

10-day drive to enroll elderly under AVVY from today

he Odisha Government will launch an intensive 10-day campaign from June 12 to 21 to ensure universal coverage of citizens aged 70 and above under the Ayushman Vay Vandana Yojana (AVVY).

The initiative aims to enroll all remaining eligible elderly beneficiaries under the scheme, which provides Rs 5 lakh annual health coverage. Despite a target of 23 lakh beneficiaries, only 3.45 lakh have been enrolled so

To expedite the process, the Health and Family Welfare Department has mobilised Common Service Centres (CSCs), ASHAs, ANMs and Village-Level Workers. These personnel will facilitate door-to-door outreach and help citizens complete digital registration, particularly through mobile health units and designated enrollment camps.

AVVY was launched in Odisha alongside Ayushman Bharat-PM Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY) and the Gopabandhu Jan Arogya

its universal and inclusive design. Unlike other schemes, AVVY does not discriminate on the basis of income or previous scheme inclusion, ensuring that all senior citizens receive healthcare protection.

Officials said the campaign would help bridge the healthcare accessibility gap and urged families to assist their elderly members in availing of the scheme's benefits. Awareness drives, helpdesks and mobile enrollment camps would be held across all dis-

City cops nab fraudster from UP for duping bizman

The Commissionerate Police have arrested a person from Uttar Pradesh for allegedly impersonating as an executive of Jindal Steel Ltd and duping a businessman of Bhubaneswar of more than Rs 11 lakh.

The accused, identified as Pradum Kumar Bhojapur in Chandauli district of Uttar Pradesh, was apprehended on June 9 from his village under Sakaldiha police station in Chandauli.

He was later produced before the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Chandauli, and brought to Bhubaneswar on a transit remand.

According to the FIR regis-

tered on May 22 at the Cyber Crime police station in Bhubaneswar, the complainant, Mahesh Kumar Singh, had been searching online for a steel vendor and came across a toll-free number claiming to be associated with Jindal Steel. He was subsequently connected to a person posing as a company sales ex-

The fraudster convinced Singh to place an order for TMT steel and provided him with a forged proforma invoice featuring the Jindal Steel logo, design, and letterhead to appear genuine. Trusting the documents, Singh made two payments, Rs 1,25,300 via IMPS and Rs 10 lakh via NEFT/RTGS to an Indian Overseas Bank account controlled by the accused.

Police said the bank account used in the crime was registered in the name of Pradum Kumar. During the arrest, a mobile phone allegedly used in the scam was seized from his possession.

Police revealed that the accused and his accomplices have been targeting people by impersonating executives of reputed companies like Jindal Steel. They contact potential victims with fake business proposals, send forged invoices using company branding, and convince them to transfer large sums of money to bank accounts actually controlled by

BJD to highlight govt failures with events in Jajpur, Puri

As the BJP prepares to mark the first anniversary of its government in Odisha with State-wide events, the Biju Janata Dal (BJD) has announced programmes to expose the government's "failures and betrayal" of women, youth and students.

Addressing a press meet here, senior BJD leaders Pramila Mallik and Sanjay Das Burma said the party would organise a mega women's convention in Jajpur on June 13 and a youth-student convention in Puri on

Mallik criticised the BJP for sidelining key empowerment schemes like Mission Shakti, which had benefitted over 70 lakh women during the BJD regime through interest-free loans and work opportunities. She said the BJP had failed to offer dignity or support to women and called the Subhadra Yojana a "broken promise" as it now offers Rs 50,000 over five years instead

Guv stresses anaemia, vision care for women, kids

Governor Dr Hari Babu Kambhampati on Tuesday stressed the urgent need to address rising cases of anaemia and vision problems among women and school children during his visit to the State Women and Children's Hospital in Bhubaneswar.

Expressing concern over the growing prevalence of anaemia among women and adolescent girls, the Governor recommended inclusion of nutritious food items like carrot-beetroot juice and chikki in daily diets to boost hemoglobin levels. He called for regular health checkups and further scientific testing to assess the benefits of such dietary supplements.

Highlighting vision-related issues among school children, the Governor suggested that at least one teacher in every school be trained to identify early signs of eye problems. He assured that the matter would be discussed with the concerned departments for neces-

During his visit, the Gover-



nor reviewed several facilities within the hospital premises, including the Malati Choudhury residence, Recipe and Toyathon demonstration units, Model Anganwadi Centre, Yoga Centre and Library. Interacting with trainees, he enquired about their awareness of the training modules, facilities and government welfare schemes.

HITTING THE BULL'S EYE

A single year of ruling not enough to assess a govt

he BJP got a default victory only because the BJD guys, under Naveen Patnaik's stewardship, erred on the most critical fronts. The masses of Odisha had truly loved Naveen because of his outwardly simple lifestyle and reticence. He never ever spoke a bitter word even against his sworn political detractors and opponents. Besides, he proved quite at the beginning he was a no-nonsense leader on issues of corruption and loose character among his colleagues no matter how senior or experienced one was. Thus, Naveen became a saviour, a messiah and a demigod all rolled into one in the first two or three years as Chief Minister. The rest is known history.

Naveen's first mentor Pyari Mohan Mohapatra was ruling Odisha, leaving Naveen free to enjoy life as a de jure boss. The arrangement suited both fine. Pyari had strengthened the BJD so well with financial and party discipline that the people voted Naveen back to power successively four times in a row. After Pyari was discarded, a

young bureaucrat took over and he became the de facto boss just after the fifth massive victory in 2019. Naveen was completely relaxed to be left alone at home or elsewhere. The Congress had disintegrated into thin air and the upcoming BJP had no strength to compete when Naveen's popularity had gone beyond the skies.

In 2020, Covid swept across the world and proved to be a political game-changerin Odisha. Naveen,

to remain safe, went into hiding. He was not to be publicly available ever again. The trusted young bureaucrat ran the State fairly well mostly as the political crooks were kept at bay. Incredible public goods came in place. Several pro-poor schemes and programmes were taken up successfully. A most wonderful health insurance scheme helped the poor communities like never before. Bhubaneswar became the sports capital of India as the bureaucrat himself was a born sportsman. The Jagannatha Temple site in Puri rivalled the Vatican City and more locations in India and abroad. The Cuttack bus terminal, the magically transformed Taldanda canal and the SCB Medical College expansion are a few of the projects that stand testimony to the 'out-of-the-box' thinking, planning and successful implantation by the bureaucrat, who made Naveen popular. The pandemic management was also remarkable. The Naveen administration had supplied oxygen to many starved States to save count-

Everything was hunky-dory until Covid was gone. The highly efficient, workaholic bureaucrat delivering amazingly was kept over-inflated by a few sycophants so much as to believe he was irreplaceable and the only one eligible to succeed the boss. As the 2024 elections were fast approaching, Naveen committed a grave mistake by forcing the administrator to take total command and make whirlwind campaign trips all over the State. That was the first time the masses began suspecting Naveen was incapacitated. To add to the BJD's woe, the rank politicians including electoral candidates were ignored as if they never existed. Between the second half of 2023 and May 2024 when the elections were over, the BJD's publicity spending was enormous. More than anything else, the 'selfpraise' campaign contents were so brazenly horrific that people decided to discard the Naveen team. The people took Naveen for a living vegetable. History was made when Naveen lost like a despised

street political creature at the hands of a nondescript fellow who was out of jail on bail. The BIP thus won by default, not certainly by

All the same, the BJP administration under the accidental Chief Minister Mohan Majhi is just not doing well. The saffron gang has not kept any of the big election promises. The local BJP guys have become so extortionate and devilish that the people have begun missing the Naveen administration much sooner than ever imagined.

Majhi is doubtlessly a perfect gentleman. But he has no control over his colleagues. Some of the ministers holding milch cow portfolios are plain daylight robbers. The Naveen administration was routinely rolling out red carpets to any business house setting up shop with impressive employment potential. But many of the Majhi team members are callous, unscrupulous and inconsiderate. Incidentally, a Mumbai-based industrialist had taken over an abandoned, defunct granite tile unit with a small

quarry when all granite units in Odisha had failed and closed down due to lack of demand and funding support. This revamped unit at huge cost and with big employment potential, even after being cleared by the highest administrative machinery, is still waiting for routine endorsement by the minister for no reason or rhyme. Some party insiders keep spreading the rumour that a few ministers and legislators are so lowly and dishonest as to demand bribe money for smallest of jobs because they have spent big amount of money to win elections. Maybe, CM Majhi has no courage to punish these colleagues as he is not as absolutely independent as Naveen used to be.

There is quite much public displeasure about the Majhi government celebrating the first year of successful ruling. Just a single year of ruling is not exactly good enough a period to assess any government perfectly. Yet, there is big publicity about some make-believe great deeds by Majhi. Majhi's government machinery has no moral right to make claims of great achievements which have not happened at all. People have thoroughly disliked the Majhi job of changing the names of schemes or services as if taking revenge. Similarly, they have flayed Majhi for changing the colour of buses and other things that the BJD had created or brought in place. All said, it is also unwise to conclude that the Majhi government is splurging money on the first anniversary celebrations. There hasn't been any independent audit or Comptroller & Auditor General report yet verifying how much the BJP has spent on government communication or self-promotion since coming to

"Extreme heat can be risky. Stay indoors during peak hours, eat lower-calorie food, drink safe fluids, and never leave kids or pets in parked cars," the Health Ministry, said in a post on social media platform X. "Call 108/102 if someone shows signs of heatstroke," it added.

