# **Kashmir connects to Incredible Bharat**

n a touching fusion of devotion, celebration and history, a family from Varanasi marked their son Moksh ▲ Jaiswal's sixth birthday aboard the inaugural Vande Bharat Express from Katra to Srinagar on Saturday morning.

The joyous occasion followed their pilgrimage to the revered cave shrine of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi and coincided with the launch of the train and the inauguration of the world's highest railway arch bridge, the Chenab Rail Bridge, by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on June 6.

The family, from Varanasi, the parliamentary constituency of PM, planned Moksh's birthday celebration to align with the train's crossing of the Chenab Rail Bridge. As the semi-high-speed Vande Bharat Express chugged out of Katra at 8:10 am, passengers were visibly upbeat, their excitement palpable as the train wound through the mountain range.

The rail route showcased nature at its finest - rugged peaks, lush valleys and the glistening Chenab River below.


The journey's highlights were the engineering marvels: the Chenab Rail Bridge, soaring 359 metres above the river and surpassing the Eiffel Tower in height and the Anji Khad Bridge, India's first cablestayed railway bridge, which captivated travellers with its innovative design.

As the train crossed the Anji Khad Bridge — the Jaiswals prepared for the celebration, setting up a cake and candles.

Dressed in festive spirit, all three children, including Moksh, wore matching vibrant outfits, while Rakesh and Neha sported coordinated t-shirts. When the train reached the Chenab Rail Bridge, the family commenced the cake-cutting ceremony in their coach. Fellow passengers joined in, singing and wishing Moksh, creating a warm, communal moment.

Relishing their snacks on board, passengers couldn't contain their admiration for the infrastructure. "The Chenab Bridge is unbelievable — it's like we're floating above the clouds!" exclaimed

Anjali Gupta, a tourist from Lucknow. Her co-passenger said, "The Anji Bridge's cables look like a piece of art

against the mountains. This journey is a dream come true.

Rakesh Jaiswal, speaking to media persons, also shared his emotions: "After offering prayers at Vaishno Devi, we celebrated Moksh's sixth birthday on this historic train, cutting the cake at the world's highest railway bridge. It's a divine and unforgettable moment, thanks to PM Modi's vision for connectivity," Neha added, "Mata's blessings and this journey made Moksh's birthday the best gift. We're grateful to Modi for this opportunity."

Passengers on the inaugural ride lauded the train's comfort and speed. Priya Sharma, a pilgrim from Delhi, said, "After visiting Vaishno Devi, travelling on this train feels like a blessing. It's fast, comfortable and the views are breathtaking." The train, equipped with KAVACH anti-collision systems, anti-freezing technology and amenities like reclining seats and CCTV, is built for sub-zero Himalavan winters.

As the train traversed the 190-kilometre route in under three hours — a stark contrast to the six-to-seven-hour road journey — passengers erupted in slogans praising Prime Minister and Indian Railways.

"Modi ji ne Ќashmir ko Kanyakumari se jod diya!" (Modi ji has connected Kashmir to Kanyakumari!) chanted a group of pilgrims, their voices echoing through the coach. "Indian Railways has made the impossible possible," said Rajesh Kumar, a businessman from Jammu, adding, "This train bridges gaps — geographical, cultural and emotional. Kashmir eels closer to the rest of India now."

For passengers, the journey was more than a commute — it was a celebration of India's progress. Raghav, an adventure sports buff and mountaineer, headed to Srinagar for the first time, summed it up, "This is India's future — fast, safe and united. Kashmir is no longer far away."

### Rahul, BJP cast a ballot over Nirvachan Sadan

mid political controversy over senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi who claimed on Saturday that the 2024 Maharashtra Assembly elections were a "blueprint for rigging democracy", the Election Commission on Saturday rejected his claims of "matchfixing" in elections and described it as "unsubstantiated allegations."

BJP too jumped in accused the Leader of Opposition "cooking up bizarre conspiracies" in his desperation after losing a series of elections. Hitting back at Rahul, BJP national president JP Nadda said Rahul Gandhi's claim is a blueprint for manufacturing fake narratives, owing to his sadness and desperation of losing election after election. Terming Rahul's claims "straight out of George Soros' playbook", BJP IT Cell head Malviya called out Rahul's "repeated attempts" to "sow seeds of doubt and dissension" in the minds of voters about institutional processes.

Putting a point wise rebuttal of Congress MP's claims, the EC sources said, "Any misinformation being spread, by anyone, is not only a sign of disrespect towards the Law, but also brings disrepute to the thousands of representatives appointed by their political party and demotivates lakhs of election staff who work untiringly and transparently during elections. After any unfavourable verdict by the voters, trying to defame the Election Commission by saying that it is compromised is completely absurd".

"Unsubstantiated allegations raised against the electoral rolls of Maharashtra are an affront to the rule of law. The Election Commission had brought out all these facts in its reply to the INC on 24th December 2024 itself, which is available on ECI's website. It appears that all these facts are being completely ignored while raising such issues again and again," the EC sources said.

Reacting to EC later, Rahul in a social media post said, "Dear EC, You are a Constitutional body. Releasing unsigned,

The EC's remarks came after Rahul Gandhi launched a fresh attack on the ruling BJP, alleging that the 2024 Maharashtra Assembly election was a "blueprint for rigging democracy". Notably, Rahul Gandhi created a controversy weeks after the Election Commission of India (ECI) dismissed allegations over Maharashtra elections.

Earlier Rahul claimed the "match-fixing" of Maharashtra will come to Bihar next, and anywhere the BJP is losing. In a post on X, he said, "My article shows how this happened, step by step: step 1: rig the panel for appointing the election commission. step 2: add fake voters to the roll. step 3: inflate voter turnout. step 4: target the bogus voting exactly where the BJP needs to win. step 5: hide the evidence.'

### **Gangster Goldy** Brar, 4 others charged in 2024 **Gurugram bomb** attack case

he National Investigation ency (NIA) has chargesheeted five accused, including Canada-based Khalistani terrorist Goldy Brar, in the 2024 case relating to bomb attacks at two clubs in Gurugram, officials said on Saturday.

The NIA has booked Satinderjit Singh alias Goldy Brar, along with Sachin Taliyan, Ankit, Bhawish and USbased Randeep Singh alias Randeep Malik, under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), Arms Act, Explosives Substance Act and the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act in its charge sheet filed before a court in Panchkula on Friday, they said. Barring Brar and Malik, all others have been arrested in the case, they said.

The NIA had found the accused to be involved in a conspiracy to target the Warehouse Club and the Human Club in Gurugram with bombs. It was part of banner terrorist outfit Babbar Khalsa International's (BKI) larger conspiracy to spread communal disharmony.

### US deportee held in Delhi for multi crore fraud

he Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of Delhi Police has arrested Angad Pal Singh, also known as Angad Singh Chandhok, a Delhi-based businessman accused in a ₹30.47 crore export benefits scam, following his deportation from the United States, offi-

cials said on Saturday.
Singh fled India in 2017 after the fraud came to light. At the time of his deportation from the US, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) was also probing him in a separate fraud case. The EOW took him into custody on June 2, and a Delhi court has since sent him to judicial custody.

The arrest was made in connection with an FIR registered on January 11, 2017, under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, including cheating, forgery and criminal conspiracy. The case was based on a complaint filed by ICICI Bank, which reported suspicious activities involving the submission of 467 fake Foreign Inward Remittance Certificates (FIRCs) at its Naraina branch in Delhi.

During the investigation, police found that these forged FIRCs were allegedly issued in the name of Corporation Bank's, Bhikaji Cama Place branch. The FIRCs were used to show that

export payments had been received from abroad. Based on these documents, ICICI Bank issued Bank Realisation Certificates (BRCs), which the accused then used to claim Duty Credit Scrips (DCS) from the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT).

connection with an FIR registered on January 11, 2017, under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, including cheating, forgery and criminal conspiracy

Under the Foreign Trade Policy, exporters are eligible for two types of benefits — Duty Drawback and Duty Credit Scrips. While Duty Drawback is directly credited by customs after goods are exported, DCS are issued by DGFT only when foreign remittance is received against export. These scripts are used to offset customs duties during imports and are also transferable in the open market. In this case, the accused allegedly created a false trail of export earnings by submitting forged FIRCs, despite no actual remittance being received.

