rely on imports. he four-year bans on track and field athletes Pooja Rani, Kiran, Pankaj and Chelimi Pratyusha for evading dope tests has been reduced by one year after they accepted their offence within 20 days of being charged.

The quartet was among several athletes who were suspended by the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) earlier this year under Article 2.3 of the anti-doping rules, which deals with "evading, refusing or failing to submit to sample collection by an athlete" without compelling justification.

The maximum ban period for a first offence is four years but Article 10.8 of the NADA Rules provides for "results