To protect from the heat, the IMD urged citizens to wear lightweight, loose-fitting, and light-coloured clothing. Cover your head using a hat, umbrella, towel, and drink water frequent-

At 5:30 pm, Ayanagar was the hottest at 45.0 degrees Celsius, followed by Palam at 44.5 degrees Celsius, Ridge at 43.6 degrees

ailway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw on Ranway Minister Asiawah Charles Wednesday suspended four officials and ordered an inquiry following the controversy after a train with dilapidated and dirty coaches was provided to ferry Border Security Force (BSF) personnel from Tripura for deployment during the Amarnath Yatra in Kashmir. Three senior section engineers and a coaching depot officer of Alipurduar Rail Division have been suspended by the Railway Minister, the press note from the Railway Ministry said. The ministry said that a special train with all facilities has been arranged for smooth and comfortable movement of the security personnel.

About 1,200 BSF troops drawn from 13 companies were scheduled to board a special train on June 6 for Jammu Tawi from Udaipur in Tripura. The train had to make a few stops in between and collect troops from four locations in Tripura, Assam and

Integrated defence chief highlights Chinese space threats

In his address at a seminar here, Air Marshal Dixit also said Chinese satellites have recently demonstrated "sophisticated 'dog-fighting' manouvres" in low earth orbits. He was speaking on 'Surveillance and Electro-optics' at the event hosted by think-tank CAPS (Centre for Air Power Studies) and Indian Military Reviews (IMR) at Subroto Park.

"They have evolved from a kill chain to a kill mesh, an integrated network that seamlessly interweaves ISR satellites with weapon systems," he added.

Puri deities bathe in sacred ritual of Snana Purnima

Amid Snana Purnima festivities Sevayat murdered in broad daylight in Puri

▲ he spiritual sanctity of Snana Purnima was jolted on Wednesday when senior Jagannath Temple servitor Jagannath Dikshit was brutally murdered in broad daylight at Rabenia Chowk in Goudia Sahi under the Town police station in Puri.

The incident occurred despite elaborate security arrangements in place for the annual festival, including the deployment of over 70 platoons of police, anti-terror squads and AI-powered surveillance cameras.

Puri SP Vinit Agarwal confirmed that preliminary investigation points to previous enmity as the motive. "We are scanning CCTV footage and gathering evidence. A special team has been formed to track the absconding accused," he said. Senior officers, including Additional SP Gokul Ranjan Das, are personally overseeing the investigation.

According to police sources, fellow sevayat Narayan Pattajoshi has been named the prime suspect and is currently on the run. A manhunt has been launched across the town with checkpoints and surveillance intensified.

The murder occurred during peak ritual hours as thousands of devotees gathered to witness the ceremonial bathing of the deities at the Snana Mandap.

The incident has raised serious concerns over security lapses during major temple events and the internal discord among sections of servitors. Further updates from the police are awaited as the probe continues.

Online game claimed yet another life here in Kendrapada district and this time, it's a 38-year-old BSF iawan of Pahana village under Kudanagari police station lim-

The victim committed suicide by hanging himself, after he lost a huge amount to an online game.

The deceased, identified as Suryakanta Das, was working as a BSF jawan in Kolkata. He got addicted to online games two years ago without the

knowledge of his family. He used to play games on



borrowing money from his father, relatives and friends. When the matter came to the notice of the family members and his wife, they restricted him from playing online games, but the latter could hardly help falling to the bait.

In two years, Suryakanta lost around Rs 30 lakh by playing online games and used to remain upset most often at his BSF camp in Kolkota. On last Saturday, losing mental balance, Suryakanta made a video call to his family members and slit his hand.

He on Sunday also talked to his wife and family members and commit suicide by hanging himself. He was rushed to BSF camp medical in a critical condition, but the doctor declared him dead.

plots divided among relatives will no longer require adherence to stringent layout regulations. The amendment also exempts owners from reserving additional open space for plot extensions if the original layout has already received

plot sale, subdivision rules Agricultural landowners also gain relief, as agricultural plots will continue to remain exempt from subdivision regulations, helping maintain their rural or farming status without being subjected to urban planning norms.

The government has introduced a legalisation mechanism for plots that were split without prior approval. To regularise such subdivisions, owners must ensure proper road access and pay requisite fees unless exempted under designated

In a step toward transparency, benchmark land value assessments for fee calculation will now be accessible online. The revised structure aims to make the valuation process more consistent and user-friendly.

Industrial plots located outside urban limits must now ensure a minimum access road width of six meters. However, developments that occurred before 2020 are exempt from this condition.

To encourage affordable housing, the amendment

mandates that large landowners earmark 10% to 20% of their land for smaller residential plots, promoting inclusive growth and access to housing for economically weaker sections. According to planning of-

ficials, the revised regulations are expected to reduce registration backlogs, speed up approval processes and encourage well-planned urban expansion. Legal experts and developers have welcomed the move, noting that it balances flexibility with essential planning norms.

Diarrhoea in Jajpur: 2 die; 500 affected

Cause is food poisoning PNS
Jaipur

he diarrhoea outbreak situation in Jajpur district remains grim as two persons lost their lives while over 500 have been affected till now.

Director of Public Health Dr Nilakantha Mishra confirmed that food poisoning is the cause of the diarrhoea outbreak

The worst-hit areas include Dharamsala, Danagadi, and Korei blocks, where local hospitals are overwhelmed by the sudden spike in patients showing gastrointestinal symptoms. District officials confirmed that over 100 patients are under treatment at the District Headquarters Hospital (DHH) alone with more admitted across Korei, Dharamsala, and Danagadi hospitals.



Eleven critically ill patients were shifted from Jajpur Road Medical to the DHH and SCB Medical College Hospital in Cuttack for advanced care. Reports said that the diarrhea cases reportedly began two days ago, but the exact cause of the outbreak remains unconfirmed. In view of the escalated health crisis, a medical team from Bhubaneswar has been dispatched to investigate,

alongside local health authorities.

Meanwhile, Health Secretary Ashwathy S stated that a medical team has already reached the affected site and submitted a preliminary report. "A team of doctors, microbiologists and food safety officers is currently investigating the cause behind the spread. An additional medical team is being dispatched to support treatment efforts while public health officials are closely monitoring the situation," Ashwathy said.

He added that discussions are underway with the Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water Departments and directives have been issued to clean all drinking water sources in the area. The actual number of casualties would be confirmed after the team submits its report. Dharamsala block continues to witness the highest number of cases.

Nearly 150 patients have received treatment at the local Community Health Centre since Monday with around 30 still undergoing care, said reports. A State-level medical team has arrived in the district and is conducting house-tohouse surveys in affected villages. The team is meeting the families of patients and collecting water and stool samples to help determine the outbreak's source.

Jajpur Collector P Anwesha Reddy also visited the concerned hospitals in Jajpur Road and Danagadi, reviewed medical preparedness and appealed to the public to only consume boiled or disinfected water. "An elderly patient has died, and we are awaiting the medical report to determine if it was diarrhoea-related," she

Severe shortage of engineers hits BeMC projects

Committee seeks urgent govt action RAJEEV RATHAN ■ Brahmapur

The Berhampur Municipal Corporation (BeMC), one of the oldest urban bodies in Odisha, is reportedly grappling with severe administrative and technical deficiencies, primarily due to the absence of adequate professional engineers. This has severely impacted timely implementation of development projects and delivery of essential urban infrastructure.

Raising the issue, Milita Kriyanusthan Committee president Sanjeeb Kumar Patnaik alleged that despite overseeing 42 wards and managing a growing number of civic schemes, the BeMC currently operates with only one engineer. From roads and drains to buildings, vending

zones, and market complexes, all Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) and cost estimations are being handled by a single professional.

"This overdependence has led to delays, repeated technical flaws, inflated estimates and rejections from higher authorities. Projects are caught in an endless loop of revision and resubmission, wasting both time and public funds," Patnaik said. Sources said several DPRs

have had to be reworked due to major discrepancies between estimated costs and actual project requirements. Often, the core purpose of the projects becomes irrelevant due to these delays. Public resentment is reportedly growing over the BeMC's inefficiency and lack of transparency in project execution.

Patnaik noted that urban

the state have at least three to four qualified engineers on staff to ensure streamlined project planning. "It is unfortunate that Brahmapur as a corporation, despite its historical and strategic importance, has been left to function with such skeletal technical support," he remarked.

As the civic body expands to absorb nearby areas and aims to emerge as a full-fledged municipal corporation, Patnaik urged the State Government, local MLAs, MPs and the Mayor to immediately address the staffing crisis. He demanded urgent appointment of qualified experts to bring professionalism, transparency and efficiency to the BeMC's functioning.

He added that the people of Brahmapur expect action, not excuses, to ensure that the city's growth is not derailed.

Activists slam crackdown on anti-mining protesters

Several civil society leaders, advocates and rights activists on Tuesday strongly condemned the actions of the Ravagada district administration including the detention of noted environmentalist Medha Patkar and others on the World Environment Day. They termed the crackdown as an attack on Constitutional rights and grassroots resistance to Vedanta's proposed bauxite mining project in the Sijimali hills of south Odisha. In a joint statement, the sig-

natories demanded immediate withdrawal of the prohibitory order issued under the BNSS by the Rayagada Collector on June 4. The order barred 24 individuals from entering the district for two months without prior notice or hearing. The list reportedly includes a serving IRS officer posted in Assam, raising concerns about the legality and motive behind the directive.