# Address PIN Code goes digital as Digipin

→he Department of Post has sought participation of various stakeholders; including citizens, developers and institutions, for refining its GPS-based address locator service DIGIPIN. The postal department had announced the launch of 'Know Your DIGIPIN' and 'Know Your PIN Code' on May 27 in alignment with the National Geospatial Policy 2022, which envisions the development of an advanced geospatial infrastruc-ture to support digital governance and public service delivery.

This new system, developed in collaboration with IIT Hyderabad and the National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC), ISRO, is set to revolutionise how locations are identified across the country. DIGIPIN stands for Digital Postal Index Number. It's a unique 10-digit code that precisely indicates the location of a property, contrasting with traditional PIN codes that cover larger areas.

This initiative aims to enhance service delivery, particularly in remote and underserved areas, by providing accurate geographic coordinates essential for various services. India has been divided into small square grids and every grid is given a unique code based on latitude and longitude. So your DIGIPIN is a digital address tied directly to your home's location on the map.

"The Department of Posts encourages



citizens, developers, institutions, and other stakeholders to explore both portals and actively contribute to their refinement," the statement had said. The postal department has developed The DIGIPIN (Digital Postal Index Number) as an open-source, interoperable, geo-coded, grid-based digital address system in collaboration with IIT Hyderabad and NRSC, ISRO.

"It is a cornerstone of the Department of Posts' vision to offer Address-as-a-Service (AaaS) — an array of services associated with address data management to support secure and efficient interactions between users, Government entities and private sector organisations," the statement said.

Through "Know Your PIN Code" service, the Department of Post aims to modernise and refine its geographic accuracy of the six-digit PIN Code system that was introduced in 1972 has been serving as the backbone of India's postal delivery. Both platforms are available on India Post's official website and include built-in options for submitting feedback on data accuracy and system usability.

"This participatory approach will help continuously improve the quality and reliability of digital addressing across India and ensure the solutions remain responsive to local realities," the statement said. The geo-fenced PIN Code boundaries dataset has also been uploaded on Open Government Data Platform under the title "All India PIN Code Boundary geo-json".

### Helicopter crash-lands near Kedarnath

helicopter carrying pilgrims to Kedarnath made an emergency ✓ Llanding on the road in Rudraprayag district on Saturday.

According to the official sources, the chopper which was carrying five pilgrims made a hard landing on the Guptkashi-Gaurikund Highway near Barasu, causing damage to a parked car and also resulting in the breaking of the tail portion of the aircraft. None of the passengers or other members of the public were injured in the mishap.

According to the Uttarakhand Civil Aviation Development Authority (UCADA), the helicopter operated by Kestrel Aviation Private Limited had taken off from Sirsi with pilgrims for Kedarnath. The pilot had to make an emergency landing on a road due to a mechanical glitch. None of the passengers on board or any member of the public was injured in the mishap. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation has been informed about the incident. The other shuttle services on the route are operating as per the schedule, according to UCADA.

It is pertinent to mention here that eight

companies are operating helicopter services to Kedarnath this year. Apart from ferrying pilgrims to and from Kedarnath, the helicopter services have so far also transported emergency medical cases from the high altitude shrine for necessary medical treatment. It is for the fourth time in a month that pilgrims travelling by air on the Char Dham Yatra route had a close shave. The hard landing of the helicopter on

Saturday comes just about a month after another private helicopter on its way to Gangotri temple crashed near Gangnani in Uttarkashi district on May 8, killing six people including five women and the pilot, and leaving one male passenger seriously injured.
On May 12, a helicopter returning

from Badrinath to Sersi with pilgrims on board was forced to make an emergency landing due to poor visibility in a school playground in Ukhimath. All pilgrims were safe. The helicopter took off again after about an hour when the weather improved. On May 17, a heli ambulance from

AIIMS Rishikesh crash-landed near the Kedarnath helipad in Uttarakhand due to damage to its rear part. Fortunately, all three occupants on board — a doctor, a pilot and a medical staff member escaped unharmed.

### Illegal arms smuggling racket busted in Amritsar, 3 held

PNS CHANDIGARH/AMRITSAR

he Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) Border Range Amritsar has arrested three associates of jailed kingpin Jugraj Singh and recovered six sophisticated foreign-made weapons smuggled from across the border from their possession, Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Saturday.

Those arrested have been identified as Rajan, a resident of Bhagtanwala Gate in Amritsar; Paramjit Singh, a resident of Heer Hall in Ghannupur, Amritsar; and Dinesh Kumar, a resident of Naraingarh, Amritsar. The recovered weapons include two Glock 19X Pistols (Made in Austria),

two .30 bore Pistols (Made in Italy), one .30 bore Star Mark Pistol and one Baretta .30 bore Pistol (Made in Italy). Apart from this, police teams have also impounded their Yamaha R15 motorcycle without a number plate and Honda Grania scooter without a number plate, which they were using to deliver the consignments.

Yadav said that preliminary investigations revealed that the arrested accused persons were working under the directions of Jugraj Singh of village Mode in Amritsar, who is currently lodged in Central Jail at Sri

smuggling racket through his advocate's Munshi identified as Rajan. The kingpin Jugraj Singh, who has been facing several criminal cases unde the NDPS and Arms act, is reportedly in contact with Pakistani drug traffickers from within the jail, he said. The DGP said that these weapons were smuggled from across the border and were likely meant to be supolied to criminal elements in Punjab. Further investigations are on to establish forward and backward linkages in this

Sharing operation details, Additional Director General of Police (ADGP) ANTF Nilabh Kishore said that ANTF Border Range Amritsar team had received cred-

ible inputs about the trio's involvement in retrieving weapons on the directions of their jailed handler Jugraj Sing. Acting swiftly on the inputs, police teams led by Superintendent of Police (SP) ANTF Border Range Amritsar Gurpreet Singh launched an intelligence-led operation and apprehended accused persons from opposite Khalsa College in Amritsar and recovered weapon consignments from their possession, he said. The ADGP said that police teams will bring accused Jugraj Singh from Jail on production warrant to carry out further investigation in this case and identify more persons involved in this smuggling racket. More arrests and recoveries are likely in com-

**Book On Kashmir Insurgency Released** Chandigarh: A book on one of India's most traumatic chapters, Kashmir Insurgency: Deconstructing the State Response - Revisiting 1989-90, authored by Col. Yoginder Kandhari (Retd.), was formally released at the Chandigarh Press Club on Saturday. The ceremony was presided over by General V. P. Malik, former Chief of the Army Staff, while Col. Daljeet Singh Cheema, author and motivational speaker, was also present. The book has been published by White Falcon Publishing. Drawing on first-hand experiences during counterinsurgency operations in Kashmir, Right to Information (RTI) disclosures, and interviews, Kandhari's book offers an account of the genesis and trajectory of the 1989-90 insurgency. The author provides a sobering critique of the state's paralysis, institutional failures, intelligence lapses, and the moral vacuum that accompanied the mass displacement of the Kashmiri Pandit community—what he calls one of the most successful campaigns of ethnic cleansing in modern history. General V. P. Malik, in his address, said, "Why did law and order and security situation in Jammu and Kashmir reach the level of implosion experienced in 1990? How Kashmiriyat culture was eliminated (which resulted in exodus of Kashmiri Pandits) and Islamist culture got adopted in the Valley? This book explores all that, and more, through the eyes of witnesses, interviews of then policy makers, and a plethora of research material. pecialist doctors will be available in Haryana government hospitals under the "on-call" system now, so that serious patients can get timely treatment, Health and Family Welfare Minister Arti Singh Rao said on Saturday. In a statement, she said that now, the no-

node formula is being implemented for doctors in government hospitals under the PPP (Public Private Partnership) model. With this initiative, specialist medical services will be made available even in rural and remote areas. Specialist doctors will attend patients on-call in hospitals. Specialist doctors will be available for services like anesthesia, surgery and radiology, gynecology and pediatrics. She informed that this service is being made available in the initial phase in five districts:

The Health Minister said this is a pilot project, which will later be expanded to the entire state. "This scheme will not only provide high quality medical facilities to the patients, but will also reduce the need for a referral system at the district level. The aim of the state government is to provide timely, quality and accessible health services to every citizen, she said. adding that this new initiative is a strong and positive effort in that direction.

Rao said this initiative is part of the government's broader effort to strengthen health services through technology, decentralization, and innovation. She added, "Our government is committed to providing accessible, affordable, and quality healthcare. This is not just a policy shift—it is a people-centric reform aimed at saving lives and improving health outcomes."

### Harsimrat Badal appeals to EAM to initiate dialogue with UAE & sensitise it about Sikh articles of faith

PNS CHANDIGARH

enior Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader and Bathinda MP Harsimrat Kaur Badal on Saturday appealed to External Affairs minister Dr S Jaishankar to initiate a dialogue with the UAE government to sensitize it about the religious significance of the five 'kakkars', especially the kirpan and kataar, and the importance of allowing Sikhs to observe their faith without fear or

In a letter to the External Affairs minister, the Bathinda MP said she was making this appeal in the wake of a recent Advisory by the Indian Embassy in UAE directing Indians not to carry sharp objects while visiting the country in view of Article 405 of the UAE penal law which prohibits the same.

Asserting that this move had caused deep distress and mental agony to Sikh travellers and residents alike, Harsimrat Badal said there have been instances of Sikhs being detained and compelled to remove their kirpan and kataar. She also cited a recent case of an elderly man being detained in Abu Dhabi for wearing the kirpan and turban.

Badal asserted in her letter that such incidents had caused distress within the Sikh community as they contravened the rights of Sikhs to practice their faith besides rais-

ing serious concerns about the protection of religious freedom for minorities in the UAE. "The Sikh community has always contributed positively to societies worldwide, including in the UAE, and demand the freedom to practice its faith in accordance with its tenets. Denying Sikhs the right to wear their five kakkars, particularly the kirpan, is a curtailment of religious freedom and contrary to the principles of mutual respect and pluralism that India stands for," she said in

The MP also requested S Jaishankar to consider sending a high-level delegation, including representatives from the National Commission for Minorities and the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC), to engage with UAE authorities and relevant international agencies and sensitise them about Sikh articles

She said that the kirpan, one of the Five Ks (panj kakaar), was a sacred symbol and an inseparable part of Sikh identity, mandated by Sikh tenets since the time of Guru Gobind Singh Ji. "Its significance is spiritual and symbolic, representing the duty to uphold justice and protect the oppressed, and not as a weapon for aggression or harm. The kirpan is worn at all times by Amritdhari Sikhs as a matter of religious obligation and conscience", she added.

Gen. Malik added. Q: As this time, the National Event on 21st June is happening in Vizag, what special arrangements are being made by the state of Andhra Pradesh? A: The Government of Andhra Pradesh has undertaken a remarkable initiative through the launch of

In fact, the past decade of IDY has transformed Yoga into a shared global heritage-strengthening India's identity as a Vishwa Guru (global teacher) in holistic living.

### Q: What is special for citizens and yoga enthusiasts in IDY 2025? How can they participate this year?

A: IDY 2025 is special as it marks the 11th International Day of Yoga, with a strong emphasis on inclusivity and mass participation. Several citizen-centric initiatives are being rolled out:

- Yoga Sangam, the flagship initiative, invites community-led yoga demonstrations at over 1 lakh locations across India, covering RWAs, schools, offices and local bodies.
- Yoga Samavesh, a dedicated series under IDY 2025, will highlight customised yoga protocols designed for diverse groups-such as persons with diabetes, asthma, disabilities, senior citizens, transgender individuals, children and more.
- Enhanced digital engagement tools, such as the Y-Break App, M-Yoga App and Namaste Yoga App, will support daily practice and increase accessibility for all age groups and professions.

- Special IDY Ambassadors, including influential personalities and cultural figures, will amplify the message of yoga across grassroots and digital platforms.
- More than 30000 organisations have already registered for "Yoga Sangam" through the dedicated registration portal

Through these efforts, IDY 2025 becomes not just a celebration of one day, but a powerful movement for daily wellness and collective well-being.

#### Q: How does Yoga and IDY connect people across diverse backgrounds and regions?

A: Yoga has proven to be a unifying force across geographies, languages and belief systems. IDY has played a unique role in building a shared sense of purpose and collective consciousness. Whether it's fishermen doing Yoga by the sea in Kerala, school children in Leh practising under open skies, or tribal communities in Jharkhand integrating local wellness practices with yoga-as a medium, it fosters connection and compassion.

In IDY 2025, the "Yoga Samavesh" campaign is spotlighting sessions that bring together different communitiesr MM, generations and abilities-proving that in an increasingly fragmented world, Yoga is one of the few practices that unites without imposing, India's yoga ecosystem is already a billion-dollar industry, with over 5 crore households practicing yoga daily, according to the latest NSSO survey. Q: What efforts are being made by the Ministry of Ayush in the field of yoga research?

A. The Ministry of Ayush is actively advancing yoga as an evidence-based discipline through strategic research initiatives:

India's approach to Traditional Medicine aligns

Over the time, the Ministry of Ayush has established a strategic collaboration with the World Health Organisation (WHO) to globalise and mainstream traditional medicine. A landmark achievement in this partnership is the establishment of the WHO Global Traditional Medicine Centre in Jamnagar Gujarat- the first-of-its-kind institution globally dedicated to traditional medicine. Other key milestones include the successful hosting of the first WHO Traditional Medicine Global Summit in

The Group of Friends of Traditional Medicine (GFTM) was created by India in May 2023. This informal platform allows WHO member States to discuss and support the integration of traditional medicine into health systems

#### Q: What is the WHO Global Traditional Medicine Strategy 2025-2034, and how is India contributing to it?

A: The WHO Global Traditional Medicine Strategy 2025-2034 aims to support Member States in integrating traditional medicine into their health systems through regulation, scientific research, and safe practices. India has been a key contributor, having demonstrated strong leadership during the previous strategy (2014-2023). India's efforts now extend to actively shaping and supporting the new strategy, especially through the WHO Global Traditional Medicine Centre (GTMC) in Jamnagar. This Centre, established with India's support, is a global hub for policy research, data analytics, and international collaboration in traditional medicine.

### Q: What role does the WHO Global Traditional Medicine Centre in Jamnagar play?

A: The WHO Global Traditional Medicine Centre (GTMC), inaugurated in 2022 by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and WHO Director-General Dr Tedros Ghebreyesus, is the first of its kind globally. Located in Jamnagar, Gujarat, the Centre plays a pivotal role in strengthening the global TM ecosystem. It focuses on evidence-based policy support, setting international standards, fostering global research partnerships and using data analytics to inform best practices. It also positions India as a leader in the scientific validation and global promotion of traditional healthcare systems.

#### Q: What is the significance of the recent Donor Agreement between the Ministry of Ayush and WHO?

A: On May 24, 2025, the Ministry of Ayush and WHO signed a landmark Donor Agreement to develop a Traditional Medicine module under the International Classification of Health Interventions (ICHI). This initiative will create a standardised, scientif-

ic framework to document and classify health interventions used in systems like Ayurveda and Unani. As highlighted by Prime Minister Modi in his Mann Ki Baat address, this is a major step toward global recognition, scientific credibility and mainstreaming of Ayush systems internationally.

on Saturday. Speaking to reporters after reviewing the ongoing construction work, Mishra said the Shri Ram Janmbhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust is actively considering devotees. "Darshan of the Ram Darbar could start within 10 days. The trust is working on the arrangements," he said, adding that structural consultations are underway with experts from the Central Building Research Institute (CBRI) to finalise access plans. With this development, the construc-

opening the first floor of the temple to

tion of the Ram Temple has entered its final phase. While the idol of Ram Lalla has already been installed on the ground floor, the first floor houses the Ram Darbar, depicting Lord Ram, Sita, Lakshman and Hanuman. Mishra further

revealed that the second floor will serve as a repository for rare and ancient scriptures related to Lord Ram.