Medha Patkar, along with farmer leaders Lingaraj and Hara Bania and activist Narendra Mohanty, was detained at the Rayagada railway station while on her way to attend a meeting organised by the Maa Maati Mali Surakshya Manch in Sunger village. The meeting was aimed at observing the World Environment Day and mobilising opposition to the mining project. Police later sent the group back to Brahmapur under custody.

Activists alleged that the State is advancing land acquisition for the mining project without forest clearance or adherence to tribal rights. They called for a complete halt to the process, withdrawal of criminal cases and dialogue with affected communities, warning of irreversible ecological and social harm in Scheduled Areas.

Congress seeks Parliament debate on post-Pahalgam security

Congress on Wednesday asked whether Prime Minister Narendra Modi, having met the members of the seven parliamentary delegations that were sent abroad, will now agree to have a full debate in the monsoon session of Parliament on the country's post-Pahalgam security and foreign policy challenges.

The opposition party also asked whether the PM will at least chair a meeting or a set of meetings of leaders of all political parties and take them into confidence on India's future strategy vis-a-vis both China and Pakistan.

Modi on Tuesday hosted the members of the multi-party delegations, comprising parliamentarians and former diplomats, who travelled to various world capitals over the past few weeks to convey India's message on the need to eradicate the menace of terrorism following the Pahalgam attack and Operation Sindoor. In a social media post, Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh said now that the PM has himself met with the members of the seven parliamentary delegations that had been sent to var-

ious countries, will he at least now chair a meeting or a set of meetings of leaders of all political parties and take them into confidence on India's future strategy vis-a-vis both China and Pakistan and the strategic implications of the CDS' revelations in Singapore.

His remarks were in reference to the comments made by Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) Gen Anil Chauhan in Singapore recently that India rectified tactics and hit deep

inside Pakistani territory after suffering losses of aircraft in the recent military clashes with Pakistan. He had also dismissed as "absolutely incorrect" Islamabad's claim of downing six Indian jets. Ramesh also asked if the PM will agree to have a full debate in the forthcoming monsoon session of Parliament on the country's post-Pahalgam security and foreign policy challenges, since the request of the INDIA bloc

been most unfortunately rejected. He further asked whether the PM will redouble efforts to bring the Pahalgam terrorists, who were reportedly involved in three earlier terror attacks in Poonch (December 2023), and Gagangir and Gulmarg (2024), to justice. Ramesh also asked whether a group of experts like the Kargil Review Committee, which was chaired by the External Affairs Minister S' Jaishankar's father K Subrahmanyam, will be set up

to analyse Operation Sindoor in detail and give its recommendations on the future of warfare, including emerging military platforms and technologies, and building national capacities for strategic communications in

"Will the report — after suitable redactions — be placed in Parliament like the report of the Kargil Review Committee was in Feb 2000?" Ramesh said.

Later, he also asked whether the prime minister will allow two full days of discussion on China and Pakistan and give a clarification on US President Donald Trump's repeated claims about brokering a ceasefire between India and Pakistan.

The Government had sent the multi-party delegations to convey a message of national unity in the fight against terrorism, with the likes of Congress MP Shashi Tharoor and AIMIM MP Asaduddin Owaisi joining the ruling alliance members in championing the Indian cause abroad.

Prominent former parliamentarians in the delegations included ex-Union ministers Ghulam Nabi Azad and Salman Khurshid. The Congress has also been urging the Government to clarify Trump's ceasefire claims, and object to his hyphenation of India and

Constitution is quiet revolution empowering marginalised: CJI

hief Justice of India (CJI) BR Gavai has /described Constitution as a "quiet revolution etched in ink" and a transformative force that not only guarantees rights but actively uplifts the historically oppressed.

Speaking at the Oxford Union in London on the theme 'From Representation to Realisation: Embodying the Constitution's Promise' on Tuesday, the CJI, the second Dalit and the first Buddhist to hold India's highest judicial office, highlighted the positive impact of the Constitution on marginalised communities and gave his example to drive home the point.

"Many decades ago, millions of citizens of India were called 'untouchables'. They were told they were impure. They were told that they did not belong. They were told that they could not speak for themselves. But here we are today, where a person belonging to those very people is speaking openly, as the holder of the highest office in the judiciary of the country," the CJI said. He said the Constitution told the citizens that "they belong, that they can speak for themselves, and that they have an equal place

in every sphere of society and

"At the Oxford Union today, I stand before you to say (that) for India's most vulnerable citizens, the Constitution is not merely a legal charter or a political framework, it is a feeling, a lifeline, a quiet revolution etched in ink. In my own journey, from a municipal school to the office of the Chief Justice of India, it has been a guiding force," he said.

He said India's Constitution was not merely a legal framework but a social and moral document crafted amidst deep inequality.

Its drafters, he noted, included representatives from some of the most marginalised communities in India -Dalits, Adivasis, women, religious minorities, persons with disabilities and even those formerly labelled "criminal

"The Constitution is a social document, one that does not avert its gaze from the brutal truths of caste, poverty, exclusion, and injustice. It does not pretend that all are equal in a land scarred by deep inequality. Instead, it dares to intervene, to rewrite the script, to recalibrate power and to

restore dignity," he said.
The CJI said the Constitution carries within it the "heartbeat of those who were never meant to be heard. and the vision of a country where equality is not just promised, but pursued".

"It compels the State not only to protect rights but to actively uplift, to affirm, to repair," he added.

Referring to BR Ambedkar's legacy, the CJI said he was a visionary who transformed his lived experience of caste discrimination into a global understanding of justice.

XFG COVID variant shows high immune escape: **Experts**

mergence of the new XFG variant of the virus that causes COVID-19 is part of SARS-CoV-2's natural evolution, said Dr Balram Bhargava, former Director General of the Indian Council for Medical Research, amidst India recording over 200 cases linked to the variant.

Dr Bhargava was part of the team at the forefront of managing the country response to the COVID-19 pandemic. "The emergence of the XFG variant is part of the SARS-CoV-2 virus's natural evolution," he said.

His statement comes as India's active COVID-19 cases crossed 7,000 as of June 11, with over 300 added in the last 24 hours and six deaths recorded in the same period, data from the Union Health Ministry shows.

According to the latest data from the Indian SARS-CoV-2 Genomics Consortium (INSACOG), 206 cases have been linked to XFG variant, with the highest count of 89 infections coming from Maharashtra, followed by West Bengal reporting 49.

Dr Bhargava said the XFG variant of SARS-CoV-2 (which causes COVID-19) carries mutations which may improve its ability of binding to human cells and bypassing immune defences. "Early reports suggest that the variant has high immune escape potential, but there is no current evidence to indicate (an) increased severity (of disease)," he said.

NMC proposes three-year rotatory headship in medical colleges

⊣he National Medical Commission (NMC) has proposed introducing three-year rotatory headship for departments in medical colleges among eligible faculty members who qualify for promotion based on seniority and possession of a postgraduate medical degree.

Suggesting draft amendments to the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations (PGMER) 2023, the NMC has also proposed including MS (Traumatology and Surgery) as a feeder broad specialty qualification for several super-specialty courses, such as MCh in Neurosurgery, MCh in Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, and other MCh programmes.

The draft amendments have been published in the official gazette on May 30 and the NMC has invited feedback

from stakeholders such as from students, faculty, and the medical community on the changes. Under the existing 2023 regulations, each department is led by a professor appointed as the head of department (HoD).

The post of the Head of Department will be rotated every three-years amongst professors and associate professors (who are eligible to become professor) who hold medical postgraduate degree, based on seniority in the department," the NMC said in the proposal. This proposal comes amid

demands from faculty associations of several medical colleges and academic bodies for more equitable administrative structures. This move aims to bring in fairness and provide opportunities for ounger and qualified faculty to take on leadership roles. In April, the Faculty

Association of AIIMS

(FAIMS), Delhi, and the Faculty Association of PGI Chandigarh had jointly expressed deep concern over the continued delay in implementing the long-standing policy of rotatory headship in these premier institutions.

A General Body Meeting of FAIMS was held on April 16 followed by the General Body Meeting of the PGI Chandigarh Faculty Association on April 17. "Both the bodies unanimously voiced that the rotatory headship system, along with the collegium system, is essential for promoting a fair, transparent and democratic governance structure within their institutions," the two bodies had said in a joint statement. In 2023, the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare formally communicated that the rotatory neadship policy would be implemented in AIIMS, Delĥi and PGI Chandigarh from June 2024.

Axiom-4 mission put off

he Axiom-4 mission, which was scheduled to carry Indian astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla and three others to the International Space Station on Tuesday, was put off again to fix a leak in the SpaceX's Falcon-9 rocket.

SpaceX announced that it was "standing down" from the Falcon-9 launch to allow time for repairs after a post-static inspection of the rocket's boosters identified a liquid oxygen

"Once complete and pending Range availability, we will share a new launch date," SpaceX said

ISRO Chairman Narayanan said the liquid oxygen leak was detected in the propulsion bay during a sevensecond hot test on the launch pad. The hot test was to validate the performance of the booster stage of Falcon-9 launch vehicle. "The ISRO team discussed with experts at Axiom and SpaceX and it was decided that the leak would be fixed and necessary validation tests conducted before clearing for the launch," Narayanan said. Hence, the Axiom-4 launch

slated on June 11, 2025 to send the first Indian Gaganyatri to the International Space Station stands postponed, the ISRO chairman said. Axiom Space spokesperson said that during the post-static fire investigation of the Falcon-9 booster that supports

Rahul writes to PM, flags delay in scholarships for marginalised students

eader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul ■Gandhi has written to Prime Minister Narendra Modi flagging the "deplorable" conditions in residential hostels for Dalit, ST, EBC, OBC and minority students and the delay in post-matric scholarships for those from marginalised communities.