Meanwhile, the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) is carrying out a detailed survey at the exact spot where Ram Lalla was placed in a tent before being shifted to the sanctum earlier this year. This location, considered the original birthplace of Lord Ram, will now be studied for its archaeological and historical value. "The ASI team will conduct research around the five-century-old legacy of this site,"

Other works in the temple complex are also nearing completion. The Pushkarni Kund, a sacred pond being constructed between the Saptarishi temples, is in its final stage.

Mishra said efforts are being made to preserve the natural ecology of the Panchvati area. Native trees are being planted to ensure that birds and animals have access to water and shelter without disturbing the area's natural balance.

The northern entrance of the temple, currently under construction, is expected to be completed by August 15. Mishra also mentioned that the master plan for the temple complex, including landscaping and support infrastructure, will be finalised within a month.

He acknowledged the support of several national institutions in completing the temple. These include the Railway Ministry, CBRI, and the Defence Ministry, which is assisting with the installation of titanium mesh for security.

All agencies involved have been compensated by the temple trust. "With the opening of the Ram Darbar for darshan just days away, the temple is on the brink of full readiness," Mishra said, noting that Ayodhya is rapidly transforming into a global spiritual hub.

### Espionage case: Punjab YouTuber Jasbir's police custody extended

aryana Police had summoned Punjab-based YouTuber Jasbir ▲ Singh on June 6 in the Jyoti Malhotra espionage case but before he could join the investigation, he was arrested by Punjab Police, Singh's counsel claimed on Saturday. He also denied the charge that Singh was an agent of Pakistan's spy agency ISI.

A Mohali court on Saturday extended for two days the police remand of Singh, who was arrested on espionage charges on June 4. Singh was produced before the court after his three-day police remand ended on Saturday. Police sought a seven-day remand of Singh but the court granted them two days, said his counsel.

Jasbir Singh alias Jaan Mahal (41), a resident of village Mahlan in Rupnagar district, was running a YouTube channel "JaanMahal Video" with over 11

lakh subscribers, ostensibly posting travel and cooking vlogs. Singh was allegedly in close touch with Haryanabased influencer Jyoti Malhotra, who is in custody on charges of spying for Pakistan. After Singh's arrest, Punjab police had claimed that it unearthed a terror-backed espionage network" linking him to Pakistani intelligence and army officials.

Police had said that the YouTuber was allegedly spying for Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI). Speaking to reporters on Saturday, Singh's counsel Mohit Dhupar said he met him in the court on Saturday. "We spoke to him. There is no such thing that is being said in the media that he was an ISI agent," said Dhupar, claiming he was just a vlogger. Dhupar said Singh was summoned by Punjab Police from May 17 till May 30. He had already given his mobile phone and laptop to the police,

# India central to key supply chains; must be part of G7 discussions: Canadian PM

· ndia is the fifth largest economy in the world and it is central to a number of critical global supply chains, Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney has said, arguing that the leadership of the country must be part of discussions at the upcoming G7 summit.

Carney's comments came after some of his political opponents in Canada criticised him for inviting Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the G7 summit in view of a probe into allegations of Indian links to the killing of a Khalistani separatist in 2023.

Prime Minister Modi accepted Carney's invitation to attend the G7 summit during a phone conversation on Friday.

Canada is hosting the G7 summit in the Alberta province from June 15 to 17 in its capacity as the current chair of the grouping. To a specific question on the case of killing of pro-Khalistan separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar in 2023, Carney told reporters that it is not appropriate for him to comment as the legal process in the case is

The Canadian prime minister said the G7 summit will deliberate on a range of key issues including energy security, dig-

ital future, critical minerals and on partnerships in building infrastructure in the emerging and developing world.

Carney suggested that he extended the invitation to Modi after talking to other G7 member countries.

'There are certain countries that should be at the table for those discussions," he said when asked why PM Modi was invited when there have been allegations of

Indian links to the Nijjar case.

"India is the fifth largest economy in the world; effectively the most populous country in the world. (It is) central to a number of those supply chains; (it is) at the heart of a number of those supply chains, so it makes sense," he said.

Without elaborating, Carney noted that India and Canada have agreed to continue law enforcement dialogue." Bilaterally,

we have now agreed importantly to continue law enforcement dialogue. There has been some progress on that...Recognises issues of accountability," he said.

Canada's NDP party slammed Carney for extending the invitation to Modi.

"This decision is profoundly troubling," it said. The India-Canada relations hit rock bottom following then Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's allegations in 2023 of a potential Indian link to the killing of Nijjar.

In October last year, India recalled its high commissioner and five other diplomats after Ottawa attempted to link them to the Nijjar case. India also expelled an equal number of Canadian diplomats.

However, Liberal Party leader Carney's victory in the parliamentary election in April triggered hopes for reset of the relationship. In the last few months, the security officials of India and Canada resumed contacts and both sides were looking at the possibility of appointing new high commissioners.

India had accused Trudeau's government of allowing pro-Khalistani elements to operate from Canadian soil.

After Trudeau's exit, New Delhi said it hoped to rebuild ties with Canada based on "mutual trust and sensitivity".

### Yemen's al-Qaida branch leader threatens Trump, Musk

→he leader of al-Qaida's Yemen branch has threatened both US President Donald Trump and billionaire Elon Musk over the Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip in his first video message since taking over the group last year.

The half-hour video message by Saad bin Atef al-Awlaki, which spread online early Saturday via supporters of al-Qaida in the Arabian Peninsula, also included calls for lone-wolf militants to assassinate leaders in Egypt, Jordan and the Gulf Arab states over the war, which has decimated Gaza.

The video of al-Awlaki's speech showed images of Trump and Musk, as well as US Vice President JD Vance, Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Secretary of State Pete Hegseth. It also included images of logos of Musk's businesses, including the electric carmaker Tesla.

"There are no red lines after what happened and is happening to our people in Gaza," al-Awlaki said. Reciprocity is legitimate.

### Yemen's al-Qaida branch to be most dangerous

Though believed to be weakened in recent years due to infighting and suspected US drone strikes killing its leaders, the group known by the acronym AQAP had been considered the most dangerous branch of al-Qaida still operating after the 2011 killing by US Navy SEALs of founder Osama bin Laden, who masterminded the September 11, 2001, attacks.

În 2022, a US drone strike in Afghanistan killed bin Laden's successor, Ayman al-Zawahri, who also helped plot 9/11. The September 11 attacks then began decades of war by the US in Afghanistan and Iraq, and fomented the rise of the Islamic State

### **ISRAEL-HAMAS WAR A FOCUS OF THE HOUTHIS AS WELL**

AQAP seizing onto the Israel-Hamas war follows the efforts of Yemen's Houthi rebels to do the same The Iranian-backed group has launched

missile attacks on Israel and targeted commercial vessels moving through the Red Sea corridor, as well as American warships. The US Navy has described their

campaign against the Houthis as the most intense combat it has faced since World War II. The Trump administration also launched its own intense campaign of strikes on the Houthis, which only ended before the president's recent trip to the Middle East. The Houthis' international profile rose as

the group remains mired in Yemen's longstalemated war. Al-Awlaki may be betting on the same for

his group, which UN experts have estimated has between 3,000 and 4,000 active fighters and passive members. The group raises money by robbing banks and money exchange shops, as well as smuggling weapons, counterfeiting currencies and ransom operations, according to the UN.

The Shiite Zaydi Houthis have previously denied working with AQAP, a Sunni extremist group.

However, AQAP targeting of the Houthis has dropped in recent years, while the militants keep attacking Saudi-led coalition forces who have battled the Houthis.

"As the Houthis gain popularity as leaders of the Arab and Muslim world's 'resistance' against Israel, al-Awlaki seeks to challenge their dominance by presenting himself as equally concerned about the situation in Gaza," said Mohammed al-Basha, a Yemen expert of the Basha Report risk advisory firm.

group. Al-Awlaki already has a \$6 million US bounty on his head, as Washington says al-Awlaki "has publicly called for attacks against the United States and its allies.'

He replaced AQAP leader Khalid al-Batarfi, whose death was announced by the group in 2024.

### **Health care worries**

Even still, sizable coalitions of GOP lawmakers are forming to protect aspects of both of those programs as they ripple into the lives of millions of Americans.

Hawley, Sen Lisa Murkowski of Alaska and others are wary of changes to Medicaid and other provisions in the bill that would result in fewer people being able to access health care programs. At the same time, crossover groupings of House and Senate Republicans have launched an aggressive campaign to preserve, at least for some time, the green energy tax breaks that business interests in their states are relying on to develop solar, wind and other types of energy production.

Murkowski said one area she's "worried about" is the House bill's provision that any project not under construction within 60 days of the bill becoming law may no longer be eligible for those credits. "These are some of the things we're work-

ing on," she said. The concerns are running in sometimes

opposite directions and complicating the work of GOP leaders who have almost no votes to spare in the House and Senate as they try to hoist the package over Democratic opposition

Trump's big bill also seeks to undo big bills of Biden, Obama

While some Republicans are working to preserve the programs from cuts, the budget hawks want steeper reductions to stem the nation's debt load. The CBO said the package would add \$2.4 trillion to deficits over the decade.

After a robust private meeting with Trump at the White House this week, Republican senators said they were working to keep the bill on track as they amend it for their own prior-

Senate Majority Leader John Thune said the president "made the pitch and the argument for why we need to get the bill done."

The disconnect is reminiscent of Trump's first term, when Republicans promised to repeal and replace Obamacare, only to see their effort collapse in dramatic fashion when the late Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz, voted thumbs down for the bill on the House floor.

### **Battle over Medicaid**

In the 15 years since Obamacare became law, access to health care has grown substantially. Some 80 million people are now enrolled in Medicaid, and the Kaiser Family Foundation reports 41 states have opted to expand their coverage. The Affordable Care Act expanded Medicaid to all adults with incomes up to about \$21,500 for an individual, or almost \$ 29,000 for a two-person household.

While Republicans no longer campaign on ending Obamacare, advocates warn that the changes proposed in the big bill will trim back at access to health care.

The bill proposes new 80 hours of monthly work or community service requirements for able-bodied Medicaid recipients, age 18 to 64, with some exceptions. It also imposes twicea-year eligibility verification checks and other

Republicans argue that they want to rightsize Medicaid to root out waste, fraud and abuse and ensure it's there for those who need it most, often citing women and children.

"Medicaid was built to be a temporary safety net for people who genuinely need it young, pregnant women, single mothers, the disabled, the elderly," Johnson said.

"But when when they expanded under Obamacare, it not only thwarted the purpose of the program, it started draining resources." Initially, the House bill proposed starting the

work requirements in January 2029, as Trump's term in the White House would be coming to a close. But conservatives from the House Freedom Caucus negotiated for a quicker start date, in December 2026, to start the spending reductions sooner.

Senate Democratic Leader Chuck Schumer has said the changes are an Obamacare rollback by another name.

"It decimates our health care system, decimates our clean energy system," Schumer of New York said in an interview with the AP.

# India must give Gill crack at Test captaincy: Ponting

ndia have taken the right decision by handing the reins of the Test team to Shubman Gill and now the youngster must given a long rope to prove his credentials, says Ricky Ponting, who is also confident that India can handle the ongoing transition phase better than other countries. India will be without stalwarts Virat Kohli, Rohit Sharma, Ravichandran Ashwin, who all retired recently, and pacer Mohammed Shami when they begin their five-Test tour of England on June 20.

While Kohli and Rohit retired from Tests last month, Ashwin had hung up his boots during the Australia tour last year and Shami was ruled out on fitness grounds for the tour of the Old Blighty.

"I actually think it's the right move. I know there's a lot of other people out there, pundits out there saying they can't understand why it wasn't Bumrah and why they have gone to Shubman, but I think it's pretty simple," Ponting told The ICC Review.
"Bumrah's injuries are holding him

back a bit in the last couple of years and you don't want that with a captain. You can't have a captain coming in and missing games here and there, so I think it's the right decision." ### Norway crushes Italy 3-0 in World Cup qualifier

¬ rling Haaland scored and Norway humbled Italy 3-0 for the first time in 25 years in qualifying for the 2026 World Cup.

Haaland on Friday collected a through ball from playmaker Martin Odegaard and rounded goalkeeper Gianluigi Donnarumma in the box for the third goal three minutes before halftime.

It was his 41st goal in his 42nd match for Norway to the delight of the spectators at Ullevaal Stadium in Oslo, including King Harald V of Norway.

Haaland also scored when Moldova was beaten 5-0 and Israel 4-2. Norway remained perfect in qualifying after three games in Europe Group I.

Striker Alexander Sorloth received a precise pass from Antonio Nusa then beat Donnarumma with a left foot shot. Nusa, the 20-year-old attacking midfielder, was a constant threat to the Italian defense. He left behind two defenders and doubled the advantage with a rising shot from inside the area.

Italy was missing some regulars for its first qualifying match, while others failed to impress, including Mateo Retegui, the best Serie A scorer.

Defenders Alessandro Buongiorno and Mattia Gabbia, defensive midfielder Manuel Locatelli and forward Moise Kean were all injured while key center back Francesco Acerbi, who was meant to mark Haaland, turned down his callup. Diego Coppola played centre back in the three-man defensive line used by coach Luciano Spalletti that was not able to stop Norway.

#### Norway dominates, Italy in trouble

In the other Group I game, Israel won in Estonia 3-1 for a second win and second place. The Azzurri are under pressure from the start of their qualifying after failing to reach the last two World Cups. Winning the group is the only way to ensure direct qualification to next year's tournament in North America.

The second-placed team goes into the playoffs — the stage where Italy was eliminated by Sweden and North Macedonia and ruled out of the 2018 and 2022 World Cups, respectively. A four-time World Cup champion, the only other time Italy didn't qualify was for the 1958 edition.

Italy hosts Moldova on Monday when Norway will be in action at Estonia.

### Croatia cruises, Belgium held

Croatia opened its qualifying with a 7-0 rout of minnow Gibraltar. Mario Pašalic and Ante Budimir struck twice for Croatia within two minutes to break the deadlock after half an hour. In the second half, substitutes Andrek Kramaric and Franjo Ivanovis scored a couple each and Ivan Perisic piled on. Croatia was runner-up in the 2018 World Cup and third in 202

In the same Group L, Adam Hlo⊠ek and Patrik Schick each scored as the unbeaten Czech Republic beat Montenegro 2-0 for a third straight win. Belgium was 1-0 up on a goal by defender Maxim De Cuyper but Ezgjan Alioski salvaged a draw for North Macedonia in a surprise in Group J.

Wales tops the group with seven points from three games after a 3-0 victory over Liechtenstein.

### Magnus Carlsen wins Norway Chess title for seventh time

orld champion D Gukesh committed a costly blunder against American Grandmaster Fabiano Caruana in the final round to finish third, as five-time world champion Magnus Carlsen clinched a record-extending seventh Norway Chess title here.

Gukesh, after being in a disadvantageous position against 2018 Norway Chess champion Fabiano Caruana, tried to stage a late comeback but ran out of time and committed a blunder, instantly realising his chances had slipped away.

Gukesh offered a handshake, grimaced, closed his eyes, and buried his face in both hands in frustration. It was a golden opportunity for the young Indian world champion to win his maiden Norway Chess title in only his second appearance, after a roller-coaster tournament that saw him start on a poor note before turning things around with impressive Classical wins over Magnus Carlsen, compatriot Arjun Erigaisi, and China's Wei Yi.

Defending champion Carlsen, who was the overnight leader with 15 points after round 9, ended the tournament with 16 points after fashioning the great escape against GM Erigaisi and steering the ame to a draw in the 10th round on Friday. Gukesh finished third — the same as in the 2023 edition — with 14.5 points, while Caruana was second with 15.5 points. Erigaisi finished fifth with 13 points. Erigaisi won the Armageddon tie-break against Carsen following the miraculous draw by the Norwegian, but it did not matter in the end as the five-time world champion had already secured a point with the stalemate to win the title. While Gukesh quietly walked out of the

arena after losing to Caruana, Carlsen said he had to "literally fight for his life" to stay in the match against Arjun Erigaisi.