In his letter to Modi, Rahul Gandhi urged the PM to resolve these two critical issues which he said hinder education opportunities for the 90 per cent of students who are from marginalised communi-"Firstly, the conditions in

residential hostels for students from Dalit, ST, EBC, OBC and minority communities are deplorable. During a recent visit to Ambedkar Hostel in Darbhanga, Bihar, students complained about single rooms which 6-7 students were forced to share, unhygienic toilets, unsafe drinking water, lack of mess facilities, and no access to libraries or the internet," the Congress leader said. "Secondly, post-matric scholarships for students from marginalised communities are

plagued by delays and failures,"

example of Bihar where he claimed the scholarship portal was non-functional for three years and no student received a scholarship in 2021-22.

"Even thereafter, the number of Dalit students receiving scholarships fell by nearly half, from 1.36 lakh in FY23 to 0.69 lakh in FY24. Students further complain that the scholarship amounts are insultingly low," Gandhi said in his letter to Modi dated June 10.

"While I have cited examples from Bihar, these failures are widespread across the country. I urge the government to immediately take two

Gandhi said and cited the actions to remedy these failures," he said. Gandhi called for an audit of

every hostel for students from Dalit, Scheduled Tribes (ST), **Economically Backward Class** (EBC), Other Backward Classes (OBC) and minority communities to ensure good infrastructure, sanitation, food and academic facilities; and allocate adequate funds to address deficiencies. He also appealed for dis-

bursement of post-matric scholarships on time, increasing scholarship amounts, and improving execution by working closely with state govern-

"I am sure you agree that India cannot progress unless youth from marginalised communities progress. I look forward to your positive response," Gandhi said in his letter to Modi. The issues were also raised

at a joint press conference by Congress' SC department chief Rajendra Pal Gautam, Adivasi Congress chief Vikrant Bhuria and AICC NSUI in-charge Kanhaiya Kumar at the Congress' Indira Bhawan headquarters.

Kumar said Rahul Gandhi is continuously meeting students, employees and teachers from Dalit, backward, tribal, extremely backward and minority classes. "Whenever we meet students from these classes, the first thing they say is that we

A diplomatic victory over Pakistan

The All party delegations return home after presenting Indian side of the story of Operation Sindoor

■he return of the high-profile, multi-party Indian parliamentary delegation, led by Congress MP Shashi Tharoor, marks the successful conclusion of a strategically significant five-nation diplomatic tour. The delegation was part of a larger Indian diplomatic initiative launched in the aftermath of the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack and prompted India's robust counter-response - Operation Sindoor. The delegation's objective was twofold: to present a unified Indian stance on cross-border terrorism and to directly counter Pakistan's international narrative. By all accounts, the mission has been a resounding success. The delegation's mandate was to explain the rationale behind Operation Sindoor - a series of precision strikes conducted by India on terror infrastructure across the border - and to build international support by underscoring Pakistan's long-standing complicity in cross-border terrorism. The presence of MPs from across the political spectrum – including leaders from the BJP. Congress, Shiv Sena, TDP, and JMM - signalled a powerful message: India is united on matters of national security. This bipartisan unity was crucial in demonstrating that India's foreign policy and its fight against terrorism transcend party lines.

The five-nation itinerary included Guyana, Panama, Colombia, Brazil, and finally the United States - a diverse mix of emerging powers and global influencers. Over three weeks, the delegation engaged in over a hundred high-level meetings with presidents, prime ministers, vice presidents, lawmakers, policy experts, think tanks, journalists, and members of the Indian diaspora.

In Washington DC, the team held crucial discussions on Capitol Hill, where lawmakers not only echoed India's concerns but also praised the country's restraint in its military response. Perhaps the most significant strategic gain came in the arena of perception. Pakistan's attempts to portray itself as a victim of terrorism - even as its territory shelters terror outfits - were met with scepticism and, in many cases, outright rejection by international stakeholders. Apart from exposing Pakistan's complicity, the tour generated substantial goodwill for India. India's message was not merely one of retaliation, but of restraint, resolution, and responsibility. The timing, co-ordination, and unity behind the diplomatic push have added a new layer of credibility to India's global image - not only as a regional power but as a mature democracy tackling the complex issue of terrorism within the bounds of international law.

As the delegation returns home. India can count the tour as a diplomatic victory on multiple fronts - exposing Pakistan's faltering narrative, reinforcing international support, and affirming India's stature as a responsible global actor. In a world where perception often rivals facts, this all-party effort has served its purpose - not only in countering propaganda but in projecting India's strategic maturity and political unity. With more such outreach initiatives planned as part of India's 33-capital diplomatic effort, this tour sets a benchmark in bipartisan foreign policy action and international strategic messaging.

Highways to prosperity and growth

With game-changing projects like Greenfield expressways, aerial buses, and the Gati Shakti platform, the Modi Government is rewriting the narrative of development — one road at a time

hen Narendra Modi took oath as India's Prime Minister in 2014, the BJP-led Central Government prioritised infrastructure development above all else from that very moment. In this direction, the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways became the focal point of infrastructure growth.

Under Modi's leadership, this Ministry has not only accelerated the country's economic development but has also given it a new dimension over the 11 years since 2014. The construction of highways — both completed and upcoming — has played a significant role in changing the trajectory of the country's growth.

Efficient highways, waterways, and railways can reduce logistics costs and boost the economy. Prime Minister Narendra Modi dreams of making India a 'Vishwaguru' (World Leader). India has emerged as the world's third-largest economy and a \$5 trillion economy.

To fulfil this dream, we need to increase exports, which will, in turn, boost growth in agriculture, services, and industrial sectors. In the past 11 years, the roads built have already reduced our logistics costs from 16 per cent to 10 per cent, and next year, we aim to bring it down further to 9 per cent. This will enhance our exports, make us more competitive, and help India advance more powerfully toward becoming a 'Vishwaguru'.

The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways is building 25 new Greenfield Express Highways across the country. Over 3,000 km of highways are also being built to connect ports and promote religious tourism. The Government's efforts to boost religious tourism are also taking shape. The Buddhist Circuit project, completed at a cost of ₹22,000 crore, has significantly increased the number of tourists visiting the birthplace of Lord Buddha from South Asia, Indonesia, Malaysia, China, Singapore, and Japan.

Simultaneously, the number of pilgrims visiting the Char Dham sites — Badrinath, Kedarnath, Gangotri, and Yamunotri — has tripled. A ropeway worth ₹12,000 crore is being constructed to connect Kedarnath. About 90 per cent of the work on the road linking Kailash Mansarovar in Uttarakhand to Pithoragarh has been completed. In India, particularly in the national capital, the dream of 'flying buses' is on the verge of becoming a reality.

This includes aerial buses, flash-charging electric buses, and double-decker flying buses for hilly regions. The aerial bus service from Dhaula Kuan in Delhi to Manesar, based on a skyway system, is almost in its numerous job opportunities. Here are some



final stages. I am confident that this experiment will be crucial in resolving the persistent traffic congestion on this special route. Nagpur will soon see the launch of the first flash-charging electric bus. It will have 135 seats, executive class, front TV screens, and

bus hostesses like air hostesses. This bus will have a maximum speed of 120 km/h and will stop every 40 km for just 30 seconds to fully charge before resuming its journey. Such work cannot be

achieved by merely sitting in an office preparing DPRs — it requires wholehearted effort! A recent study by IIM-Bangalore on road construction revealed that

every ₹1 spent on National Highway (NH) construction has led to a ₹3.21 increase in India's GDP, a multiplier effect of 3.2 times. The work done by the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways has not only boosted economic activity but also created

figures worth noting: In 2014, India had only 91,000 km of national highways. By 2024, this network has expanded by nearly 60 per cent to 1.46 lakh km. The daily pace of road construction has

increased from 12 km/day to 28-30 km/day. Under the ambitious ₹5.35 lakh crore Bharatmala project, the target is to build 65,000 km of roads, including economic corridors, international border roads, and border area connectivity.

Calls for parliament debate

The question is arising whether Prime Minister Narendra Modi, having met the members of the seven parliamentary delegations that were sent abroad, will agree to have a full debate in the Monsoon Session of Parliament on the country's post-Pahalgam security and foreign policy

INTERNAL DISPLACEMENT: AN ISSUE THAT NEEDS URGENT ATTENTION

e are confronted by innumerable challenges on the local, internal and external fronts that every nation finds it difficult to ascertain what its priorities should be. However, internal enemies are difficult to conquer as policies and laws are more focused on immigration and the refugee problem, leading to the neglect of internal displacements caused by nature's fury.

The recent report published by the Geneva-based Internal Displacement Monitoring Centre recorded that 32.3 million Indians faced the threat of internal displacement on account of natural disasters, primarily due to floods and storms, between 2015 and 2024. The global scenario is even more grim as 210 countries registered 264.8 million forced movements, with East Asia and South Asia being the most adversely affected during the period.

It also highlights that about 90 per cent of global displacement is the outcome of floods and storms, which

must stir nations into action. China, the Philippines, and India (5.4 million) are the leading countries in terms of domestic displacements. It is worth pondering over the state of legal procedures, which lack teeth and enforcement.

The biggest obstacle is global indifference when it comes to tackling the myriad aspects of climate change, as autocratic or populist Governments are hell-bent on dismantling frameworks meant to mitigate climate change. The Paris climate conference of 2015,

aimed at reducing global temperatures, with targeted and time-bound measures agreed upon by countries, and meeting the Agenda for Sustainable Development by 2030, can only be achieved if all countries take equal responsibilities and work for the betterment of human society by taking concrete steps. From Cannes to Berlin, Venice to IFFI, Locarno to Sundance, film festivals have evolved into sophisticated arenas that redefine cinematic expression.



RBI shields India from global turbulence, spur domestic growth

In an assertive policy pivot aimed at shielding the Indian economy from both internal slowdown and external headwinds, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) repo and Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) cut decisions reflect an urgency to fortify domestic demand and build monetary buffers ahead of any external shocks.

The repo rate was cut by 50 basis points to 5.40 per cent and slashing the CRR by 100 basis points, releasing a substantial ₹2.5 lakh crore in systemic liquidity. This move goes far beyond textbook monetary easing — it's a calculated shift toward growth insulation, driven in part by global trade volatility, slowing capital flows, and protectionist rhetoric resurging from the West, especially from the United States. The RBI is shifting its dependence on foreign portfolios to domestic investment.

The RBI's sweeping rate and CRR cuts are not just

a response to slowing growth — they are a strategic counter to global turbulence. As trade dynamics harden and election rhetoric in the U.S. turns more inward — looking, India is sending a clear signal: we'll build our growth engines at home, and we won't wait for the world to stabilise.

Banks and non-banking finance companies (NBFCs) are now better placed to grow loan books despite global capital uncertainty. The ₹2.5 lakh crore liquidity injection, through CRR cut, is a strategic play to strengthen domestic credit capacity, in case foreign investment inflows taper due to U.S.-centric policy shifts. In a world potentially heading toward deglobalisation 2.0, the RBI is quietly laying the foundations for an India that is credit — rich, demand-driven, and less vulnerable to foreign tantrums.

This is crucial for raising industrial production. In April 2025, IIP slowed to 2.7 per cent against 3 per cent growth in March and 5.2 per cent in April 2024. The growth was primarily driven by a 3.4 per cent rise in the manufacturing sector. The core sector, which comprises eight key industries, grew by 0.5 per cent in April 2025, according to the National Statistics Office.

While headline inflation has remained within the RBI's comfort band of around 4 per cent, the lurking risk of imported inflation — rises to 31.1 per cent in February 2025 from 1.31 per cent in June 2024 — stemming from global prices, shipping costs, geopolitical instability, and currency value decline, continues to be a concern. The RBI appears to have weighed these risks but is now betting on economic expansion as the bigger imperative, especially as private investment and consumer demand remain below pre-pandemic trajectories.

Financial markets immediately responded to the RBI's policy announcement with optimism. Sectors such as real estate, banking, automobiles, and financial services rallied. This is preceded by a severe fall in the stock markets all through May and before, causing severe losses.



The value of currency in circulation was around ₹16.5 lakh crore in November 2016. It has risen to ₹38.35 lakh crore on May 30, 2025, up from ₹34.70 lakh crore on September 6, 2024, rising 0.2 per cent a week or 7.4 per cent in a year.

The overall reserve money (RM) rose

The overall reserve money (RM) rose by 0.4 per cent on the week, to ₹49.62 lakh crore. The RM, the physical cash held by the public, including banknotes and coins as well as the CRR and other banks' deposits with RBI play a crucial role in regulating the money supply and influencing economic activity. It's the starting point for the money creation process, where banks can create more money through lending. A more aggressive Trump-driven trade stance, if it materialises, could raise the cost of imports and dent

export competitiveness — just as India is trying to recover its industrial mojo. India is hurrying through deals for more imports from the US, including shale oil adding to further costs.

The rate cut is also likely to spur affordable housing uptake, shielding the sector from any fallout in foreign investment or imported material cost spikes. Stocks such as Godrej Properties, DLF, and Kolte-Patil Developers surged after the policy, buoyed by hopes of a demand revival and better liquidity for developers.

Steeke like HDEC Pank and Pairi Fincary.

Stocks like HDFC Bank and Bajaj Finserv jumped, reflecting optimism around stronger credit demand and a proactive central bank. The Nifty Financial Services index rose nearly 2 per cent, reflecting investor belief that India's financial ecosystem will now be less dependent on foreign portfolio flows and more driven by internal credit momentum.

Imported inflation occurs when the cost of imported goods and services rises, leading to higher domestic prices as currency weakens. Gold and major components of India's imports, significantly contribute to this inflation. Higher import costs

raise production expenses for companies causing

overall price increases.

While consumer price inflation remains under control, the risk of imported inflation is rising. A Trump-style economic strategy could mean higher tariffs on Chinese goods, pushing up global commodity prices. For India, this could translate to costlier imports of electronics, machinery, and chemicals, feeding into core inflation. The RBI seems to be pre-emptively countering this by stimulating growth now before such inflationary pressures creep in. In many ways, the RBI is borrowing a page from Trump's manual: act boldly, defend your domestic economy, and expect volatility.

Rising imported inflation could lead to a depreciation of the rupee, which would further exacerbate inflationary pressures. The RBI might need to intervene in the currency markets to manage volatility. Certain sectors, such as those reliant on imported raw materials, might face increased costs due to higher imported inflation. This could impact their profitability and pricing power. This could flare up prices of imported raw materials or goods hiking costs leading to higher prices for goods and services. It could impact economic growth if consumers and businesses reduce spending in response to higher prices. The RBI's sweeping rate and reserve ratio cuts are not just a response to slowing growth — they are a strategic counter to global turbulence. As trade dynamics harden and election rhetoric in the US turns more inward-looking, India is sending a clear signal: we'll build our growth engines at home, and we won't wait for the world to stabilise

India is not immune to global shocks, but this move ensures it isn't caught unprepared. Overall, the RBI's rate cut decision is aimed at supporting growth, but a significant rise in imported inflation could alter the policy landscape and require adjustments to ensure price stability. Still, the new policy if done properly could ensure Growth First, Global Noise Later.

From Myth to Mission: The Untold Story of India's Women Warriors

raditionally, across civilisations, women have not played a direct role in wars and battles. In early societies, the preservation and safety of women were seen as vital to the survival and continuity of communities. Yet history offers many powerful exceptions — women who defied convention and proved themselves as exceptional warriors.

Take, for instance, the Amazons, the legendary tribe of female warriors in Greek mythology, celebrated for their archery, riding skills, and battlefield acumen. Closer to home, the Rigveda mentions Vishpala, a warrior who returned to combat with a prosthetic leg after losing her limb in battle — a testament to resilience and courage. Indian tradition reveres Shakti, embodied as Maa Durga, the warrior goddess armed with weapons and mounted on a lion — symbolising feminine strength in its most powerful form.

In more recent centuries, figures like Mai Bhago Kaur and Rani Durgavati stood against the Mughal armies, while Rani Lakshmibai of Jhansi and Kittur Chennamma fought valiantly against British colonial rule.

These women were not mere outliers—they were trailblazers whose legacies continue to inspire.

The participation of Indian women in the military began formally with their induction into nursing services under the British Indian Army. Thousands served with distinction during the World Wars. After independence, women were granted regular commissions in the Armed Forces Medical Corps in 1958. Since then, more avenues have gradually opened.

In 1992, women were inducted into various non-medical branches of the Indian Army under the Short Service Commission. By 2008, they were eligible for permanent commission in the Legal and Education Corps, and in 2020, this opportunity was extended to eight more branches. Over the last decade, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, there has been a conscious and concerted effort to promote the inclusion of women in the armed forces. Iconic milestones — such as Captain Tania Shergill leading an all — male contingent at the 2020 Republic Day Parade, or Lieutenant Colonel Sophia Qureshi heading an all-male contingent in a multinational exercise — have inspired a new generation of young women to envision careers in uniform. The opening of the National Defence Academy to women marked a significant mile-

As of July 2023, there are close to 4,000 women officers in the Indian Armed Forces. Including the medical corps, the number rises to around 5,800. Additionally, there are approximately 1,000 women in other ranks and 4,600 female nursing

staff. These figures are steadily increasing as policies evolve to encourage wider participation.

Importantly, there is now no distinction in the deployment and working conditions of male and female officers. Assignments are based on operational requirements, and employment rules are gender-neutral, ensuring equal opportunities for both men and women.

Modern warfare is increasingly technology-driven, and women have emerged as critical assets in domains like communications, cyber warfare, and intelligence. Women scientists and engineers are making vital contributions to defence technology and innovation — creating new systems, refining operations, and boosting India's defence preparedness. They serve as role models, inspiring younger generations, and challenging traditional stereotypes.

Earlier, we were inspired by pioneers like Dr. Tessy Thomas, who led India's missile development programs. Today, we draw inspiration from the women who played pivotal roles

in Operation Sindoor — a mission that not only avenged the lives lost in a terror attack but also marked a milestone in gender-inclusive defence operations.