A defeat for the Norwegian would have been catastrophic, as the Gukesh-Caruana game was still in progress, and a Classical win for either would have dashed his hopes of a seventh Norway Chess title and the accompanying prize purse of approximately \$69,500. In fact, had Gukesh managed to draw his game against the American Grandmaster, he would have secured the title-provided Carlsen had lost his Classical encounter against Erigaisi

Under the Norway Chess format, a Classical win earns three points, while a draw gives each player one point. A drawn game is followed by an Armageddon tie-break to decide the winner, who is awarded an additional half point. "I don't know what to say, like I kind of provoked him (Erigaisi) into concrete action and then I obviously missed something pretty big. But I thought I was doing well when he completely out-calculated me

and I just had to yeah fight for my life," said Carlsen. "It's just trying to find practical chances that keep the game alive, and it seemed that he (Erigaisi) got a bit nervous at some point... gave me very good chances." Carlsen admitted that part of his attention was on the Gukesh-Caruana game, given the significant impact it could have had on his title-winning chances. "I was just not good enough to find the win but looking at the other game (between Gukesh and Caruana), I kind of figured out at some point that I probably voulant need to win and that helped me, said Carlsen. "Yeah, of course it's (the win) a huge relief after a day like this in the tournament. Obviously, you know, my struggles have been well documented here but at least I fought till the end so I'm happy with that. It's been a roller-coaster ride and we're talking about classical chess."

Carlsen said he would not be playing a lot of classical chess in times to come.

"Not a lot (of classical chess) for sure. I'm not going to say that this tournament was my last for sure but I enjoy other forms of chess a lot more."

On whether the title felt like a statement amid talks of the next generation rising, Carlsen said: "Had I actually won the tournament convincingly, we might have been having these talks. But honestly, there were at least three people who could have won this tournament easily, and I kind of stumbled into it. I don't think that's much of a statement. "It's good to see that I feel like, at least in parts of the game, I am a lot better than the kids who are trying to take over. It's rare to see so many twists and turns... the quality wasn't perfect, but there was a lot of good chess as well."

### Anna Muzychuk wins women's title

In the women's section, overnight leader and two-time world blitz champion, Ukraine's Anna Muzychuk won the title with 16.5 points despite an Armageddon tie-break loss to India's R Vaishali in the final round. Muzychuk's draw in the classical game against the Indian earned both players a point each, while Vaishali secured another half a point by beating the Ukrainian in the Armageddon sudden death to finish on 11 points. Had Vaishali defeated Muzychuk — who was on 15.5 points overnight — in the Classical game, she would have deprived the Ukrainian Grandmaster of three points, which would have propelled Koneru Humpy to the title had the two-time world rapid champion too got the better of Chinese world champion Ju Wenjun in the Classical game.

Unfortunately, Humpy, who was on 13.5 points overnight after round 9, could only manage a draw with white pieces to earn one point. She got another half point by overcoming Wenjun in the Armageddon tie-break to earn 1.5 points, and finish with 15 points and a third-place finish.

### India's archery hopes crash in Antalya debacle

ndian archery endured a forgettable outing at Stage 3 of the World Cup here Lon Saturday, returning empty-handed in a performance that raised serious questions over team selection, preparation and mental fortitude, especially with the Asian Games just a year away.

The high of Shanghai last month, where India stood second on the medal tally with two gold, one silver and four bronze medals, now seems like a distant past.

The third leg in Antalya saw both recurve and compound archers flop spectacularly, with not a single podium finish, even in their traditionally strong compound category.

A day after India's compound archers crashed out in both individual and team events, the recurve results were equally dismal, with seasoned names like four-time Olympians Deepika Kumari and Tarundeep Rai also failing to reach the medal rounds.

The only fight came from Simranjeet Kaur, who shocked everyone by stretching Korean Olympic gold medallist An San to a shoot-off in the quarterfinals on Saturday. Simranjeet, who barely made the cut at 54th with the third-lowest qualification score, was on the verge of a historic win, leading 5-3 and needing just a point to seal it against Korean star An San.

But, as has often been the case with Indian archers, nerves took over in the decider. A poor fifth set saw her shoot a 5 and an 8, allowing An San to force a shoot-off. The Korean nailed an 11 under the new scoring system, while Simranjeet faltered with an 8, losing 5-6 (29-28, 24-29, 27-24, 27-27, 23-29) (8-11).

Her second set, where she landed an

arrow in the blue ring (6), also proved costly. An San, meanwhile, defeated Indian star Deepika three times in a row. The South Korean had earlier ousted the

Indian star in the second round with a 6-0 rout (29-30, 27-28, 28-30) dashing her hope for a successive medal. Deepika had bagged a bronze in Shanghai last month.

Deepika, the former world number 1, continues to falter against elite opponents and has failed to learn from repeated mistakes, particularly against the dominant Koreans. Ankita Bhakat, who was India's best archer in qualification at 32nd, exited in the opening round, losing 2-6 (27-26, 26-28, 29-30, 28-29) to Dunya Yenhihayat — another lead squandered after going up 2-0.

### Men fared no better

Former youth world champion and Shanghai bronze medallist Parth Salunkhe suffered a shock first-round exit to Lu Shuai of China 2-6 (28-29, 25-28, 28-25,

27-30), while Rai, at 41, showed little justification for his selection as he went down 2-6 to Germany's Mathias Kramer (28-30, 29-28, 27-31, 29-32).

Another seasoned campaigner Atanu Das, after leading 4-2, surrendered meekly to world no. 1 Brady Ellison 4-6 (28-27, 30-31, 31-30, 30-31, 27-30) from being 4-2 up. Dhiraj Bommadevara, India's top qualifier with 13th rank, also threw away a 4-2 lead to lose 4-6 (30-30, 30-30, 31-30, 28-29, 28-30) to Chinese Taipei's Tang Chin-Chun. With this, India's campaign in Antalya came to an end without a medal. The closest the team came to a podium finish was in the recurve men's and compound women's team events, but both units lost their respective bronze medal matches.

### **Compound heartbreak**

The compound women's team had lost 238-239 to the USA by a single point. The recurve men's team was completely outplayed 1-5 by France. The compound men's team, once considered among the best in the world, crashed out in the very

first round The compound mixed team also couldn't find synergy and exited in the quarterfinals, exposing their downward spiral.

In the recurve mixed team, things were worse as they couldn't even make it past the opening round.

The recurve women's team, after a promising start, folded in the quarterfinals. In the individual compound category, Rishabh Yadav and Madhura Dhamangaonkar were the only bright spots, both reaching the quarterfinals before bowing out.

For India, the bigger concern lies in the alarming dip in form of top-ranked compound archers Abhishek Verma and Jyothi Surekha Vennam. World Number 3 Jyothi, a consistent

podium finisher until 2023, crashed out in the second round of 32, extending her medal drought beyond a year. Her last medal came in April 2023 — a

gold at the Shanghai World Cup. Since then, it's been a downward spiral for the Asian Games gold medallist and world championship silver medallist. Two-time Asian Games silver medallist

Verma was eliminated in the round of 16 by teammate Rishabh Yadav. Verma hasn't won a medal since June 2023 when he had won a gold in Medellin.

### Selections sans vision

Questions will be asked on the team selection especially persisting with a Rai, who has shown little firepower in highpressure events. Deepika too continues to choke against elite rivals, particularly Indian junior women's hockey to play matches in Europe

ometimes, one feels compelled to say that they don't make films like this too often. Stolen, now streaming on Amazon Prime Video is a perfect example of such rare storytelling. From just ten minutes into the film, the narrative begins to take shape, gripping the viewer's attention. Abhishek Banerjee and Shubham Vardhan play brothers, Gautam and Raman, whose lives become entangled in a harrowing incident.