From visible faces like Wing Commander Singh and Colonel Qureshi to the many unsung women who formed the backbone of the Integrated Air Command and Control System (IACCS), their contributions were critical. The IACCS is an advanced command and control system that integrates real-time data from various air defence assets to detect, identify, intercept, and neu-

tralise hostile threats. It is estimated that women constituted 25-30 per cent of the IACCS team involved in Operation Sindoor. The mission's success, in many ways, was a sisterly salute to those who had lost their husbands in the line of duty.

The story of India's women in defence — be it at DRDO, ISRO, or in operational command — remains one of the most compelling yet undertold narratives of our times. It is heartening to witness women rightfully occupying critical positions in service to the nation.

Their increasing presence in leadership roles is not just a matter of representation; it is a strategic imperative. With a Government committed to their empowerment, their role is only set to grow. Russian attacks kill three, wound 64 as drones hit Kharkiv

ussian forces launched a new drone assault across Ukraine overnight on Wednesday, killing three people and wounding 64 others, Ukrainian officials said.

One of the hardest-hit areas was the city of Kharkiv in northeastern Ukraine, where 17 attack drones struck two residential districts, Mayor Ihor Terekhov said. Emergency crews, municipal workers and volunteers worked through the night to extinguish fires, rescue residents from burning homes, and restore gas, electricity and water services.

"Those are ordinary sites of peaceful life - those that should never be targeted," Terekhov wrote on Telegram.

Three people were confirmed killed, according to Kharkiv regional head Oleh Syniehubov. In a statement, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said that 64 people had been wounded and reiterated his calls for reater international pressure on Moscow.

"Every new day now brings new vile Russian attacks, and almost every strike is telling," he said. "We must not be afraid or postpone new decisions that

And we will endure," Terekhov said. "Kharkiv is Ukraine. And it cannot be broken."

Ukraine's air force said that 85 attack and decoy drones were fired over the country overnight. Air defence systems intercepted 40 of the drones, while nine more failed to reach their targets without causing damage.

In other developments, Russia has returned 1,212 bodies of Ukrainian soldiers in line with an agreement reached during the talks in Istanbul between Russian and Ukrainian delegations.

Ukraine's Coordination Headquarters for Treatment of Prisoners of War said that the bodies came from Kharkiv, Luhansk, Donetsk, Zaporizhzhia and Kherson regions, as well as Russia's Kursk region where Ukrainian forces waged an incursion. It said that authorities would work to determine their identities as quickly as possible.

Los Angeles police swiftly enforce downtown curfew

os Angeles police swiftly enforced a downtown ✓curfew Tuesday night, making arrests moments after it took effect, while deploying officers on horseback and using crowd control projectiles to break up a group of hundreds demonstrating against President Donald Trump's immigration crackdown.

Members of the National Guard stood watch behind plastic shields, but did not appear to participate in the arrests.

Hours later, many of the protesters had dispersed, although sporadic confrontations continued that were much smaller than in previous nights. Officials said the curfew was necessary to stop vandalism and theft by agitators looking to cause trouble.

Democratic Gov Gavin Newsom earlier accused Trump of drawing a "military dragnet" across the nation's second-largest city with his escalating use of the National Guard. He also deployed Marines, though none were seen on the streets Tuesday.

Newsom asked a court to put an emergency stop to the military helping federal immigration agents, with some guardsmen now standing in protection around agents as they carried out arrests. He said it would only heighten tensions and promote civil unrest. The judge set a hearing for Thursday, giving the administration several days to continue those activities.

The change moves troops closer to engaging in law enforcement actions like deportations as Trump has promised as part of his admin-

istration's immigration crackdown. The Guard has the authority to temporarily detain people who attack officers but any arrests ultimately would be made by law enforcement.

Trump has activated more than 4,000 National Guard members and 700 Marines over the objections of city and state leaders. They were originally deployed to protect federal buildings.

Demonstrations have spread to other cities nationwide, including Dallas and Austin, Texas, Chicago and New York, where a thousand people rallied and multiple arrests were made.

In Texas, where police in Austin used chemical irritants to disperse several hundred demonstrators Monday, Republican Gov Greg Abbott's office said Texas National Guard troops were "on standby" in areas where demonstrations are planned, Abbott spokesperson Andrew Mahaleris said Tuesday

evening. Guard members were deployed to San Antonio, according to assistant police

chief Jesse Salame. He said he did not know how many were sent or details on the deployment.

LA mayor puts curfew in place

Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass declared a local emergency on the fifth day of protests and said the curfew will run from 8 pm Tuesday until 6 am Wednesday. She said it was expected to last for several days.

'We reached a tipping point" after 23 businesses were looted, Bass said during a news conference Tuesday.

The curfew covers a one square mile (2.5 square kilometre) section of downtown that includes the area where protests have occurred since Friday. The city of Los Angeles encompasses roughly 500 square miles (nearly 2,300 square kilometres).

The curfew doesn't apply to residents who live in the designated area, people who are homeless, credentialed media or public safety and emergency officials, according to Los Angeles Police Chief Jim

Global brands at risk of using forced **labour through Chinese supply chains**

neveral global brands are among dozens of Scompanies at risk of using forced labour through their Chinese supply chains because they use critical minerals or buy minerals-based products sourced from the far-western Xinjiang region of China, an international rights group said Wednesday.

The report by the Netherlands-based Global Rights Compliance says companies including Avon, Walmart, Nescafe, Coca-Cola and paint supplier Sherwin-Williams may be linked to titanium sourced from Xinjiang, where rights groups allege the Chinese Government runs coercive labour practices targeting predominantly Muslim Uyghurs and other Turkic minorities. The report found 77 Chinese suppliers in the titanium, lithium, beryllium and magnesium industries operating in Xinjiang. It said the suppliers are at risk of participating in the Chinese Government's "labour transfer programmes," in which Uyghurs are forced to

work in factories as part of a long-standing campaign of assimilation and mass detention.

Commercial paints, thermos cups and comconents for the aerospace, auto and defence industries are among products sold internationally that can trace their supply chains to minerals from Xinjiang, the report said. It said that companies must review their supply chains.

"Mineral mining and processing in (Xinjiang) rely in part on the state's forced labour programmes for Uyghurs and other Turkic people in the region," the report said.

The report came as China and the United States, the world's two largest economies, said that they have agreed on a framework to get their trade negotiations back on track after a series of disputes that threatened to derail them.

The two sides on Tuesday wrapped up two days of talks in London that appeared to focus on finding a way to resolve disputes over mineral and technology exports that had shaken a fragile truce on trade reached in Geneva last

rime Minister Donald Tusk defended his centrist, pro-European Government before parliament on Wednesday, seeking to reassert control and rally his fractured coalition after suffering a bitter political defeat.

Tusk requested a vote of confidence in the wake of the June 1 loss of Warsaw Mayor Rafal Trzaskowski — his close ally — to nationalist historian Karol Nawrocki. Backed by US President Donald Trump, Nawrocki is set to replace outgoing President Andrzej Duda, another conservative who repeatedly blocked Tusk's reform efforts.

"I am asking for a vote of confidence with full conviction that we have a mandate to govern, to take full responsibility

for what is happening in Poland," Tusk said.

Most of the power in Poland's parliamentary system rests with an elected parliament and a government chosen by the parliament. However, the president can veto legislation and represents the country abroad.

"Anyone who is ready to move forward with me, with the government, and above all with our voters, regardless of these momentary emotions, and build a better Poland, should vote today for a vote of confidence in Government," Tusk said. in our

The vote, scheduled for Wednesday afternoon, is widely expected to go in Tusk's favour. His four-party coalition holds a narrow but stable majority in the 460-seat Sejm, Poland's lower house. A loss would trigger the for-

to the conservative Law and Justice party, in coalition with the far-right Confederation party, whose candidate placed

The election result has rattled the already uneasy governing coalition, which spans from centre-left to centreright and has struggled to deliver on key campaign pledges, including liberalising Poland's abortion law and legalising same-sex civil unions. Tusk acknowledged the growing strains in Wednesday's address. Many are also blaming

Tusk for contributing to Trzaskowski's loss. Much of the criticism has come from within his coalition, as his partners examine whether they are better off sticking with him or risking a collapse of the coalition. Some are calling for a new prime minister to be selected.

There are questions about what Tusk can realistically achieve before the next parliamentary election, scheduled for late 2027 and whether the coalition will even survive that long amid a surge in popularity for the far right. Polish media and political analysts are debating whether this might be the 68-year-old Tusk's political twilight. "I know the taste of victory,

I know the bitterness of defeat, but I don't know the word surrender," Tusk said. As part of his fresh start, he

announced plans for a government reconstruction in July that will include "new faces."

Austria falls silent for minute in memory of people killed in shooting

ustria fell silent for a minute on Wednesday in memory of the 10 people killed in a school shooting in Graz, which ended with the gunman taking his own life. The man's motive remained unclear.

Austria has declared three days of national mourning following what appears to be the deadliest attack in its post-World War II history. At 10 am on Wednesday, marking the moment a day earlier when police were alerted to shots at the BORG Dreierschützengasse high school, the country stopped for a minute of

silence. Hundreds of people lined the central square in Graz, Austria's second-biggest city. Some laid more candles and flowers in front of the city hall, adding to a growing memorial to the victims. The first candles were laid on Tuesday evening as a crowd gathered on the square, some people hugging each other as they tried to come to terms with the tragedy. Hundreds of people joined Austrian officials at a service Tuesday evening in the Graz cathedral.

Among those on the square Wednesday was Chiara Komlenic, a 28-year-old art history student who finished her exams at the school there.