The story opens with a woman named Jhumpa sleeping on a railway platform with her daughter, Champa, who is suddenly abducted. Both brothers happen to be present at the station late at night when the incident occurs. From there, the plot follows the trio — Jhumpa, Gautam, and Raman, as they attempt to track down the missing child, facing numerous challenges along the way.

Karan Tejpal's debut feature maintains a firm grip on the storyline from the outset, never allowing the audience to lose interest. The film's dialogues are thoughtfully crafted, capturing the raw frustration and helplessness experienced by both sides involved.

The narrative moves fluidly between

urban and rural settings. A car chase involving the three protagonists, while searching for Champa, quickly transforms into a nerve-wracking

Much of the film unfolds on the road, but the narrative never loses momentum. The brothers' journey with Jhumpa is rife with internal conflict, suspicion, and shifting alliances, all while maintaining the pace



# The Pioneer

You medical people will have more lives to answer for in the other world than even we generals"

ou walk into a chemist shop with a simple prescription one tablet, maybe two. The pharmacist looks you and says, "We do not sell one tablet. You have to buy the whole strip." There is no room for discussion. You are forced to pay for more than you need, knowing some of it will expire unused in a corner of your cabinet. You leave, annoyed, not just at the pharmacist but at a system built to bleed the sick.

This is not an isolated incident. It is how the pharmaceutical business operates, built not around patients but around profit. Why can you not buy a single tablet? Why does a medicine that costs ₹13 at the factory gate sell for ₹130 at the counter? How is this allowed in a country where so many struggle to access basic healthcare? People are routinely cornered into making impossible choices, medicine or meals, prescriptions or school fees. In a country that boasts of medical advancements and world-class drug manufacturing, the harsh truth is this: access to affordable medicine is a myth for the average Indian.

Generic drugs, meant to be the great equaliser, are no better. The transparency is nonexistent. Medicines manufactured cheaply are sold with little accountability. Chemist shops refuse to break a strip. Doctors scribble illegible prescriptions, sometimes linked to incentives from pharmaceutical companies. The authorities that are meant to regulate and protect, like the NPPA, have remained largely ineffective in fixing this rot. This is not a flaw in the system. This is the system. Designed to prioritise margins over lives, packaging over patients, and commerce over care.

Jan Aushadhi Kendras are being opened under Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana claiming a huge saving to commoners ranging from 50-90 per cent on purchase of generic medicines from these about 10000 centres throughout the country with average monthly sale of just ₹1.50 lakhs per month for each centre. Much more can be achieved by fixing a maximum trade margin on all medicines and medical-consumables including generic medicines of say 30 per cent between ex-factory price and Maximum-Retail-Price (MRP).

Same is case with thousands of generic medicines manufactured by various companies Even branded medicines had varying trade-margins with a box of 10 strips of 10 capsules each of Bifilac-HP with total printed MRP of rupees 2300 per box was available at rupees 1350 per box. World Health Organisation established that essential drugs in India with

lowest printed MRP are exorbitantly priced over manufacturing-cost followed by abnormally high trademargin between ex-factory price and MRP. Same holds good for other medical-consumables like a box of 200 Accu-Check Safe T Pro Uno single-use lancing device with printed MRP of ₹2200 used to be available at just ₹600 only.

Drug-manufacturers at times pack just eight lozenges per strip of commonly advertised coughmedicines instead of usually ten because consumers judge by price per strip rather than per lozenge.

Many drug-manufacturers have started packing medicines in strips of fifteen rather than earlier ten to boost up sale because most chemists sell complete medicine-strip rather than cutting the strip to sell in loose. National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA) should direct all medicines to be packed in units of 1, 2, 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, 1000 and higher multiples unless permission. Name of medicine is usually printed just once on a side of medicine-strip. Wrapping-foil must be so designed that name of medicine may appear for each packed tablet/capsule with name of medicine also embossed/printed on each tablet/capsule.

Ex-factory prices of different branded medicines for same basic salt has vast difference. Branded medicines from different renowned companies are priced with heavy difference depending on popularity of brand like Calmpose and Valium-5 both having Diazepam-5 as basic salt have huge price-difference. Medicines are put in different categories for priceregulation with Calmpose and Valium-5 put in a category where there is no price-regulation. System of having multiple categorisation for medicines must be removed because patients have to take prescribed medicine irrespective of their categorisation.


Mahtab raised issue of generic drugs in Lok Sabha on 19.07.2019, rightly demanding an inquiry to find out the efficacy of generic drugs quoting a book-study that Indian drug manufacturers were producing quality generic medicines for US and European countries with sub-standard generic medicines marketed in domestic market. NPPA should ensure that generic medicines sold in Indian markets are of export-quality. Export of world-class generic medicines can provide country adequate foreign-exchange and reputation because of Indian generic medicines are economical than foreign-branded medicines. Lucknow bench of Allahabad High Court in the year 2018 imposed fine on three doctors for illegible hand-writing on injury-reports. Odisha High Court on 13.08.2020 advised doctors to write legible prescriptions preferably in capital letters. Medical-practitioners should compulsorily issue computerised prescriptions. Union Health Ministry should develop userfriendly softwares separately for hospitals, pathological laboratories and medical practitioners providing unique ID for each patient so that complete medical history may be available even online to the patient. Dual pricing must not be allowed in health-services including for pathological and biochemical tests for normal patients and those covered under Central Government Health scheme. All hospitals getting land at subsidised cost/lease from Governments should be declared as public-authorities under section 2(h) of RTI Act, or else pay market-price of land provided to these hospitals at market rates.



Wheels may take you there, but what stays is the stillness between the stones. Through the lens of PANKAJ **KUMAR**, journey into Ranakpur, a place where light, shadow and silence hold their own space



**LOCALS AND DAILY LIFE** 

The villagers of Ranakpur often doub up as caretakers, storytellers and guides. Most speak a mix of Hindi and Mewari. A few understand Gujarati. English is heard rarely, but hands and eyes bridge that gap. During the off-season, which stretches from May to early July, the crowd thins. You see the temple stand quieter and the local boys play cricket near the steps without **BY TEAM AGENDA** 

anakpur is a place that reveals itself slowly, as if testing whether you're ready to see it. As the train halts at *Falna*, and the road begins to rise towards the hills, the noise of the world starts to fade. You look out the window, fields stretch flat at first, then give way to forests, ochre ridges, and occasional temple spires that catch the light. This is not a journey measured in hours. It is felt in pauses, glances and stillness. Located in the Aravalli hills of Rajasthan, *Ranakpur* holds its own presence. Life here moves with purpose, without urgency.

Where Marble Tells a Story

The Jain Temple, built in

the 15th century,

detail. From the outside, it resembles a stone garden, used by traders and monks. Nothing here is staged. Yet layered, measured. Once inside, it shifts, becoming a forest of pillars, each carved differently. Light enters through carved windows and dances across the floor. Calm fills the space. You feel invited.

Every surface has been touched by a hand, shaped by tools guided by skill and belief. There are carvings of gods, dancers, vines and stories that spiral upward across the domes.

The centre of the temple holds attention. Time is measured here by movement of light and feet, by the way heads tilt upward when people forget their cameras and simply look.

### **Outside the Temple Walls**

Step beyond the temple, and Ranakpur continues. It is a living landscape. Hills curve in the distance. Streams appear after turns in the road. Banyan trees spread their roots into stone. Monkeys move through branches

And in quiet moments, you may spot a lone deer or the flash of a peacock crossing a village path. The nearby forest area offers walking trails once

every stone has history beneath it, every path leads to a story someone remembers. Small shrines, some forgotten by guidebooks, appear without announcement. A walk becomes a meditation. In the nearby town, life continues at its own pace. You see potters shaping clay, women drying red chillies on rooftops, children chasing tyres across open ground. Local food stalls serve hot kachoris and jaggery-sweetened tea. You sit, not for the taste, but to stay a little longer.