"I always felt very protected there. The teachers were also very supportive," she said. "I made lifelong friendships there. It just hurts to see that young girls and boys will never come back, that they experienced the worst day of their lives where I had the best time of my life. I still know a few teachers, it just hurts a lot." In the capital, Vienna, the local

GOLD ETFS STAGE COMEBACK WITH ₹292-CR INFLOW IN MAY

fter a two-month outflow, Gold Exchange Traded Fund (ETF) experienced a net inflow of ₹292 crore in May driven by resilient gold prices and sustained global uncertainties.

The inflow led to an expansion in the category's assets under management to ₹62,453 crore in May from ₹61,422 crore in April, latest data with the Association of Mutual Funds in India (Amfi) showed.

Going by the data, Gold ETFs witnessed an inflow to the tune of ₹292 crore last month, marking an improvement from outflow of ₹6 crore in April and ₹77 crore in March.

"The renewed traction in May signals a gradual return of investor interest, likely driven by resilient gold prices and sustained global uncertainties that reinforce gold's appeal as a strategic hedge," Nehal Meshram, Senior Analyst — Manager Research at Morningstar Investment Research India, said.

Furthermore, the relative

stability in gold prices through May have provided a more attractive entry point for investors looking to build or rebalance allocations toward safer assets, she added.

Also, investors are now realising the need to have gold as a part of their portfolio and therefore, the buying has begun, Santosh Joseph, CEO of Germinate Investor Services, said.

"Apart from the dip and asset allocation, there is generally a tendency to stay in dollar assets, which are different from equities and therefore,

gold is a unique asset class which is dollar-denominated but not equity-connected. It's got a negative correlation to equities, and therefore, it forms a perfect hedge to one's portfolio. So it's a combination of things that led to inflow," he

reach the levels seen earlier in the year, the trend suggests a gradual and measured return of interest in gold, underpinned by its long-term diversification benefits.

Gold, with its superlative performance over the last few years, has garnered substantial investor interest and the consistent increase in folio numbers serves as a testament to its

The folio numbers in gold ETFs rose by 2.24 lakh to 73.69 lakh in the month under review from 71.45 lakh in April. This indicates a growing inclination among investors towards funds related to gold.

Gold ETFs, which aim to track the domestic physical gold price, are passive investment instruments that are based on gold prices and invest in gold bullion. In short, Gold ETFs are units representing physical gold which may be in paper or dematerialised form.

One gold ETF unit is equal to one gram of gold and is backed by physical gold of very high purity. They combine the flexibility of stock investments and the simplicity of gold investments.

Regulatory framework important for investments: Swiss diplomat

witzerland's State Secretary for Economic Affairs Helene Budliger Artieda has said a good regulatory framework and cut in red tape in India is important to attract Swiss investments.

She said businesses here have raised concerns about bureaucratic hurdles. India and the four European nation bloc EFTA has signed a free trade agreement on March 10, 2024, which is expected to come into force from October 1.

Under the pact, India has received an investment commitment of \$ 100 billion in 15 years from the grouping while allowing several products such as Swiss watches, chocolates, and cut and polished diamonds at lower or zero duties.

Government announced the suspension of the MFN clause in the DTAA between India and Switzerland, potentially impacting Swiss investments in India and leading to higher taxes on Indian companies operating in the European nation. She also said implementation of the trade agreement will help increase exports of Swiss watches and chocolates

Swiss companies will have the advantage of preferred access to markets in India for both watches and chocolates due to this pact. Further she added that Switzerland is confident of achieving the \$100 billion investment commitment in 15 years in India.

The major sectors that are expected to show a significant jump in the shipments this fiscal include electronics, engineering, chemicals, textile and clothing, pharma and even

ndia's natural gas consumption is likely to rise by close to 60 per cent by 2030 and more than double by 2040, on the back of rise in usage of the fuel as CNG in automobiles and for cooking and industrial purposes, according to a study by oil regulator

Consumption of natural gas, which is used to produce electricity, make fertilizer or turned into CNG for running automobiles and piped to household kitchens for cooking, is expected to rise from 187 million standard cubic metres per day in 2023-24 to 297 mmscmd by 2030 under 'Good-to-Go' scenario, the study by Petroleum and Natural Gas

Regulatory Board (PNGRB) said.

'Good-to-Go' scenario assumes moderate growth and developments based on current trends and commitments.

Consumption of natural gas is projected to rise to 496 mmscmd by 2040 under the same

Under the 'Good to Best' scenario that considers accelerated progress, favourable policy implementation, and enhanced investments leading to higher-than expected growth, consumption could rise to 365 mmscmd by 2030 and 630 mmscmd by 2040.

"India's energy demand is expected to keep growing. Natural gas being a convenient, clean and cheap (alternative) with respect to other fossil fuels is likely to grow," it said.

Bhutia, others demand overhaul of Indian football

"Countries like Uzbekistan, Indonesia (likely qualifiers based in current form) and Jordan have qualified for the World Cup, and we are still struggling for the Asia Cup. Very unfortunate," he lamented. The loss on Tuesday left India's hopes of qualifying for the 2027 Asian Cup hanging by a thread a stark contrast to their recent back-to-back appearances at the continental showpiece.

Visibly anguished, the former India captain called for Chaubey's resignation and demanded a struc-

describing the on-field disasters and off-field chaos as symptoms of deeper rot.

Current India head coach Manolo Marquez, who is also the coach of Indian Super League side FC Goa, took over from Croatian legend Igor Stimac in July last year. FC Goa's Puskur called the system "rotten in ways we refuse to admit."

Everything moves on influence, favours, and fragile egos. We don't have the maturity to manage the ecosystem we claim to be

faster than we face uncomfortable truths," Puskur wrote on X.

Puskur, however, felt that blame for the national team's persistent failures cannot be placed solely on the federation, the coach, or the players. "We lost the match versus Hong Kong yesterday and there's outrage - players, coach, federation, clubs are all facing the ire. But the truth is: blame isn't isolated. It belongs to all of us. And yes, that includes me," he added.

"Clubs — mine included have inflated player salaries irresponsibly. We are outbidding each other for perception, knowing fully well it's unsustainable. Then we act shocked when these players fall flat on the international stage. WE built that illusion."

Australia qualifies for 2026 World Cup with win over Saudi Arabia

onnor Metcalfe scored his first goal for Australia and Mitchell Duke iced the 2-1 victory in Saudi Arabia that ensured the Socceroos qualified for a sixth straight World Cup. Needing just to avoid a five-

goal defeat to secure direct entry to the 2026 tournament, the Socceroos rallied with Metcalfe equalizing just before halftime with a left-foot strike and Duke putting them ahead with a 48th-minute header. Abdulrahman Al Oboud had opened for the Saudis after 19 minutes. Goalkeeper Mat Ryan made five saves, including a late penalty, in his 100th international for Australia. The Socceroos had to qualify through playoffs in 2018 and 2022 and so earning the direct entry took some pressure off. "We've done the first part -

qualifying automatically," Socceroos coach Tony Popovic said. "Now the next part is to be bigger and better for the World Cup." Popovic was part qualified for 2006, ending a long World Cup drought for Australia, and then reached the second round. Now he has guided another generation of

players to the marquee global tournament. "We've built a good foundation now (but) we want to get better, kick on and try and do something special in the World Cup," he said.

Earlier, Japan and South Korea ended successful campaigns on a high with emphatic home victories over of the Socceroos squad that Indonesia and Kuwait, respectively

In Osaka, Daichi Kamada scored after 15 minutes to set Japan, preparing for an eighth consecutive World Cup, on its

way to a 6-0 victory. Takefusa Kubo added a second five minutes later and Kamada extended the lead just before the break. Soon after the restart, Ryoya Morishita and Shuto Machino piled on and Mao Hosoya made it six.

Man City signs Reijnders from AC Milan to complete \$150 million spending spree

anchester City concluded a \$150 million spending spree ahead of the Club World Cup by announcing the signing of Netherlands midfielder Tijjani Reijnders from AC Milan on Wednesday.

The 26-year-old Reijnders moved for an initial fee of 55 million euros (\$63 million) and is the second midfielder — after France playmaker Rayan Cherki — to join City in the special June 1-10 transfer window created to allow sides in the 32-team Club World Cup to reshape their squads.

City paid Lyon \$41 million for Cherki and also signed Algeria left back Rayan Aït-Nouri from Wolverhampton for \$42 million. After deciding not to push to sign Florian Wirtz — the Germany playmaker is close to joining Liverpool, according to reports in the British media — City has spent around the same amount on



Add this latest splurge to an outlay of more than \$200 million in the winter transfer window and City has already spent at least \$350 million on players in 2025 to provide manager Pep Guardiola with a squad capable of reclaiming the

Premier League title from Liverpool. Breakthrough seasonReijnders has just

been named as the best midfielder in Serie A after a breakthrough campaign in which he scored 15 goals and added five assists across all competitions for Milan, which endured a dismal season and failed to qualify for Europe.

He joined Milan from AZ Alkmaar in 2023 for a fee of around 20 million euros (then \$22.4 million) and recently signed a contract extension through to June 2030. That's the length of his contract at City, too. City is releasing De Bruyne to end his 10-year stint at the club and now has Reijnders and Cherki to link up with Rodri in an enticing midfield set-up.

Reijnders said he was "ecstatic" to be joining City.

"It is also a dream come true to play in the Premier League," he said. "This league has seen many of the best Dutch players perform through the years and it's an inspiration to follow in their footsteps."