### **A Place That Respects Time**


There's something about Ranakpur that slows thought. Maybe it's the absence of noise. Maybe it's the way the mountains curve like a protective hand. Temples stand without barriers. Paths wind without interruption. You hear the sound of dry leaves under foot, the steady turning of prayer beads, the simple flow of a hand sweeping stone steps. In the evenings, the sky shifts into warm gold and birds return to the trees. You watch villagers carry water pots over shoulders, their outlines lit by the last light. No one hurries. You realise

### **A Paradise Preserved**

To call Ranakpur peaceful is not enough. It is precise. What remains here is presence. The hills have seen kingdoms rise and vanish, yet their contours remain unchanged. Nature, architecture, belief, coexist here without tension. This is a place where you feel small in the best way possible.

You return not with a checklist of sights, but with a shift in pace, a quieter breath, a clearer sense of space. You don't remember your trip by date or distance. You remember it by light falling on carved stone, by the silence between temple bells, by the way the road looked when it turned one last time toward the station. What if the journey is about reaching a place and discovering how a destination like Ranakpur leaves its mark on you?



### **GETTING THERE: KEY TRAIN ROUTES AND CITY CONNECTIONS**

Ranakpur is not served by an airport or major highways. The journey involves a train to Falna and a guiet road into the hills, perfect for those seeking distance from noise.

- From Delhi, the Ashram Express and Bhuj Express reach Falna overnight. From Mumbai, the Aravali Express traces a scenic path
- From Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Surat, Pune, Bangalore, and Chennai, regular trains connect to Falna.
- Falna to Ranakpur is approximately a one-hour drive by

taxi or private car. Local buses also run, though less

Ranakpur stays quiet. It welcomes slowly, through cool marble floors, winding village roads, and soft-spoken locals. As one of Rajasthan's lesser-known places, it lets you explore at your own pace whether it's sitting by the river, walking to the nearby Sadri town or watching the hills change colour at sunset. You leave with photos maybe a morning memory or a name someone told you to remember. And that stays with you.

# Living Slowly in Village Peace

In India's villages, travellers find quiet living, local food, rich stories and a simpler way, says SAKSHI PRIYA

n an age where travel often means curated experiences and crowded landmarks, a quieter shift is taking place. A growing number of travellers are heading into India's villages, not for a getaway, but for something real. They're choosing mud homes over boutique hotels, morning cowbells over alarm clocks, and home-cooked lentils over buffet spreads.

Across India, villages are opening their doors and hearts to people eager to live life as the locals do. Travellers from metros and even foreign countries are packing light and stepping into the shoes of rural families. They're wearing what villagers wear, light cotton dhotis and lungis in the South, handwoven phaneks and innaphis in the North East or colourful ghagras and dupattas in Rajasthan. It's a gesture of respect and often an attempt to understand life

Foreigners especially are showing deep interest in staying in one place for weeks, sometimes months. In states like Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Sikkim, it's common to meet travellers from Europe or Japan helping with farming, learning to make roti on a chulha or walking with village women to col-



lect firewood. They sit with elders under banyan trees, drink tea from steel tumblers and eat what the locals eat, rice with mustard oil chutney, bajra rotis with curd or fresh bamboo shoot curry depending on the region. Many simplify their daily routines.

They rise with the sun, sleep early and immerse themselves in village life. They learn how to milk cows by hand, spending gentle moments with the animals, discovering a connection often lost in city life. Watching a potter shape clay or joining women

grinding spices by hand offers a grounding experience. For many, it is a revelation to see how happiness thrives without endless material needs. In the North East, places like Ziro in Arunachal Pradesh and Reiek in Mizoram have become popular among those who want to experience close-knit tribal culture.

In Ziro, travellers often stay in wooden houses on stilts, walk through rice fields and witness how the Apatani tribe practices sustainable living. They eat smoked meat, watch dances performed during seed-sowing ceremonies and often return home with a different sense of connection. In rural Thanjavur or Kumbakonam, guests take part in morning prayers at temples, eat off banana leaves and join the household in making rangolis. In Karnataka, travellers live with Lambani tribes, dress in their bright traditional clothes and attend local fairs. Even Kerala's tribal hamlets are offering home stays where visitors learn to cook jackfruit dishes or tap toddy. For those tired of schedules and selfies, there's something refreshing in letting go and letting the village show you how to live again.



LONG STAYS AND DEEP BONDS

Foreigners too are drawn to India's rural charm. Many end up staying longer than planned, charmed by the pace of life and the openness of the people. Some find themselves living in Ladakhi villages, learning how to insulate homes with mud and straw, while others join cultural immersion programmes in Karnataka's tribal hamlets. It is common to see them waking up at dawn to join morning chores





























# From Loneliness to Solitude: A Journey Back to the Self

igh in the Himalayas, i saw a lone yogi sitting on the edge of a cliff, watching the early sun scatter gold over the snow-capped peaks. The wind carried the scent of pine and silence. For days he had neither spoken nor heard another voice. Yet, in that very silence, it appeared to me he felt no lack. Instead, a fullness I saw — so deep, so intimate — embraced him. He was alone, but not lonely. This was not isolation. This was presence. This was solitude.

That yogi could be anyone — perhaps even you or me - when we pause our lives and begin the deeper journey inward. I remember a time when I stood on a quiet hillside in Uttarakhand, seeking a break from the chaos of life. My phone had no signal, the roads were far behind, and the only sound was the gurgling of a distant stream. At first, the silence felt oppressive.

There were no distractions, no one to talk to, no list to check off. Just me. And in that stillness, something stirred. What I thought was loneliness slowly started shifting into something profound — a sense of being accompanied by God, by nature, and by my own soul. That was the beginning of my per-

sonal pilgrimage from loneliness to solitude. Sri Ramana Maharshi once said, "Solitude is not about being in a forest; it is being free from the noise of the mind." How true. Loneliness is often misunderstood as physical aloneness, but it's really about disconnection — from our purpose, from meaning, and most importantly, from ourselves.



Guillermo Maldonado beautifully captured this with his words: "Loneliness is not lack of company, loneliness is lack of purpose." We can be surrounded by people, and yet feel completely alone. And conversely, we can be physically isolated, but feel vibrantly connected — to our dharma, to nature, to the divine.

The journey from loneliness to solitude is not always easy, but it is deeply rewarding. It begins with acceptance. The first step is to stop resisting the silence. Most of us fear being alone because we're afraid of what

we might find within - the hurts we've buried, the dreams we've abandoned, the truths we've silenced. But once we sit with those parts of ourselves, like a compassionate friend, something magical happens. The inner noise lessens. Clarity arises.

In the sacred mountains — be it Kailash, Kedarnath, or the quiet hills of Kumaon many sages sought this kind of solitude. Not to escape the world, but to align more deeply with it. Solitude offers space for integration. It's where the soul breathes.

In solitude, prayer becomes deeper. Not

a request, but a communion. I remember during my journey to Bhavishya Badri, I sat under a deodar tree, chanting softly. My words were not aimed at any deity in the sky but felt like echoes from within. In that moment, God was not a being outside, but a presence within and around. That moment of realisation - that I was not truly alone transformed my understanding of solitude forever. Here's how you too can walk this

Find your space of silence. It could be a room, a temple, a mountaintop, or even a

Replace noise with nature. Let the sound of rivers, birds, and wind remind you of the sacred rhythms of life. Nature holds you without judgment.

Connect with purpose. Ask yourself gently — What stirs my soul? What can I give? Even one small act aligned with your truth can dissolve loneliness.

Speak to God — then listen. Prayer isn't always words. Sometimes it's tears, or just sitting in awe. In silence, answers come without asking.

Be your own companion. Read scriptures, journal your thoughts, or write poetry. Learn to enjoy your own presence. This isn't about turning your back on the world. In fact, solitude prepares you for deeper engagement with life. When you know how to sit with yourself, you stop expecting others to fill your emptiness. You begin to offer

love, not from need, but from wholeness. In solitude, you realise you are never truly alone. The mountains and sky are with you. Your breath is with you. And God, quiet and constant, walks with you at every step. So, if you're feeling lonely, don't run from it. Sit. Listen. Let it lead you inward. There you will find not emptiness, but eternity. And when you return from that sacred place of solitude, you'll carry its peace like a fragrance, touching every life around you.