Smaller fields make top 10 easier at LIV Golf: Jon

wo-time major champion Jon Rahm comes into the US Open off another top 10 at LIV Golf, which is nothing new. The Spaniard has never come in lower in the 20 events he has finished since joining the Saudi-backed league at the start of last year.

Is that a big deal?

I would happily trade a bunch of them for more wins, that's for sure, said Rahm, who has two LIV victories but has yet to win this year. "But I keep putting myself in good position." One of the criticism of LIV is the 54man fields over 54 holes, especially with a half-dozen or more considered past their prime and several unproven young players. Rahm delivered some context on his streak.

"Listen, I'm a realist in this case," he said. "I've been playing really good golf, yes, but I'd be lying if I said that it wasn't easier to have top 10s with a smaller field. That's just the truth, right? Had I been playing full-field events, would I have top 10 every single week? No. But I've been playing good enough to say that I would most likely have been inside the top 30 every single time and maybe even top 25.

He considered that impressive, and he figures most of those would be top 10s.

Rahm tied for eighth last week in Virginia without ever having a serious chance of winning over the final few holes. He said against a full field, he doubts that would have been a top 10.



"I think winning is equally as hard, but you can take advantage of a smaller field to finish higher," he said. "As much as I want to give it credit personally for having that many top 10s, I wouldn't always give it as the full amount just knowing that it's a smaller field."

DeChambeau LIVBryson DeChambeau says the contract he signed to join Saudi-funded LIV Golf is up next year and he's already looking ahead to a new one.

We're looking to negotiate end of this year, and I'm very excited. They see the value in me. I see the value in what they can provide, and I believe we'll come to some sort of resolution on that," DeChambeau said on Tuesday. "Super excited for the future."

LIV contracts are confidential and there has been ample speculation whether the Public Investment Fund will shell out the kind of signing bonuses that helped lure players away from the PGA Tour in 2022.

cottie Scheffler doesn't care what the oddsmakers think or what people say about his status as the overwhelming favourite in this US Open and pretty much everywhere he plays.

But he can hear them sometimes, he hears from them. "That's why I had to get rid of my Venmo, because I was either getting paid by people or people requesting me a bunch of money when I didn't win. It wasn't a good feeling," Scheffler said with a laugh on Tuesday at Oakmont.

Tuchel runs into early problems with England as critics circle

ired amid skepticism because of his nationality, German coach Thomas nationality, German couch Tuchel was brought in as England manager to get the national team from soccer's birthplace "over the line" at a World Cup for the first time since 1966. One year out from the 2026 tournament

in North America and Tuchel has already run into problems — and is feeling the wrath of England's fans, too. The 3-1 loss to Senegal at home in a

friendly match on Tuesday brought a crashing end to Tuchel's honeymoon period that was already tottering after England could only eke out a feeble 1-0 win over 173rd-ranked Andorra four days earlier. Boos rang out as Tuchel and England's

players left the field at the City Ground in Nottingham after losing to an African nation for the first time.

Tuchel has coached some of the world's biggest clubs in Paris Saint-Germain, Bayern Munich and Chelsea and was regarded, tactically, as a big step-up from predecessor Gareth Southgate. For many, Southgate lacked that magic touch to turn England into title-winners despite its deep runs at the past four major tournaments.


These are early days — Tuchel only started the job in January — but England might even have regressed in its latest era under

Here's a look at the teething problems being encountered in Tuchel's tenure: TacticsWhile Southgate no doubt gen-

erated a great culture and atmosphere in the squad off the field, he was accused of being too pragmatic and lacking flexibility in his tactics on it.

Tuchel was expected to be a huge upgrade in that respect but England doesn't yet have an identity under the German. England captain Harry Kane listed the ingredients his team were missing against Senegal - and there were plenty.

"With and without the ball, we aren't



quite clicking," said Kane, who opened the scoring. "We aren't finding the right passes, the right tempo. In the one-vs-ones, we're losing duels and that aggressive nature we've had.

'There are some ideas that are new and we have some new players coming into the team who haven't got experience at international level. It's a mixture of things."

Tuchel only has four more camps to get his ideas across ahead of the World Cup, should England qualify of course. The team won its opening three World Cup qualifiers - against Albania, Latvia and Andorra — and tops Group K with five matches to play from September to November.

SelectionSome of Tuchel's early-tenure selections have raised eyebrows.

He has brought former Liverpool captain Jordan Henderson, age 34 and most recently playing at Ajax, back into the squad because of his leadership qualities and to "take care of all the standards in the group," Tuchel said. But is Henderson good enough to still be in the team?

He has persisted with right back Kyle Walker, who is aged 35, seemingly passed his best and most recently sent on loan to AC Milan where he has struggled to impress. Tuchel has the likes of Reece James and new Real Madrid player Trent Alexander-Arnold as alternatives but is preferring Walker, again talking about how the veteran is "pushing the standards" in

Some of his picks at center back — newcomers Trevoh Chalobah and Dan Burn among them — have also been scrutinised.

BluntnessWhile Southgate always shielded his players from criticism, Tuchel is more open and blunt with any negative

Indeed, after the Andorra game where England toiled, Tuchel accused his players of lacking "the seriousness and the urgency that is needed in a World Cup ualifier" and said he didn't like their attitude and body language.

To many, it was fair comment but something England's players maybe hadn't been used to hearing from their coach. Will they take it the wrong way - and prefer Southgate's arm-round-the-shoulder approach?

În mitigationIn defense of Tuchel, England's players were coming off long club seasons and might have switched off mentally before linking up with England for the Andorra and Senegal games.

Tuchel also made 10 changes against Senegal and was clearly testing out some new players and tactical approaches.

Can grind for another six years: Dustin Johnson PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

o much about Dustin Johnson returning to Oakmont is about reliving past glory. He won his first major championship at the US Open under extreme and bizarre conditions that allowed him to exorcise so many demons in the majors and become the best player in the world

The question now is how much golf he has left. "I think I've got another six years in me," Johnson said, contemplating the question only briefly before coming up with a most arbitrary number. "I can grind for another six ears. And then I'm going

The last 16 months have made him feel like an afterthought. He has not finished among the top three on LIV in his last 20 events. He has missed the cut in five of his last seven majors. He tied for 10th last week on LIV, which he considered progress.

"I feel like my game's been really close," he said. "I haven't really got a lot out of it. So it was definitely nice to have a nice finish last week. I played good every day. I didn't ... You know, still kind of giving away some shots. I need to clean that up a little bit."

Vinicius goal sends Brazil to 2026 World Cup, delighting fans in Ancelotti's home debut

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA Sao Paulo

goal by Vinicius Júnior secured Brazil a place in the 2026 World Cup, quite a momentous home debut for Carlo Ancelotti as head coach. The once prolific duo at Real Madrid helped Brazil to a 1-0 win over Paraguay at Sao Paulo. Ecuador secured its place at next year's global tournament later Tuesday with a 0-0 draw at Peru. Defending champion Argentina, held to a 1-1 draw by Colombia, had already qualified and is assured of finishing atop South American qualifying.

Ecuador and Brazil each have 25 points in the standings, but the Ecuadorians are in second spot based on victories. The two nations are 10 points behind Argentina but, crucially, more than six points clear of the seventh-place team with two games remaining in the qualifying campaign. The top six teams in South America

World Cup. Chile will miss a third consecutive World Cup after losing 2-0 at Bolivia to remain last in 10-nation round-robin competition, a result that cost head coach Ricardo Gareca his job. Uruguay beat Venezuela at home 2-0, with goals from Rodrigo Aguirre and Giorgian de Arrascaeta, and edged closer to one of the direct spots with 24 points.

Venezuela, with 18, is one ahead of Bolivia in the contest for seventh place that grants an intercontinental playoff berth. Lionel Messi had a quiet night in Argentina's draw with Colombia in Buenos Aires. Luis Díaz opened the scoring for the visitors in the 24th minute. Enzo Fernandez was sent off in the 70th minute to the disappointment of more than 80,000 fans at the Monumental de Nunez Stadium. But Julián Alvarez scored the equalizer in the 81st with a low crossed shot.

Madrid-Sao Paulo Ancelotti received some frustration

from fans after Thursday's 0-0 draw with Ecuador, as his team focused on defending the entire match. The Italian coach, who turned 66 Tuesday, promised changes to make his team more aggressive at the NeoQuimica He was welcomed by 46,000 fans,

including NBA star Gianni Antetokounmpo, who displayed a tifo in yellow and green that read "Parabens, Carleto" (Happy birthday, Carleto in Portuguese). Gabriel Martinelli replaced mid-

fielder Gerson and was one of the best players of the encounter. Raphinha returned after suspension and created many problems for Paraguay's defense. And Vinicius Júnior was often seen as a targetman, sharing the duties with Matheus Cunha. A mistake by Paraguay's defense, a low cross by

Cunha and a gentle touch by Brazil's new Number 10 produced the only goal of the match. "It is for you," the striker told the coach as he celebrated.

Despite the low score, the hosts were much more aggressive than in most of its games in this World Cup qualifying

"We needed to win here for our people. Now we have more time to work, see what we can improve," Vinicius said after the match. He won't play Brazil's next game in qualifying against Chile due to suspension. "We need to celebrate this. After September it is all about the World Cup."

After the final whistle, a clip of Ancelotti's first days on the job was shown in big screens around the stadium. A raucous celebration erupted again, as if the Italian coach had brought new life to a team that only three months ago appeared lost and
